

## LJ vacation rentals get a fresh look

Leadership of the La Jolla Community Planning Association's (LJPCPA) Ad Hoc Committee on Vacation Rentals changed hands Feb. 26 and committee members heard updates about the Community Assisted Party Program (CAPP), which seeks to curb noise and other chronic issues with short-term rentals.

La Jolla Realtor and committee chairman Patrick Ahern voluntarily stepped down after his perceived objectivity was challenged by some committee members and the public. Ahern is employed by Berkshire Hathaway Realty, which handles short-term vacation rentals as a company.

"I'm stepping down to protect the image of the committee and the community," said Ahern, adding he'd decided to relinquish the chairmanship "to avoid any taint of bias or conflict of interest" and because, where committee leadership is concerned, "I believe it's a great time to do a reset."

The subcommittee has been charged with vetting the increasingly troublesome issue of shortterm vacation rentals disturbing residents and will ultimately report back to the LJCPA with a list of recommendations for alleviating problems with primarily high-end, short-term rentals, which some believe is worsening.

Helen Blanchard, a La Jolla Shores resident and longtime community planner, was introduced as the group's new chairwoman.

Fred Zuckerman, a civilian who works with the San Diego Police Department on the CAPP program, which identifies dwellings chronically hosting loud and disturbing parties that draw involvement from enforcement, talked about the particulars of the program and answered audience questions.

"We basically track the houses that have chronic noise/party violations and flag them for the next year, which entails a zero-tolerance policy for any noise violations," Zuckerman said. "Typically, the party host or organizer will get a written warning that they've been too loud and had complaints. Two of those warnings in a 30-day period qualifies them as chronic, capping them for a full year."

Zuckerman said chronic CAPP violators can be subject to maximum fines of \$1,000 for not correcting problematic behavior.

Noting CAPP is a useful — but not foolproof — tool to curb excessive noise and related problems, Zuckerman said one drawback is that an officer has to witness the offending behavior or take reports from witnessing neighbors who are willing to file a formal com-

## Planners tackle infrastructure issues by DAVE SCHWAB

replacement on Avenida De La Playa are being dealt with and that overgrown shrubbery and problematic homelessness at Torrey Pines Road pedestrian bridge are threatening public safety.

Those were the highlights of La Jolla Shores Association's (LJSA's) March meeting, which also saw the volunteer advisory group approve a request to host a March 26 tsunami preparedness demonstration at Kellogg Park.

Several residents said the high-profile pedestrian bridge over Torrey Pines between Hotel La Jolla and The Children's School is so dense with landscaping that lighting is poor, which has locals concerned about their children. Neighbors said ongoing problems with homeless encamped in the area is also distressing.

"I walk that (bridge) every day and I've seen things go from bad to worse over the years," said Karen Marshall of Roseland Drive. She added the overpass bridge is completely overgrown with vines and frequented by large numbers of homeless which make it "really a problem."

San Diego Police Department (SDPD) community liaison officer Larry Hesselgesser said officers are listening to community concerns, noting they did a homeless sweep recently to clear the bridge area.

Hesselgesser noted it's a difficult

One resident testified she has been deprived of private parking due to ongoing construction. Vic Salazar Communications, hired by the city as liason to the community on the infrastructure projects, promised to find alternative parking for local residents denied access.

Shores merchant Izzy Tihanyi complained about lack of signage for parking and equipment being left out on weekends by construction crews.

"This is unacceptable with spring break here," she said.

Lt. John Sandmeyer of San Diego Lifeguards gave a brief presentation about Tsunami Awareness Week March 24-28. He noted the Shores had been chosen as a possible demonstration site because "we wanted to do a simulation of an evacuation," and because computer projections show portions of the Shores could be impacted by a tsunami.

LJSA board member Janie Emerson liked the idea of a tsunami drill but was worried about "the logistical problem of getting people out there (Kellogg Park)."

Lucas joked he was happy to approve a tsunami drill in the Shores "without coordinating it."

LJSA meets the 2nd Wednesday of the month from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at impacts from sewer and water main T-29 Martin Johnson House at Scripps Institution of Oceanography.







