Annual count finds fewer homeless in San Diego

The number of homeless people in San Diego County dropped by 6 percent from the previous year, according to the 2018 Point-in-Time Count.

Conducted every year by the Regional Task Force on the Homeless, the count from this past January showed that 8,576 men, women and children are living on the street or in shelters, compared to the 9,116 counted in 2017.

The results are used to apply for federal funds to help local homeless people and to find solutions on how to best serve those most vulnerable in the community.

Of the 8,576 homeless people in the region, 4,990 were unsheltered this year compared to 5,621 last year, an 11 percent drop. Also, 3,596 were sheltered, compared to 3,495 last year, a nearly 3 percent

After a steady decline the last few years, veteran homelessness rose 24 percent, with 1,312 counted as opposed to 1,054 a year earlier. The number of homeless veterans remains down 20 percent from 2011's count.



New design concept planned at former Midway Post Office

Developers of the former Midway Post Office have a new name – The Post - and a new design concept envelope – for the long-dormant 16acre site at 2535 Midway Drive.

San Diego-based Hammer Ventures, LLC, which develops urban properties in San Diego and Los Angeles, acquired the former U.S. Postal Service distribution center for approximately \$40 million from Rexford Industrial Realty Inc. of L.A. in October 2015.

Rexford had planned to redevelop the former U.S. Postal campus, which included two buildings with a total of 373,000 rentable square feet, into new industrial space.

But Hammer Ventures is altering the redevelopment game plan of the cornerstone property located in the neighborhood of the Sports Arena in the Midway District.

The Midway District is in the final phase of a years-long community plan update, which will go before the City Council for final approval on June 26.

The Midway Community Plan update provides for a growing amount of future residential development in the largely commercialindustrial district. Some consider redevelopment of the former post office site as a key puzzle piece in

planning for the entire area moving forward, which could include the future redevelopment of the Sports Arena nearby at some point.

Hammer Ventures has expressed its intent to turn the former postal site into an upscale office complex to include significant housing, apartments or condos, next door.

"We are still in the early planning stages," said Hammer Ventures spokesperson Sam Moore, disclosing only that, "We're keeping a portion of the existing structure."

Noting a full plan for the redesign of The Post "is still a month or two out," Moore added Hammer will be more forthcoming about details of its project "in the coming months when the future of the project is better understood."

At postcoastal.com, it's stated that The Post will be "a unique urban coastal campus" created around the landmark former Midway Post Office while noting, "the concept is inspired by the original design strength and simplicity of an envelope."

Hammer likens the future unveiling of The Post to "the moment of excitement when opening a card or package in anticipation of what's

Brutalist architecture flourished from the 1950s to the mid-1970s. Derived from the French word for "raw," large amounts of concrete is one of the distinguishing features of the architectural style.

According to the website, a centerpiece of the former post office redesign will be an entry promenade, on the southern edge of the existing postal-site structure, which is to include "a tree-lined pedestrian plaza creating a buffer between parking, residential and office

The plaza is to have shade and space for the public to gather and

"I can't speak for the group at this point as we haven't discussed it," said Cathy Kenton, chair of the Midway Community Planning Group about The Post proposal.

"I expect that we will have a presentation by the developers at next month's meeting,"Kenton said.

Midway group opposes Soccer City development plan

After hearing a consultant's pitch, Midway Community Planning Group in May unanimously opposed the Soccer City November ballot initiative.

Two competing ballot proposals to redevelop Qualcomm Stadium in Mission Valley, Soccer City and SDSU West, will face off in the Nov. 6 election.

SDSU West calls for a new 35,000-seat Aztecs football stadium, a river park, campus expansion and research center.

Soccer City by FS Investors includes a 22,000-seat stadium to draw a Major League Soccer expansion team (32,000 for Aztecs football) plus a river park, retail and SDSU expansion.

Each proposal needs a simple majority to be approved. If both are approved, the one with the highest vote total passes. If neither measure receives a majority, the issue will go back to square one and the City Council.

The group unanimously voted to oppose Soccer City.

Planners debate affordable housing, North Chapel

Spirited debate filled the Peninsula Community Planning Board's May meeting as residents turned out to protest a proposed affordable housing development and a plan to convert the North Chapel in Liberty Station into a restaurant.

