Pot dispensary rules grow teeth

OB shops likely to be closed

Following a five-hour debate, the City Council voted 5-2 last week to pass a medical marijuana ordinance that limits dispensaries to light industrial zones, which means most of the current pot shops in Ocean Beach, Pacific Beach and downtown will have to close.

A final vote of the City Council is set for Tuesday.

Nearly 500 people attended the March 28 City Council session, which was devoted to the sole topic of a medical marijuana ordinance. The council voted to allow marijuana dispensaries in Mission Valley, Barrio Logan, Southeast San Diego, Otay Mesa and San Ysidro.

District 2 City Councilman Todd Gloria made the motion for the ordinance but conceded early in the discussion that the ordinance is "more restrictive than I would care for," a remark that drew applause.

Dispensaries cannot be within 600 feet of schools, parks, libraries, daycare centers or churches. Gloria changed the 1,000-foot restriction to 600 feet.

Dispensaries must also have a security system, be open 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily, obtain a conditional-use permit and be nonprofit. Patients will be allowed to possess a pound of pot if they have a medical marijuana state identification card and are allowed to grow 24 marijuana plants.

Several patients spoke about how marijuana increases appetite, especially for those with AIDS, and some said medical pot decreases pain. Rudy Reyes, who suffered burns over 70 percent of his body in the 2003 wildfires, said it worked for him.

Voting in favor were council President Tony Young, and councilmembers Kevin Faulconer, Sherri Lightner and Marti Emerald. David Alvarez was absent.

Councilmembers Carl DeMaio and Lorie Zapf voted against the stricter dispensary rules. DeMaio said the city's finances are in crisis and the cost of enforcing the ordinance is unknown. Zapf said she was disappointed colleges were not listed in the 600-foot restriction.

It is still illegal to transport marijuana.

Cause of fatal boat accident at Shelter Island probed

A 26-foot sailboat overturned near Shelter Island, killing two men. The cause of the capsizing remains under investigation and it is unclear whether the Harbor Police are viewing any criminal wrongdoing in connection with the accident.

of a few good Samaritans nearby, rescuers were able to pull all of the boat's occupants onto the docks and administer first aid.

Several victims were taken to nearby UCSD Medical Center. One woman reportedly drove herself to the hospital for treatment, Elicone said.

The group was part of a nonprofit organization that charters sailing trips for children and families of people with developmental disabilities. Two children

were injured in the accident and released that night.

Investigators with the Harbor Police are expected to deliver their report to the District Attorney's Office if they suspect anything illegal, Elicone said.

There are many theories about the cause of the boat's capsizing, including whether the boat, Nessie, had too many people on it for the choppy, windy conditions that day, Elicone said. However, nothing will be clear until investigators finish their probe, she said. A report may or may not conclude foul play or illegal activity, she said.

The sailboat was reportedly owned by a nonprofit company based in Indiana but the boat was driven down from Orange County and was not docked long-term at any local marinas, Elicone said.

PLNU student chaplain steps down after acknowledging he is gay

The elected student chaplain at Point Loma Nazarene University (PLNU) resigned his position April 1

— just 12 days after he told a church forum he is gay. The forum is also now without a place to meet.

Todd Clayton, 21, was elected by PLNU students for two years in a row

and he acknowledged his homosexuality during a forum at the First Church of the Nazarene adjacent to the college at 3901 Lomaland Drive. “He’s tired,” said a female friend of

Clayton’s on Sunday.

She said Clayton did not resign because of pressure from the conservative university administration.

Clayton, a senior who will be graduating next month, could not be reached for comment directly. The announcement of his resignation was made in chapel before the student body Friday.

On March 20, Clayton came out of the closet, saying, “Yes, the rumors are true ... I’m gay.”

Clayton made the announcement in front of about 340 people who had gathered at the “All God’s Children” forum, a group in discussions on lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender issues.

That forum lost a place to meet after John Denney, the conservative denomination’s southern district superintendent, told Pastor Dee Kelley the group should not meet in the church again.