Merchants Assoc. updated on stench at the Cove by DAVE SCHWAB

La Jolla Village Merchants Association (LJVMA) in March discussed improving conditions with the Cove stench as well as hearing about a large pool of accumulating funds intended to improve Village parking and traffic circulation.

"I'm happy to report with all the wave action and gates open that we've got a better situation on our hands at the Cove (with foul smells)," said group president Claude-Anthony Marengo.

Marengo however pointed out there's "a shift in where the smell is," noting it's now "coming up under Brockton Villa" where sea lions and cormorants are going "really high up on the rocks during high surf."

Noting bad odors appear to have abated in parts of the Village, Marengo added that it's "a proximity issue. Hopefully, we'll find a solution to that piece as well."

Corey Bailey of Goldfish Point Café pointed out the problem of smells caused by bird and marine mammal waste continues to present a major dilemma for some merchants in some areas.

"At Brockton Villa there's a surging foam of nastiness," Bailey said adding "the situation is not a sustainable ecosystem."

LJVMA executive director Sheila Fortune told board members there is a little more than

\$450,000 that has accumulated from developer impact fees in a fund administered by the La Jolla Coastal Access and Parking Board.

Thus far, fortune said "no one has been able to come up with a plan" for utilizing those funds. She added a practical, up-to-date plan needs to be devised so those monies can be put to work for the good of the community.

The access and parking board's charge is to implement that funding to create a remote (outside La Jolla) parking reservoir and shuttle system, as well as funding other short- or long-term parking and traffic circulation-related programs or improvements, both subject to City of San Diego and Coastal Commission approval.

"Making those funds available for a shuttle process is a daunting task," noted Marengo who added having the ability to "move tourists around a bit to all our merchants would be a really good thing."

"Whatever we do (with funding) must be sustainable, it can't be a one-shot deal," noted LJVMA board member Tom Brady. "It's about having a short-ride shuttle that sustains itself in a variety of ways."

"We need to explore the concept with the city," pointed out Fortune.

One day, Hesselgesser decided to chase the thief around the block, caught him and police arrested the criminal. Hesselgesser also lived next door to a canine officer, who took him on ridealongs. He said he found his niche in police work.

On the other hand, Cedrun confessed to a practical reason, admitting it wasn't as exciting as Hesselgesser's story. She left a career in real estate and sought a stable job with health benefits and retirement plans. In her witty fashion, she said: "It sounded like an awfully fun job, to be paid to be nosey and go where no one else goes," she laughed. "At 30, it was a financial decision."

Certainly, the communities of U.C., La Jolla, Clairemont, Bay Ho and Bay Park have benefitted from having these outstanding police officers protecting and serving their neighborhoods.

Police work is unlike any other job and truly "good cops" are on duty 24/7, hypervigilant to what is going on. In this writer's opinion, what has been going on in San Diego is media overkill about the few bad apples in the police force.

The normally smiling lieutenant got serious when asked about recent negative press about alleged criminal acts by police.

"I grieve when I hear about misconduct allegations, from patrol officers to captains. You hope it's not true. The department is full of human beings, flawed at times, just like other human beings. The media paints with a broad brush and it is painful. All of the police officers I know are hard-working and dedicated to serving the public. Not much grace is given to us by the media ... no balance ... all bad. I see all good when I look around Northern Division and other divisions ... the silent marchers. We don't do this work for the praise, but we have made lots of deposits. Now we need withdrawals from the public in the form of understanding. I feel it dishonors the badge we proudly wear when offi-

cers break the law."

Hesselgesser chimed in.

"The public perception of the investigative process for accused police officers is more so than for the general public because it is law enforcement. Be patient," he said. "Let the process work through. Give the benefit of a doubt."

Cedrun said the internal investigations officers are all supervisors. They check on the situations involving alleged crimes among police officers.

"You look at the facts," said Hesselgesser. "No bias is involved, only evidence. Then a Citizen Review Board reviews the findings based on evidence."

With the sudden departure of Police Chief William Lansdowne and the installation of Shelley Zimmerman as the new chief, both Cedrun and Hesselgesser weighed in on this decision to elevate Zimmerman to chief of police with enthusiasm. Hesselgesser said he considers Zimmerman a friend.

"She has a lot of roots at Northern Division as a lieutenant and captain here. I was proud to work with her," he said. "I couldn't be happier."