A five-acre, open-space site at Famosa and Nimitz boulevards, which recently had a makeshift pump track on it closed by the City, became a major bone of contention at the May 17 meeting.

Owned by the San Diego Housing Commission, the site is proposed to be developed into a 78-unit affordable housing project. SDHC reps told the group the project is in the preliminary phase, with tests ongoing to ensure the site's viability for development.

During a 1 1/2 hour debate, citizens questioned whether the development would actually be affordable. Several argued what is really needed in the community is more public open space. One woman challenged the site's legal standing, saying she couldn't find documentation confirming the site was not meant to be left as open space in perpetuity.

An SDHC attorney countered that the agency wasn't "hiding the ball," noting the site was officially changed from open space to city ownership by a two-thirds public vote in 1956.

Colleague David Dick warned residents to be careful what they wished for, noting if they turned down affordable housing on the site, "they might end up with [a less appealing] development like what's occurring on

Pointing out it's been a year since the public hearing on the SDHC project, board member Don Sevrens suggested a public workshop be held to fully vet the public's concerns.

PCPB voted to hold a special meeting about the SDHC site Thursday,

June 7 at the group's usual place and time in the Peninsula Library's community room.

North Chapel

Following testimony from mostly church members urging PCPB to oppose turning North Chapel at Liberty Station into a restaurant, the plan group voted unanimously to do

Planner Mark Krencik noted the community has had a "passionate conversation" about the chapel's proposed conversion. acknowledging North Chapel is considered historical both inside and out, Krencik pointed out the chapel is also designated for "commercial use" in the NTC Precise Plan governing the former Navy base's redevelopment.

From the audience, Ron Slayer noted the chapel is "probably the least altered of the buildings" in historical Liberty Station, which has strict rules against modernizing existing architecture. "All the wood furniture, including the pews and pulpit are in their original condition," said Slayer. "This is a notable visual landmark."

Noting the chapel was built right after Pearl Harbor and was used by servicemen before and after World War II. "We don't need another restaurant," Henry Garon said.

Take a trip on the magic Cannabus in Ocean Beach

Jaquelyn Mitchell, one of the Cannabus girls, said she has heard it

"People think we sell from the bus," Mitchell said. "I tell them, 'we don't sell from the bus, but I can take you to where they do, for free."

Branded with bold white lettering that reads "Urbn Leaf," the Cannabus is hard to miss if you've spent any time in the beach communities this year. In operation since February, the bus offers free rides to the Urbn Leaf dispensary on Buenos Avenue. Pick-up spots are located in Ocean Beach during the week and Pacific Beach on the weekend, with added pick-ups in Ocean Beach on some weekends.

"Our OB route is the most popular," Mitchell said.

During the 10-minute drive to the dispensary, riders enjoy cushy bench seats and tables with booths. They can also sync their phones to play their music, enjoy an adult beverage and light up a marijuana joint.

Mitchell said she and the other Cannabus girls check ID's, to make sure people are 21 (if consuming alcohol). A built-in door separates the cabin and the driver, keeping it smoke free in the front seat.

The busses (there are two but only one operates at a time) are part of the Cali Party Bus fleet, Mitchell

said. Urbn Leaf contracts with the Cannabus company to be the dispensary drop-off location and for the bus-branding.

Mitchell said she hasn't had any issues with riders and so far hasn't had to call the police. The hardest part, she said, is finding parking and not staying in loading zones too long.

On average, there are 20 people riding the bus each day.

"Most people hear about us through word of mouth," she said. "Like, people from out of town ask their servers where they can get marijuana, and their servers send them here."

Mitchell said all types of people hop on the bus, from college students to older people who want to look for balm and oils.

"Tourists, we get a lot of tourists, and people who just hop on when they walk by," Mitchell said. "I've had people from Germany, Austria. A lot more people are from out of state and a lot of people from hostels."

Once the bus arrives at the dis-

pensary, riders receive a wristband that allows them to skip the line and receive a free lighter. An ID is required to enter the dispensary, where "budtenders" help answer questions about products and fulfill your order.

After the dispensary, riders can choose to get back on the bus for the trip back to the beach or go their own way. People can also hop on the bus from Urbn Leaf. The trip from pick-up to drop-off takes about an hour

Shelter Island Boat Launch opening delayed until fall



Serra win gives Pointers the Eastern League title as playoffs loom

The baseball gods were smiling down on Point Loma High's team.

