# **Fiesta Island** development, **Prop C top** MBPC agenda

On Nov. 4, San Diegans will decide who receives Mission Bay Park's lease revenue when they weigh in on Proposition C. The Mission Bay Park Committee (MBPC) discussed the charter amendment as well as redevelopment of Fiesta Island at its Oct. 7 meeting at the Santa Clara Recreation Cen-

SeaWorld and Mission Bay Park properties like The Bahia Resort Hotel annually generate approximately \$28 million in revenue. San Diegans originally agreed to allow commercial development in 25 percent of the park on the condition that resulting revenues would go toward completing the vast recreational area.

"The Mission Bay compact has been broken for three decades," Bob Ottilie, who served for years on the MBPC as a member at large and acting chairperson, said after the

Roughly 90 percent of Mission Bay Park's lease revenues are funneled every year into the city's general fund, which pays for emergency and basic services.

In 2004, City Council enacted the Mission Bay Ordinance. The measure gives 25 per-

### MBHS alum honor fallen soldiers with renovated monument

Fifty years ago, two girls loved the same boy. His name was Walter "Magoo" Stevens. The women met for the first time last Friday at the dedication of the renovated Vietnam War Memorial monument at Mission Bay High School. As they embraced, both women cried.

Judith Lancefield, 68, of Portland, Ore., was Stevens' sweetheart when they graduated from MBHS in 1958. Magoo also dated an older sister of 58-year-old Rita Gaffney Price of Pacific Beach. Rita had a childhood crush on the handsome young Marine who would visit her family home and play with the neighborhood kids.

In May 1966, Stevens, Marines sergeant, was killed while leading his men in Vietnam. His name along with five other Mission Bay graduates — David Rose (class of 1958),

Richard Friend (1965), William Fix and James Gulie (1967) and Charles Goldmeyer (1968) — appear on the newly renovated monument outside the school auditorium.

The event was the fulfillment of a dream for Rita Price, who 10 years earlier began her campaign to restore the forgotten ground level memorial. She first raised money, mostly her own, for plaques to identify the site as a Vietnam War memorial and to add Stevens' name. The project didn't gain traction until Cheryl Seelos became principal of Mission Bay High School and Walter Schneider, Stevens' best friend, began thinking about his 50th high school reunion. In 2007, a Junior Marine Corps ROTC program, headed by Lt. Col. Brian Jostens, was added to the Mission Bay curriculum. Jostens, Sgt. Maj. Mark Harrell and the ROTC cadets cleaned the area and conducted Memorial

Day services in May 2008.

In response to a Beach & Bay Press article at that time, almost \$2,000 was raised by alumni from the MBHS Class of 1958 and other individuals. During the summer, Seelos and Jostens formalized plans to beautify the entire garden area. The xeriscape was donated by school secretary Pam Connelly and her husband.

Jostens assumed responsibility for the actual memorial, which he designed and built. The plaques were cleaned, polished and anodized without cost by San Diego Plating. A black granite base with gold highlights was donated by San Diego Granite. When individuals at these businesses learned the memorial was for Mission Bay High School, they wanted to give something to their school. Both of these men had played ball for Coach Dennis Pugh. The dedication ceremony was part of a five-day 50th

reunion celebration for the MBHS Class of 1958.

Seelos and ASB president Lee Houck spoke of service, patriotism and sacrifice in their remarks to an estimated crowd of 75 primarily members from the Class of 1958 and other interested Pacific Beach resi-








### **Judge orders mental exam for murder suspect**

A Pacific Beach man who is suspected of killing his roommate and then trying to commit suicide afterwards has won a court order for a psychiatrist to examine him in jail for what could be a mental illness defense.

Ian Alex Suazo, 21, has pleaded not guilty to the Sept. 24 murder of Ocie Raines.

Raines died from a knife wound to his throat. The morning of the killing, a neighbor reported to police he heard sounds of a struggle and shouts around 2:30 a.m. coming from Suazo's apartment. Police responded to a report of someone finding the dead man around 5 a.m. in the apartment in the 800 block of Agate Street in Pacific Beach.

Suazo was hit by a car hours later at the intersection of Chalcedony Street and Mission Boulevard, in what police say was an attempted suicide. He was transported to the hospital for serious trauma injuries.

Suazo's attorney got a court order allowing a psychiatrist to

examine Suazo in jail, according to killed. court records. Suazo could later plead not guilty by reason of insanity when psychiatric reports are filed. His attorney could not be reached for comment.