Cedrun agreed.

"She is brilliant, with the sharpest edge of her ethics in her 31 years on the force," Cedrun said. "She does right when no one is looking.

"What Chief Lansdowne did to keep the crime down with so little resources was amazing," she said. "He also said that it falls on him when police break the law and he decided to step down."

Hesselgesser has been at Northern for 20 years. He likes the idea of serving in many capacities.

"It's a different challenge every day," he said. "The best part of my job is taking all my experience and helping people where things may fall through the crack for them. I can match them with the right people."

He deals with 150-200 emails a week, while Cedrun gets around 700 a week. Of that number, 60 percent have some work attached to them. She is committed to the community and makes herself available, as does Hesselgesser.

Cedrun has spent her 20 years in many different areas of police

"I see myself as coach and mentor," she said. "I can share from having the big picture of the organization, passing forward my experience since I have moved every couple of years. While Larry has a niche that is needed with his 20 years at Northern that gives him a stable schedule, I go wherever the department needs me. For example, if border crime is an issue and I'm bilingual, I am sent there."

Both Cedrun and Hesselgesser said they admired former Northern Division police Capt. Brian Ahern, but now they have Capt. Jerry Hara.

"We have won the lotto," Cedrun said. "He was both a patrol officer and seargeant at Northern and is the kindest, servant leader around."

There are only 12 captains in the San Diego Police Department. Funding this year will allow for eight police service officers and investigators, who will assist patrols, cold cases and home break-ins so patrol officers can pursue crimes in progress.

Cedrun celebrated her first anniversary at Northern on March 15. She said she loves being here and divides her duties into thirds: community, administration and patrol.

"Officer Hesselgesser is omnipresent,"Cedrun said.

Both put in long hours but are not complainers.

University City's population is 49,000, second to Mira Mesa in size. U.C. Neighborhood Watch is a success story. U.C. had the largest group at National Night Out in the summer.

Hesselgesser said the average citizen is thinking what they are going to do, while police think about the possibility of criminal

"I enjoy teaching people how to make a house safe, why it is critical to lock outside gates, and use lighting to ward off crimes," he said.

As the interview winds down, Cedrun promised, "We will never spin things. We are transparent, honest. I will always tell you the truth."

Since Zimmerman will only serve for four years due to her being part of the DROP program that has her due to retire in four years, it would be wise to have Cedrun groomed to follow in Zimmerman's footsteps. Why spend money and time looking across the country when you have the talent and ability in one officer whose star is rising and why not make Lt. Cedrun the second woman in a row to lead San Diego's police force and maybe start a trend. Officer Hesselgesser would probably endorse this idea.

public's right to access."

Architect Anthony Ciani, who has been involved in legal wrangling over beach access through the site since it began in the 1970s, said the most-recent court decision reaffirms the facts of the case.

"The coastal permit granted by the CCC in 1980 that required an Offer to Dedicate an easement for public access to and along the beach was not executed then, and has not been executed ever since,"

"The house was built and many unpermitted additions have been made, and each time the Commission has reheard this case over the last 35 years, they have come to the same conclusion to require the public's historical rights to access be protected, and the court agrees," he said.

Kretowicz disagrees. His position continues to be that the easement is invalid, unenforceable, and that requiring him to allow beach access through his property violates his rights.

"Our plan is to appeal the (Hayes's) verdict and get it to the appellate court," Kretowicz said adding Princess beach-access proponents are misrepresenting exist-

ing conditions.

"It's a precarious path to try and get down to the beach from the cliffs," Kretowicz said. "It's been portrayed as a little oasis of white sand, and it's actually a bunch of rocks."

Kretowicz noted the Princess Street beach access went largely unused and unnoticed for 27 years, insisting those few who did use it did so at the invitation of the homeowner in possession of the property at the time.

"Should I allow anyone — and everyone — to go through my backyard?" asked Kretowicz who said allowing an easement through his property "diminishes its value, and is, in my mind, a forced taking by the Coastal Commission, which doesn't answer to anybody."

Kretowicz added he's going to "appeal this thing (beach access) and use whatever resources are necessary."