In order to win a second straight Eastern League title they needed to sweep their three-game series against La Jolla, which they did last

But they also needed Serra to defeat Mira Mesa in their final league game to prevent a three-way Eastern League tie, which would have given the league championship to the Marauders who held a tiebreaker by beating the Pointers two of three games.

So on the last day of the season May 16, after defeating the Vikes 3-1, the Pointers reclined on the outfield turf of the La Jolla field and awaited the end of the Mira Mesa-Serra game via telephone reports.

When word came of the final out in a 4-2 Serra victory, the Pointers erupted in cheers as they officially repeated as Eastern League champions entering CIF playoffs, which began earlier this week.

The Pointers were scheduled to meet No. 8 seed Brawley on Tuesday of this week. The game was played at David Wells Field because the Pointers are league champions. Normally games are played at the field of the highest seed.

Once your child turns 18, you no longer have the authority to make health

care decisions for them or manage money for them, even if you are paying their tuition or health insurance premiums. If your adult child is in an accident and becomes disabled, you may need to seek court approval to make healthcare decisions for them, which can be expensive and time

consuming. You can protect your adult child by having them sign an Advance Healthcare Directive, which allows them to authorize someone to make medical decisions on their behalf. It also allows them to express their preferences regarding end-of-life care and organ donation.

Another document that I recommend to protect your adult child is a financial power of attorney, which allows them to appoint a trusted family member or friend to act on their behalf in several financial and legal matters. The financial power of attorney can take effect either at the time your adult child signs the document or if they become incapacitated. There are benefits and risks to either scenario that will vary based on everyone's signing a financial power of attorney

Vegan Cooking Club: the new cool in school

Tofu breakfast scrambles, maple nut scones and a six-foot party sub. Sound delicious? They are all part of the Point Loma High School Vegan Cooking Club Cookbook.

"People think we have eaten meat forever and we have to eat meat, but it's not necessary," club founder and PLHS alumna Liz Gary said.

Gary started the Vegan Cooking Club at PLHS after working with the San Diego Unified School District on a meatless Monday program. Her no-meat cooking ideas quickly spread, leading to vegan family cooking classes at the San Diego Library Point Loma branch, followed by the creation of the Vegan Cooking Club at the high school.

"Vegan is the new cool thing in school," Gary said.

At PLHS a core group of around 15 students attend the free after-school program each week, with other "food curious" students popping in and out throughout the year. On average, Gary said there are 30 students each week. During the class they learn basic cooking skills and

how to make informed food choices.

"Students are learning about how our food choices benefit our everyday health," Gary said. "They learn about the natural resources involved in making them available."

The classes are made available through after-school program grants and according to Gary are the only opportunity for students to learn how to cook inside the classroom.

"They used to have Home Ec classes but now we do not even have that," she said.

Gary said she wanted to be a home economics teacher but was discouraged from doing so by a former teacher. She picked up following a vegan lifestyle later in life and said she too was once skeptical of how to make a tasty vegan meal.

"My son brought a girlfriend home and she was vegan," she said. "I walked through the grocery store and had no idea what to cook for her. It was frustrating."

Gary said she has received some pushback about choosing to be a vegan and for bringing vegan recipes into the classrooms. Overall though, she said the program is well received and expanding.

PLHS was the first school in San Diego County to have a Vegan Cooking Club, but several other schools have since jumped on board including Mission Bay, Lincoln and Chula Vista high schools. All of the recipes from the classes are being compiled into cookbooks for the students with a couple printed copies provided to the school libraries.



'The Big White Dress' showcases bridal fashion throughout history

The Women's Museum of California has debuted its newest exhibit, "The Big White Dress," which explores the evolution of American wedding dress fashion from the 1800s to modern day.

With 12 wedding gowns on display from various eras and textual displays of history placed throughout, the exhibit showcases how cultural changes throughout history have contributed to the progression of bridal fashion over time.

Nikki Saputo-Menn, the curator of "The Big White Dress," says that "the exhibit is really about women, history and the way women have felt about marriage since the 1800s. The culture is reflected in their gown choices for each time period."

For instance, the first gown displayed at the entrance was black, a color typically associated with mourning and opposite of the white dress that society is used to seeing now. Weddings in the 1800s were a private, sort of somber affair.