Suazo's father spoke out after his son's arrest, saying his son was mentally ill and suicidal in the days before his roommate's death. News reports after his arrest stated that Suazo had lost his job as a bartender at a Pacific Beach bar four days before his roommate was

Suazo was arraigned in his hospital bed two days later, but now is in custody in the downtown central jail on \$1 million bail. On Oct. 7, San Diego Superior Court Judge Fred Maguire set a preliminary hearing for Jan. 13.

If Suazo is convicted of firstdegree murder, he faces 25 years to life in prison. If a judge or jury finds him not guilty by reason of insanity, he could be committed to a state mental hospital for life.

cent of the park's lease revenue exceeding \$20 million to both the Mission Bay Improvement Fund and the Regional Park Fund, not to exceed \$2.5 million in a fiscal year.

City Council can vote to waive the measure and usually has. In 2006, however, approximately \$1 million was returned to the park to pay for a replacement lifeguard dock at Quivira Basin. The same year, approximately \$98,000 was earmarked for road repairs on Fiesta Island.

The initiative is not a reliable revenue source because the cashstrapped city too often votes to waive it, Ottilie said.

If Proposition C passes, starting in July, \$23 million in lease revenue would go to the city every year. The remainder would go toward completing the capital improvement projects outlined in the Mission Bay Park Master Plan. When the plan was approved in 1994, the price tag for trail improvements, shoreline maintenance and other projects was \$200 million. Ottilie estimates that total is now close to \$400 million.

Proposition C would provide "a guaranteed revenue stream," Ottilie said. After five years, the city's cut of Mission Bay lease revenues would go from \$23 million to \$20 million.

Continuing to give the city the lion's share of lease revenues helps "ease economic withdrawal," said Ottilie. "It's not a dramatic impact on the city, but over time it could have a dramatic impact on the park," he said. If Proposition C passes, Mission Bay Park could receive

between \$5 million to \$12 million annually. Regional parks could net \$2 million to \$4 million every year.

Though the measure has the support of Mayor Jerry Sanders, Councilwoman Donna Frye, Councilman Kevin Faulconer and the Sierra Club, it has also raised some concerns.

The measure does not include public input, longtime MBPC member Judy Swink said. The committee, which would provide primary oversight if Proposition C passes, did not debate the ballot initiative before it went to City Council for a vote, she added.

The priorities outlined in the measure could also prove too rigid, slowing completion of Fiesta Island and other key projects, Swink said.

Citing similar concerns about limited flexibility, Council President Scott Peters and Councilmen Ben Hueso and Jim Madaffer voted against putting the measure on the

Proposition C identifies seven priorities, including dredging, the expansion of wetlands and preserves for endangered and threatened species, and completion of bicycle trails, that would be addressed in a specific sequence. The prioritization is an important part of the measure, according to Ottilie, because it allows voters to see exactly what they would get.

Under the measure, the MBPC would determine the order of priorities and City Council would approve it. The council could change the sequence, he said, if funding becomes available for another project.

Though the committee did not

solicit community input, Ottilie said the measure is the culmination of years of discussion on how to fund park projects. Furthermore, he added, the measure reflects the community's interest in improving

One of Mission Bay Park's most popular attractions, Fiesta Island, will remain as is for the time being. A proposed redevelopment project has drawn strong opposition from area dog owners who say the sandy. expansive island is the ideal location for their pets to run and play.

According to Michael Singleton of KTU+A, the firm handling the project, redevelopment is on hold until City Council approves funding for an environmental review. Project planners are also exploring another alternative to accommodate dog owners' wishes.

The MBPC will hold its next meeting Tuesday, Nov. 4, at 6 p.m., at the Santa Clara Recreation Center, 1008 Santa Clara Place.

#### Water monitoring cuts puts public at risk

Almost two weeks ago now, the state of California took a giant step backward in an already reeling, calamitous world. Governor Schwarzenagger, in one stroke of his pen, undid all state-funded ocean water quality monitoring of public beaches.

This was done in an effort to balance the state's obviously overextended budget. There is no question that cuts and sacrifices need to be made. But we must examine the necessity of monitoring oceans and bays not just from an environmental perspective but also from a public health standpoint as well. How can we afford not to be aware of potential toxins and/or biologically harmful substances in our frequently visited coastal waters?

First and foremost, the public's health is at stake when there is no longer any water testing going on nor any public notification. With millions of local San Diego county residents diving into the water, how many more individuals will contract waterborne illnesses?



Imagine taking your children to the beach, knowing that there had been beach closures in the past and that now the water may or may not be safe. The end of water monitoring increases the risk of beachgoers getting sick, and on an even grander scale, it could jeopardize one of California's most precious resources the ocean itself.