"I honestly believe we're going to prevail," Kretowicz concluded contending all improvement work he's done on the property over time has been done with required permits from the city of San Diego.

There presently is a locked gate on the property allowing only emergency access by lifeguards to the easement.

Bloom's supporters include "some of the same activists that partnered with People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals in bringing the meritless claim that animals in human care should be considered slaves under the 13th amendment of the U.S. Constitution — a clear publicity stunt. This legislation reflects the same sort of out-of-the-mainstream thinking."

Referring to SeaWorld and

similar institutions as "abusement parks," animal-rights activists are increasingly calling on the marine-mammal park to retire its orcas to seaside sanctu-

The animal-rights group People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals has also reportedly threatened to sue San Diego's airport for refusing to allow advertising urging visitors to not go to SeaWorld until the marine-mammal park changes its allegedly abusive policy of requiring animals to perform in entertainment shows.

Another problem with CAPP enforcement, said Zuckerman, is that such calls are low-priority for police, which frequently translates Clairemont, Pacific Beach, Torrey into slower response times.

"Police officers are mostly concerned with criminal acts and preserving the peace," Zuckerman said. "Noise complaints are something they want to get under control so they can get back in their car and get to a more important call."

Asked how many CAPP-designated homes there are, Zuckerman said the number varies seasonally and over time.

"We have 30 capped locations right now in Northern Division," he

said, but there were only a couple of capped homes in the La Jolla

SDPD Northern Division serves La Jolla, Bay Ho, Bay Park, Clairemont Mesa east and west, Mission Bay Park, Mission Beach, North Pines and the University City neighborhoods.

Planned presentations from citizens regarding short-term vacation rentals and vacation-rental operators were delayed until the ad hoc committee's next meeting Wednesday, March 26 from 5 to 6:30 p.m. at the La Jolla Recreation Center, 615 Prospect St.

"Put your thinking caps on," said Blanchard. "We're suggesting people make some recommendations that the committee can support."

## Planners reconstitute subcommittee on vacation rentals

A controversial vacation rental subcommittee was reconstituted and repurposed by La Jolla Community Planning Association (LJCPA) at its March meeting.

The advisory group which makes land-use recommendations to the city also approved requests of applicants for housing projects at 251 Rosemont St. and 1228 Park Row.

Community planners Bob Collins, Alex Outwater, Jim Ragsdale, Rob Whittemore and Robert Mapes were elected to three-year terms on LJCPA, and Joe LaCava and Jim Fitzgerald, who would otherwise be termed out, were reelected to new three-year terms to fill open seats.

The group voted 12-2-3 in favor of a proposal by outgoing LJCPA president and architect Tony Crisafi to establish a Stakeholders' Ad Hoc Committee on Short-Term Vacation Rentals that will investigate policies in other cities, consider their applicability to La Jolla, and propose recommendations.

Crisafi said the ad hoc committee, as previously constituted, had gotten sidetracked by allegations of conflict of interest and disputes over whether those in the vacation rental industry deserved a place at the negotiating table on how to regulate vacation rentals.

Trustee Phil Merten, an architect, noted the ad hoc subcommittee will "simply make recommendations to this board (LJCPA) which will be the decision maker."

Fellow trustee Jim Fitzgerald felt the subcommittee had gotten away from its original charge to "find out what other cities do" with short-term vacation rentals.

The new Stakeholders' Ad Hoc Committee will be composed of Trustees Helen Boyden (as Chair), Jim Fitzgerald and Bob Steck. In addition, Heather Weiermann and Mike Costello have agreed to be part of the committee.

Costello will represent homeowners who are adversely affected by short-term vacation rentals, and Weiermann will represent vacation-rental interests.

"It is felt that the issue of what the problems are has been thoroughly aired and the committee needs to move on to consider possible solutions," said Boyden noting the committee's goal "is to make a recommendation built on consensus that all stakeholders can support."

Boyden however admitted "that may not be possible and the committee may advance one, two, or no recommendation to the LJCPA."

An applicant request to demolish an existing single-family home

on three lots and construct two, two-story single-family units in its place was approved by LJCPA 9-4-1 after lengthy debate.

Architect Paul Benton, chair of LJCPA's Development Permit Review (DPR) Committee, warned that granting the land-use request could be precedent-setting in that it could create a future situation in which there are "three developable lots" which could be redeveloped with greater density.