On Monday, Denney told The Beacon he initially approved the group to meet at the church, but later said his direction was in response “to concerns [that] the group meeting ... had become a ‘homosexual advocacy’ group, which would mean that Pastor Dee Kelley and First Church could be charged with hosting/sponsoring

a gathering that was in direct conflict with the teachings of the Church of the Nazarene.”

Denney said the March 20 forum when Clayton said he was gay “served to validate that concern” of the church.

It was Kelley who told the forum March 20 “the church needs to be a safe place to engage these topics.”

He told a reporter Sunday he still believes this.

The group had been meeting mostly at First Church for more than three years. Their last meeting Sunday drew 22 people. The campus has 2,400 enrolled students.

A group facilitator said the group would meet again, possibly in private homes.

Clayton has been accepted at Princeton Theological Seminary and plans to become a minister. He told the group March 20 he “probably won’t be doing ministry in this denomination. My commitment is to be celibate while I’m here.”

The university requires all students to abstain from sexual relations, alcohol and tobacco products. Gay students in the past were expelled, but some of them were able to transfer to



Motorcycle crash kills young serviceman

A makeshift memorial, placed at the corner of Cañon and Rosecrans streets marks the location of a motorcycle accident that took the life of 22-year-old serviceman Blake Martin on March 31.

According to San Diego police officer Rod Fischer, Martin apparently raced his Suzuki 1000 around two cars in an attempt to beat a yellow light when he slammed into a black Cadillac making a left turn. Martin was thrown over the car and onto the street. He was pronounced dead at the scene. The 64-year-old female driver of the Cadillac was taken to a hospital with cuts and bruises.





Three members of the Pointer football team will take their talents to the next level.

When defensive lineman **Christian Heyward** announced his acceptance of a full athletic scholarship from the University of Southern California, he ended months of competition between several major universities. The



6-foot-3-inch, 280-pounder was listed among the nation's top college recruits and will play in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I Pac 10 conference for the Trojans after recording 86 tackles and eight sacks during his senior season at PLHS.

Running back and defensive back **Tommy Bell** will be taking the field for the College of St. Joseph in Cincinnati, Ohio.

The Lions compete in NCAA Division III, and play in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. At 5 feet, 10 inches and 195 pounds, Bell led the Dogs' defense with eight interceptions this year.

Pointers quarterback **Sean McKaveney** will be throwing passes at Claremont McKenna College. Despite missing several games with an injury, McKaveney threw for 1,096 yards and 13 touchdowns. With only 1,200 undergraduates, athletes from Claremont, Harvey Mudd College and Scripps College compete under one program known as CMS Athletics.

The Claremont McKenna Stags are in the NCAA Division III and members of the Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

Baseball standout **Campbell Wear** will don the uniform of the University of California, Santa Barbara Gauchos, an NCAA Division I program that competes in the Big West Conference.

Wear spends most of his time for the Pointers behind the plate or on the mound, and wields a powerful bat that impressed Gaucho coaches.

Teammate **Kellen Urbon**, who excels as a pitcher, will take on academic and athletic challenges at Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y.

The Big Red is a member of the NCAA Division I Ivy League. Urbon led his team

in home runs last season and is off to a 2-0 start pitching this season.

Girls' soccer player **Carly Holly** will be getting her kicks at Westmont College near Santa Barbara.

The Warriors are members of the Golden State Athletic Conference, a part of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). Holly, a striker/midfielder, tied for the team lead with seven goals this season for the league champion Pointers and received a full athletic scholarship.

Boys' soccer midfielder **Kenny Ortega** will travel the shortest distance after accepting an offer from nearby Point Loma Nazarene University.

Ortega, who led his team in scoring (eight goals, two assists) will take his shots for the Sea Lions, who belong to the Golden State Athletic Conference (NAIA).

Also staying close to home will be girls' water polo goalkeeper **Samantha Pugh**, who recorded a 4.7 goals-against average for the Pointers.

Pugh plans to stop shots for San Diego State University, where the Aztecs play in the NCAA Division I Mountain West Conference.

Another Pointer pool star, swimmer **Erin Cox**, will showcase her skills in the desert. Cox will become a Rebel at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

The NCAA Division I school is also a member of the Mountain West Conference.