When asked why she made the ironic choice to start with a black dress, Saputo-Menn explained: "Back then, marriage made women a little apprehensive. Women were

scared they were going to be miserable, lonely, and stuck by themselves to raise the kids by themselves. They were brought up to fulfill their wifely duty, also expected to succumb to their husband's desires... They were repressed in their life, but also in what they wore."

The exhibit then illustrates the infusion of the white wedding gown at the turn of the 20th century. During the early 1900s, the "women's suffrage movement led to a feeling of

women empowerment, and it's seen directly through the clothes," says Saputo-Menn.

The bridal fashion throughout the 1920s and 1930s was indicative of the liberation for women in society. Exemplified by the dresses on display, the hem line rose, sleeves started being worn as detachable, satin made its debut, and the flapper fashion and Hollywood glamour was introduced.

After showcasing the gowns of

the '80s style lace, fluff and puff, and accordion hem trends, the shift to simplicity occurred. A 2005 dress demonstrates the breakaway from frills, and the switch to simple, romantic, and chiffon styles.

Ending the exhibit are dresses from 21st century weddings. With the inclusion of same-sex marriages, the diversity in the marital tradition is seen with varying choices between dresses, and stunning pantsuits, etc.

The final dress flawlessly mirrors the most popular bridal trend of today – bohemian with a modern flare. The BHLDN by Anthropologie gown illustrates how the modernday bride is free from tradition and picks their gown based off of personal taste.

Many of the dresses on display are borrowed from the museum's Historic Clothing Collection and the Gaslamp Quarter Historical Foun-



Health and Safety Tips for Your BBQ Grill

San Diego is home to the best weather in the country. Even during our chilliest days, we love to grill - it's a way of life in sunny southern California. What we don't love is the clean-up. It's messy and takes us away from game-time and family time. If you are like most people, your grill could use some serious attention. Grease drippings are not only a safety hazard; they can cause unhealthy grilling conditions and other health hazards.

- Flame-ups charring your perfect steak

3. Location, Location

While you're deciding what to grill, don't forget to consider where to place the grill itself. The location of your barbecue grill makes a big difference in terms of grill safety.

- Always grill outside in an open space. Never grill in garages, tents, trailers or on balconies, you run the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning or setting fire to the structure.
- Place all grills on a non-flammable surface, such as a concrete patio.
- Make sure the grill is a minimum of ten feet from the house, deck. eaves and tree branches.

4. Prepare for the Worst

Always be prepared for grilling mishaps so you can keep them from becoming grilling tragedies. There are several ways to keep a bad situation from becoming worse:

- Keep a fire extinguisher close by when you're grilling. • Control grease fires by tossing
- baking soda on them.
- A bucket of sand can be used to put out errant fires.
- Have a water source, such as a garden hose, nearby. Any one or more of these will help to keep a fire under control or extinguish it entirely. Always have the fire department number on

Grill safety really comes down to using common sense. Make sure your grill is in good working condition. Clean-up after your cookout only takes a few minutes - about the same amount of time it takes a fire to get out of control.

Fast Heart Mart takes a beat at Harney Sushi in Old Town



Old Town has many wonderful entertainment options, but until recently, with exception of strolling mariachis, music wasn't one of them. Recently, however, acoustic music hotspot, Java Joe's, has moved into the area, and now, singer-songwriter fans can find live music on Thursdays at Harney Sushi, including Fast Heart Mart, aka Martin Stamper, who performs there on May 24.

Originally from Virginia, Stamper arrived in San Diego circa 2013, quickly immersing himself in the local music community. A prolific tunesmith, Stamper's music is steeped in Americana, varying between banjo and guitar accompaniment, originals and covers, which might range from folk standards to a recast version of Ozzy Osbourne's "Crazy Train."

The past two years have been hectic for Stamper, with performances in Europe, a book; "European Music Tour," chronicling said adventures and the release of his latest of 14 albums to date, 2017.

Stamper got an early start in music. While he has been performing professionally since 1999, he started writing songs at the age of 4. "It was a harmonica song called "Lunch Box," he recalled. While today he is known for his banjo prowess, guitar was the gateway to

his music career. "I have always been soothed by songs. Guitar was a natural accompaniment for songs that I would write," Stamper remarked.