Though he didn't particularly like the proposal, trustee Joe LaCava noted there wasn't anything illegal about it which would compel a no vote on the project.

LJCPA also voted 11-4-1 in favor of a developer request for a Coastal Development Permit to demolish an existing residence at 1228 Park Row and replace it with another single-family home and detached guest quarters.



## From Mexico City to the heart of La Jolla | BY FRANK SABATINI JR.

For their first restaurant on U.S. soil, chefs common to American palates such as tuna, lev and global regions available at affordable confusing our palates.

The chefs, along with a few managing partners, own 13 restaurants throughout Mexico City. They have also authored high-end cookbooks printed in Spanish, attesting to their knack for elevating meat, seafood and seasonal vegetables to Michelin-worthy heights in several dishes.

More than 60 percent of the menu spotlights oceanic proteins that are grilled, poached, steamed or served raw. Starting in early April, the kitchen will begin serving whole, two-pound red snapper or bass, depending on whatever is available fresh. They'll be grilled in Mexican "talla" style with a chili paste rub, and served with corn tortillas and black beans.

Since opening last summer, The Hake's sashimi dishes have been all the rage. Scallops "tiradito," for example, become radiant gems when mingled with orange yuzu, thinly sliced cucumber, lime and bits of chipotle peppers. In a recent visit, the hamachi took on detailed flavors from miso, jalapeno and miniscule garlic chips.

Another starter, tuna chicharron, involves finely chopped, lightly floured tuna fried to a unique, crackly texture. The dish is clenched expertly with onions, cilantro and soy butter.

Hake, the deep-water fish popular in Spain, goes oddly missing despite its usage in the syrups and infused spirits. The wine list covers

> Red meat rises to the occasion in the form of Black Angus burgers, Berkshire pork chops and short ribs braised long enough in a dynamic Zinfandel demi-glace that the meat falls apart with a gentle tap of the fork. And new to the lineup is a 40-ounce porterhouse steak that feeds three people.

"But some customers manage to eat it all by themselves," quips Dondisch, noting that the restaurant caters well to fans of beef, chicken \$7. and pork despite its slant on seafood.

The drink list extends to a variety of mescals, mostly from Oaxaca, as well as crafty cocktails that feature the new "One Hot Cucumber" made with jalapeno-infused tequila, cucumber puree and agave nectar. Mixologist Joan Villanueva is currently expanding the offerings, using house-made restaurant's name. Instead, other species more the gamut, with choice labels from Napa Val-

prices.

Located below street level, between Azul and George's at the Cove, The Hake greets with a spacious interior defined by globe lighting, bistro-style tables and a marbletop bar. The feel is decidedly casual, although service aligns to the professional standards seen in fine-dining restaurants.

Happy hour is offered daily from 4 to 7 p.m. ing. The steals include \$5 well drinks, beer and wines by the glass as well as discounts on signature cocktails. Munchies such as Serrano ham croquettes, spicy tuna tartare, Angus sliders



## Something's Fishy A brief history of April Fools' Day

We all know that April Fools' Day is celebrated by playing a light-hearted joke on a friend or family member, but few people understand how this tradition actually began.

While the exact origins of the holiday are unknown, several theories do exist. 





## Scripps scientists find better way to make unnatural amino acids

Institute (TSRI) have devised a greatly improved technique for making amino acids not found in nature.

These so-called "unnatural" amino acids traditionally have been very difficult to synthesize, but are sought after by the pharmaceutical industry for their potential medical

"This new technique offers a very quick way to prepare unnatural amino acids, many of which are drug candidates or building blocks for peptide drugs," said Jin-Quan Yu, a professor in TSRI's Department of Chemistry.

Yu's team has reported the achievement as a research article in the March 14, 2014 issue of the journal Science.

#### Expanding nature's alphabet

Amino acids are among the most basic components of living things. Long chains of them, translated from DNA, fold up to become proteins. Some smaller groupings of amino acids form hormones, and a few single amino acids function as signal-carrying neurotransmitters in the brain.