Cross country and long-distance track runner **Meghan Breadmore** will take her state finals-level talents to picturesque California Polytechnic, San Luis Obispo, where she will run for the Mustangs.

The university is NCAA Division I and a member of the Big West Conference.

From the resurgent Pointer volleyball team, **Jordy Checkal** will be setting for her new teammates at Arizona State University.

The Sun Devils, located in Tempe, Ariz., are members of the NCAA Division I Pac 10 Conference.

Going home for weekends and holidays won't be a quick jaunt for softball player **Ashley Nelson**.



BASEBALL

With league play beginning this week, Point Loma High School's (PLHS) baseball team has compiled a 5-6 record in non-league and tournament play while one of their top pitchers already has more losses than he had for the entire 2010 season.

Looking only at junior Connor Bait-s' statistics, one would expect the 6-foot-5-inch righthander to be 3-0. He has endured, however, a lack of run support.

To date, Bait-s has compiled an excellent 1.75 earned-run average. Opponents are batting only .214 against him. He sports an outstanding walk-to-strikeout ratio of 3:20 and has completed all of his three starts. Despite these glittering numbers, Bait-s' record stands at 0-3. His team has scored only two total runs in support of Bait-s' efforts.

Bait-s, who was 9-2 last season, will be hoping for better production from Pointer hitters when he takes the mound as the Pointers go through league games.

Fellow starter Kellen Urbon was the beneficiary of a monster day at the plate by battery mate Campbell Wear in a recent City Tournament game. Wear nearly hit for the cycle with a single, double and tape-measure home run estimated at 420 feet as he racked up six RBIs in the 8-1 victory.

Max Sorenson pitched the final inning, and neither he nor Urbon issued a walk to the Conquistadors.

Urbon improved his record to 2-0, while Wear, the other starter, stands at 1-1.

After several games were postponed by March rains, the Pointers were forced to play five straight days, putting a strain on the pitching staff.

By the fourth day, Sorenson made the start at home against a strong-hit-

ting Patrick Henry squad and left after one and a third innings with a 9-0 deficit. From there, the Pointers outscored the Patriots 8-2, but came up on the short end of an 11-8 final.

Andrew Huelga came on to pitch four and two-thirds innings of strong relief. First baseman Cody Harvey was summoned to close the game and

pitched a perfect inning, even recording a strikeout. Bait-s drew cheers when he blasted a high pitch over the left field fence in the losing cause.

On the fifth day, Wear, Bates and Urbon shared pitching duties in a 6-0 loss to St. Augustine. The Pointers recorded six hits and an uncharacteristic four errors.

In five of the team's victories, opponents have failed to win a single set.

The Lady Pointers have a 6-4 record in the non-league portion of their schedule, with league play beginning next week.

The team's record includes victories of 15-1 (Orange Glen) and 18-5 (Mission Bay), with two victories by shutout. They have outscored opponents 61-19 to date.

Katie McEachern leads her team with a .500 batting average, doubles (2), home runs (2) and RBI (9). Ashley Nelson is close behind, hitting .471.

The Pointer boys (4-3) and girls (0-8) are having different levels of success in the sport's second year back on campus. Daniella Lococo has been recognized twice as her team's Player of the Week.

Vandals plead guilty to Ocean Beach window etchings

Two 20-year-old men pleaded guilty last week to one count of felony vandalism involving two dozen incidents in Ocean Beach and Pacific Beach, where store windows were defaced

with some type of etching tool.

"They agreed to pay restitution for all victims," said Deputy District Attorney Derek Grilz after court proceedings on Monday.

Jonathan Ford Gurr of Pacific Beach and James Alfred Dorman IV were

arrested in early March and remain in custody.

About 26 counts involving vandalism at Ocean Beach and Pacific Beach businesses were filed against them. However, after they pleaded guilty to one count, 25 charges were dismissed

by San Diego Superior Court Judge Eugenia Eyherabide.

Sentencing is set for April 28. Grilz said his office will seek up to one year in jail, but will not ask for them to be sentenced to prison. He said they will be placed on felony probation and

required to pay the businesses back for the damages.