"I knew I wanted to write songs because I had a lot anxiety as a kid. I wanted to help others feel less alone in their struggle through songs, like all the singers I have ever listened to have done for me," he said. He notes that his focus on original music in his live sets has lessened in recent years. ""I'm playing a lot more covers these days than I used to," Stamper said. "Back in the early 2000s I could play all original music because I was making good money from the album sales etc., so I only used to do more obscure covers by bands like Neutral Milk Hotel or The Handsome Family. When I moved to

San Diego in 2013, I quickly realized I needed to play more covers if I was going to make any money. I now play about 50 percent originals, 20 percent public domain songs and 30 percent covers."

He cites Pink Floyd's "Wish You Were Here" and The Beatles "Norwegian Wood" as current crowd pleasers. "I'm really learning a lot lately about picking the right songs

for the right crowd and setting. If I know what mood a crowd needs at a particular time and place and I have an original song that would fulfill that need, then the original song will grab their attention," he explained.

"For example, Farmers' Markets are usually early in the day with a lot of babies and toddlers around, so upbeat banjo music works great, such as my song "Hearts and Dreams." However, if I'm playing at some ultra-hip bar at night, the banjo stuff may not go over so well. That's when I break out my guitar and play some original modern rock-ish songs. But there are definitely times when the only trick that will work is a good cover song."

Stamper acknowledges being a full time musician can be tough, but he wouldn't live his life any other way. "Tve been a lawn mower, a baby sitter, a waiter, an automotive tire technician, a teacher to the mentally disabled, a mosquito control man and a video-grapher," he mused.

"Music is the only thing that still keeps my attention. It's what gets me out of bed every day, it's the only profession that excites me," he continued. "I believe I've been given a gift of music and when I honor the gift, it fulfills me and provides joy like no other profession I know."





Ocean Beach and Point Loma.

Both the San Diego Tourism Authority and the Hotel-Motel Association cited the initiative's creation of 7,000 new permanent jobs and its addition of \$40 billion to the local economy, as solid reasons to support the measure.

"As a small-business owner, I know how important convention center visitors are," said Mina Desiderio, the creator of Wonderland Ocean Pub in Ocean Beach and owner of The Local restaurant in PB and Resident Brewing

"Workers and small businesses benefit when visitors come to America's Finest City. The initiative invests in tourism, and tourism means jobs."

Tourism is a huge component of the San Diego job market. One out of eight jobs in San Diego are tourist-related, employing nearly 200,000 people. That makes tourism the region's second largest employment sector.

"The Yes! for a Better San Diego initiative will create thousands of goodpaying jobs, from entry-level positions to upper-level management," said Joe Terzi, president/ CEO of the San Diego Tourism Authority. "This measure invests in tourism and our local economy, without costing local taxpayers a dime."

The Convention Center is of critical importance to the City's overall tourism industry. While Convention

Center attendees make up just 6 percent of San Diego visitors, they spend much more than the average visitor, accounting for 27 percent of all visitor spending.

"Spending from convention center visitors has a ripple effect on our local economy. It creates jobs at businesses large and small," said Elvin Lai, CEO of the Ocean Park Inn and Hotel in Pacific Beach and president of the San Diego County Hotel-Motel Association. "Tourism workers are chefs and brewers, sport-fishing guides and surf instructors, marketing executives and CEOs. Our industry builds careers that move from the hotel lobby to the executive office."

During the first years of the tax increase, 59 percent of revenues are

earmarked for the convention center and 41 percent to homelessness programs. Between 2025 and 2061, 59 percent would go toward the center, 31 percent to homelessness programs and 10 percent to City street repairs.

"Repairing an additional 150 miles of streets each year means 'every' neighborhood wins," said La Jolla resident Joe LaCava, former chair of the Community Planners Community, which oversees the city's more than 40 citizen advisory groups. "With \$600 million dedicated to repair streets across San Diego, paid for by visitors and not local residents, it is a huge win for our communities."

Deacon Jim Vargas of Father Joe's Villages highlighted the initiative's job creating potential to alleviate homelessness. "Generating more good-paying, entry-level jobs in San Diego is key to the success of our job training programs," Vargas said. "The immediate funding this measure provides would support programs that help people transitioning out of homelessness."

Proponents must gather 71,000 signatures for the issue to appear on the November ballot. If approved by voters, the measure would increase the visitor tax on hotel bills by 1.25 percent to 3.25 percent.