However, just 21 amino acids are found in human proteins, and only a handful of others have significant roles outside protein-making. In all,

Chemists at The Scripps Research several hundred natural amino acids have been catalogued in living organisms. Yet thousands more are theoretically possible, researchers expect that many of these unnatural amino acids will be medically useful. "They offer great structural diversity," Yu said. Moreover, with their unnatural structures they will often be relatively resistant to the housekeeping enzymes that break down and recycle natural amino acids in cells, and thus should last longer in the body.

> The numerous proposed applications of unnatural amino acids include anti-cancer drugs, antibiotics that will be able to thwart bacterial resistance, and drugs that inhibit the formation of amyloid aggregates such as those seen in Alzheimer's, Parkinson's and other diseases.

> The research was supported by the National Institute of General Medical Sciences and Bristol-Myers Squibb.

## From My Garden

## Fairytale foxgloves are a Perfect Fit | BY LINDA MARRONE

If you are looking to add oldfashioned charm to your garden, foxgloves are a perfect fit and March and early April are good months to plant four-inch pots of them in your garden.

Flowering in the spring and through most of the cooler, summer months along the coast, foxgloves will add dramatic vertical interest to your garden with their tall, flowering spikes that are covered with bell-shaped flowers. The main spike of the plant can grow anywhere between 2-8 feet high, depending on the variety. The flowers come in varying shades of pink, lavender and white, and have contrasting freckle markings on their throats. Alba, a white variety, is almost completely white.

From the same family of plants as the snapdragon, foxgloves (Digitalis purpurea, derived from the Latin word digitabulum that "thimble") entrenched in folklore and medical history. Known in earlier time as "folk's gloves," it is said that the thimble-shaped flowers were used by the woodland

say foxgloves were grown in early cottage gardens as a way to attract fairies that are said to bring good luck and fortune.

Used for many different medicinal treatments over the centuries, the plant is said to have been taken by Van Gough to treat his epilepsy and today it is used for the base of the heart medication, Digitalin (Digoxin). Due to the foxgloves' powerful medicinal properties, the plants leaves and flowers are considered very poisonous and should not be eaten. If you have children or pets that might wander into your garden and nibble on leaves, you should not plant foxgloves in your gar-

Hummingbirds, butterflies and bees will flock to your garden to enjoy your foxgloves, which I have found are quite easy to grow. Foxgloves love our coastal environment and will thrive in rich, moist, well-drained soil. While they prefer a partially shaded area, in our coastal zone the cooler weather will allow them to tolerate a little more sun. However the flowers seem to last to bloom, smaller spikes will

Before planting, I prepare my flowerbeds with a mix of organic mulch and earthworm castings. I use the taller varieties in the background, the Giant Shirley, that can grow as tall as 6-8 feet, or Camelot, that grows between 5-6 feet. The smaller 2to 3-foot variety, Foxy, is perfect in foreground. Giant Shirley is harder to find and usually comes in six-packs, which need to be planted earlier in the year. While I love the Shirley's impressive size, I find that sometimes she doesn't always bloom the first year she is planted. So these days, my foxglove of choice has been Camelot. Foxgloves also work well in containers.

Keep your plants happy by feeding them at least once a month with organic kelp-based or fish-emulsion fertilizer. When close to maturity, foxgloves will produce their main flower spike from the center of the plant and as the spike grows, it should be supported with a bamboo stake. spike fades. The smaller ones will continue to bloom for a few more weeks. If you have room in your garden, you can let the main spike go to seed and allow the seeds naturalize in your garden. Foxgloves produce literally hundreds of seeds. Since they are biannual, they will not bloom the first year the seeds produce

Slugs and snails seem to be the main pests that like to feed on foxgloves and I use Sluggo or any of the other natural snail baits available that are not harmful to the environment and pets. Place the bait under the leaves where the slugs like to hide. Bark mulch and crumbled egg shells will also work to keep slugs and snails

These sites, although not always updated in real time, also provide buyers with estimates of home values. These home value estimates may become the basis for buyers to make an offer on your home. Human nature being what it is, we often search endlessly until we find an argument or informa-

tion source that supports our perspective. In this case, buyers are often wooed into believing these Internet estimates of home values simply because it may support their basis for making a lower offer. The major point of discussion here being that long-gone is the naive buyer.