Most of the businesses were located on Newport Avenue in Ocean Beach, but some stores were vandalized in the Sports Arena area, along Garnet Avenue in Pacific Beach and along Morena Boulevard.

Grilz said the taggers etched their monikers or nicknames on the windows. The men were arrested after their images were captured by store security cameras — particularly along Newport Avenue.

The prosecutor said if some store owners believe they have been vandalized by these same two men, they should contact the San Diego Police Department's Graffiti Unit to document the damage. Grilz said those stores could be added to the restitution list.

Gurr's bail is set at \$100,000, while Dorman is being held without bail. Dorman has a drunken-driving misdemeanor case pending in Chula Vista Superior Court, according to court records.

another Nazarene college in another state.

Clayton told the forum he prayed to be straight for many years.

"Change me. Make me normal," Clayton said during the March 20 forum. "I prayed every evening. It didn't change me," he said, adding, "I no longer pray that prayer."

"Thanks be to God that he has made me gay. I am gay. I am Christian. I will continue to live in that manner," said Clayton, who received a standing ovation at the forum.

Days later, university President Bob Brower sent an e-mail to all students, saying they need to "treat each other with respect, kindness and grace, regardless of positions held."

His e-mail also said "the church continues to firmly hold the position that a homosexual lifestyle is contrary to the Scriptures ... all forms of sexual intimacy that occur outside the covenant of heterosexual marriage are sinful distortions of the holiness and beauty God intended for it."

The student newspaper, The Point Weekly, published an interview with Clayton on March 21, in which Clayton told administrators of his orientation. He also described frustration about "double standards," adding, "I never signed anything when I came into office or when I came into school that said I wouldn't be gay."

BO-beau's completes transition from iconic Thee Bungalow

The original site of Thee Bungalow was built in the 1930s and once housed a bait-and-tackle shop, as well as Burger Bungalow. Ed Moore established Thee Bungalow in 1987, and David Cohn of the award-winning Cohn Restaurant Group purchased it in 2006.

Last August, Thee Bungalow closed for a unique transformation.

Cohn and Philippe Beltran, of Beltran Restaurant Concepts, worked closely on the project. They realized Thee Bungalow would be a great location for "something very special."

In December, BO-beau Kitchen + Bar opened its rustic doors. A playful abbreviation of "Bourgeois Bohemian," the restaurant is aptly named.

Beltran took special care with the décor, which included traveling to family homes in France and Spain for "authentic pieces that decorate the walls, add to the ambiance and are symbolic, sophisticated, warm and comfortable."

Also in keeping with this concept is an antiqued print from Toulouse Lautrec's Moulin Rouge "Can-Can" series on the bar's ceiling and bathroom doors collaged with deconstructed pages from two French plays from the 1920s and 30s. The pièce de résistance, however, is the lyrical placement throughout the restaurant of the classic French love song "Je t'aime."

BO-beau's exudes a friendly atmosphere that encourages guests to interact with each other as well as the superb staff. Bartender Jean Paul said, "There is definitely a locals' focus, as most of the patrons are from Ocean Beach and Point Loma."

"Thee Bungalow was a formal special-event-style dining establishment," Cohn said. BO-beau, however, has

KATHERINE HUMPHUS
Executive chef, BO-beau's

emerged as a cozy and très romantique French-cottage-style restaurant that may inspire local residents to dine out more regularly.

Since the menu has undergone changes in fare as well as price, with everything from appetizers to entrées under \$20, this is quite likely.

BO-beau's menu has been "modernized with a California twist," said Cohn,

"and is similar to other fusion-style menus in that it mixes traditional French cooking with other flavors. We wanted to provide a somewhat lighter fare, a more modern comfort food."

According to executive chef Katherine Humphus, "We decided to focus on a more casual menu aimed toward sharing. There will be daily specials in addition to 'days of the week' specials posted on one of our chalkboards."

Another addition that will appeal to locals is a late-night menu available from 10 p.m. until closing. Humphus said the late-night fare "includes selections from our regular menu, mainly appetizers and snacks."

The renovations were significant, but include dining throughout the restaurant.

Guests may sit at the bar or a community table, and there are two separate

dining areas, each with their own unique ambiance. One of the kitchen walls was removed, and high-beam ceilings were added to further open up the space.

Since the former adjoining bar area was small, it has been expanded by replacing a wall with a sliding wood

door that opens onto the patio with an outdoor fireplace and pizza oven. The bar also has a community table that seats four and is wheelchair accessible.

Once the weather improves, guests will be able to dine outside, and come

nightfall, gaze at the stars. If it becomes a bit chilly, there are soft cozy blankets.

The patio tables, as well as those throughout the restaurant, are intentionally set close together, according to

Cohn, "to create a communal setting as well as to encourage people to engage in conversation."

Another appeal to local residents is that BO-beau is a green restaurant. Beltran said "the intention was to use repurposed materials whenever possible, to be sustainable."

The environmentally savvy communities of Ocean Beach and Point Loma

will also appreciate that the restaurant's "to-go" containers are made from recycled materials — and include a knife and fork.

While some locals claim to miss Thee Bungalow, BO-beau seems destined to become an award-winning restaurant. Since the transformation is so significant, the best way to have a genuine experience is to visit.

From the moment you pass through the fragrant garden entrance of rosemary, lavender, and olive trees, you will be transported.

BO-beau Kitchen + Bar is located at 4996 West Point Loma Blvd. Dinner is served daily from 4:30 p.m. to 10 p.m., after which the late-night menu is available.

Losing a pair of beloved pets isn't a pleasant experience. But the loss of guitarist Dave Humphries' cats Eden, 20, and Eve, 16, inspired him to take action. As a result, he launched "Humphries at Humphrey's," a concert benefiting the San Diego Humane Society and Second Chance Rescue for Dogs.

"Those cats brought us many years of joy," Humphries said. "This is a way to remember them, and hopefully help as

many other animals as we can."

Eden's and Eve's passing and the search for a new feline friend helped cement the idea of an annual event to help animals in shelters. Now in its second year, the daytime event takes place on April 17 with a Beatles and a musical theme of the sixties. On hand will be host DJ Dave Mason of FM105.7 (The Walrus), with performances from Humphries and his group, the Beatles tribute group Help. They will be joined by Fab Moore, The Baja Bugs and indie

rockers Wendy Bailey & True Stories.

Humphries notes the importance of helping organizations like the Humane Society, particularly in tough economic times. He said the state of the economy is the secondary reason for this concert.

Most owners know pets can be expensive.

"You see it all the time," Humphries said. "So many people are losing housing or having to move and they are also hav-

ing to give up pets. So, in addition to stray animals, more pets are also ending up in shelters. It's a sad state of affairs. We're just trying to help any which way we can."

Originally from Durham, England, Humphries relocated to San Diego in 1996, releasing four albums to date. A huge Beatles fan, he has worked with such luminaries as Gordon Waller (Peter & Gordon) and Tony Sheridan, even going so far as to name his new cat "Teddy Boy" after the Paul McCartney song.

According to Humphries, the choice of a Beatles-themed event is because the Fab Four was "the greatest group, ever." But he added that their music truly is universal.

"We're hoping that this is going to be one big party," Humphries said. "And the Beatles are a group whose music everybody knows, whether it's musicians who play it or the audience who sings along. We're raising money for a serious issue, but at this show we want to have fun."

Former Beat Farmers guitarist Joey Harris will be the special guest and will sit in with several of the day's perform-

ers. For him, being part of events like this is important.

"It's a way to stay socially active, helping people instead of just watching the news and complaining that things are wrong," Harris said. "It's important to try and help in a situation, roll up your sleeves and get involved. If I was a bricklayer, I could help build a school or something like that. But I'm a singer and guitarist, so I work with that."

While Humphries said he is happy with the outlook for the event, he's even happier with the support for worthy causes from the local music scene.

"It's amazing at how quick musicians in San Diego are to respond when the call goes out for help," said the amiable guitarist. "The amount of talent in this town is incredible. That so many are always glad to pitch in at this and other events is a wonderful thing."

It's possible there will be a third edition in 2012.

"It's too early to tell for sure," Humphries said. "That's a long time away, and there is still this year to get through," Humphries said. "But I'm afraid the need will be there."