Environmentally, monitoring the bacteria levels seems like a thermometer (albiet crude) that could alert us to detrimental changes in the ocean. In the event of an undetected sewage spill, the spill could go unnoticed until numerous people are sick and then have the wherewithal to report it. Then and only, then what could have been a relatively simple fix has turned into a much larger environmental and public health issue.

So the public health and environmental benefits are an easy sell. But in these drastic economic times for our city, state and country, how do we afford this? The obvious question is, how much money does it take to run the program locally?

Apparently, the whole program costs \$300,000 a year. That's not a lot of money to test the waters of San Diego County (from the Mexico border up to San Onofre) and notify the public when bacteria levels are high. It's a small price to pay for safer beaches and potentially cleaner water.

That \$300,000 price tag looks even smaller when you consider the billions of dollars generated by ocean-and beach-related industries (everything from surfboard manufacturing to a waterfront hotel boasting coastal access). Consider what a central part our beaches and bays are to tourism and life in San Diego economically and aesthetically.

Politicians, including our mayor, boasted about the fewer beach closures from year to year in San Diego. The program was making San Diego look good here and abroad. Politicians were quick to claim credit for it until the governor decided to do away with state funding for the California's beach water monitoring programs.

Where do we turn now? San Diego County doesn't seem to want make it a priority now either. So then what? If every one of the millions of beachgoers paid a quarter when they went to the

beach, the program could still run. If all San Diego residents contributed 15 cents, testing could continue and the water quality could be designated as safe or unsafe allowing us to know what risks we were taking by going for a swim or a surf in our oceans.

As more and more Americans become aware that they are part of the solution to the environmental deterioration of our city and country, we need to move forward, not backward, in protecting our precious resources. Why are we dismantling one of the country's most respected water quality programs and turning a blind eye to our citizens' and oceans health?

Governor Schwarzenegger's line-item veto was short-sighted, and, unfortunately, is a done deal. But now what? I ask the county to consider assisting with funding or even local nonprofit environmental organizations to come together to work on an alternative plan so that our beaches and bays of San Diego are safe and

dents. A recitation of the poem, "In Flanders Fields," struck a chord with the audience. Former ASB president Chuck McGregor of San Diego was moved by the ceremony.

"The ROTC, the principal, the teachers, the students, our classmates... I'm proud to be a member of the Mission Bay Class of 1958. Walt and Dave were our friends. I'm so proud of our class. It was a wonderful event," McGregor said.

The Rose family was represented at the dedication by Chuck and Sandy Devereux. An older brother, Daniel Rose, was killed in a traffic accident during his senior year at the Citadel in Charleston, S.C. The only surviving family member is Terry Rose of Sacramento. Terry, a Mission Bay graduate, was in his senior year at the Citadel in September 1966 when the middle son, David, an Army lieutenant, was killed in action. At the time, Terry was captain of the Citadel rifle team and the top collegiate marksman in America. As the sole surviving son, he was not given his commission in the Army and became a civil engineer instead.

Aline Minga Brown, class of 1958, and her husband, Don, drove to the reunion from Washington state.

"We didn't get to our hotel until 1 a.m. on Friday and had to get up early to attend the service. I didn't want to miss it. To me and my husband, it was more important than the reunion," she said.

Susan Senour Wraight, ROTC queen from the class of 1962, attended with her husband, David, and son, Ian

"It's difficult to put my emotions into words," Wraight said. "To see the large turnout honor those who gave their lives for our country was gratifying. It's nice to know that our generation still cares about such things, but I was also very impressed with the students who attended. They were respectful and wanted to learn about the memorial. I was treated so nicely by a student named Jonte."

Following the tour, the class of 1958 was treated to lunch donated by Submarina of Pacific Beach in the auditorium. ASB advisor Emmitt Dodd, who organized the luncheon, said, "It was an honor to host the class of 1958. They were the pioneers at our school. It was wonderful to see the kids interact with the alums. They were dancing together with the students during lunch just like it was the 1950s again. The kids loved it."

Bill Dague, class of 1958, of Magalia, Calif., said he had a great time at the service.

"The kids were great. They were so

friendly and interested in learning about what it was like to go to Mission Bay back in the '50s. They made us feel like kids again."

Seelos agreed.

"I was delighted to see how open the students and the alumni were to one another. We've never had such a large group of former students tour the campus. The interaction in the classrooms was amazing. The morning started with a solemn ceremony and then everyone caught the spirit the class of 1958 brought with them. It was a wonderful opportunity for our students to get a perspective and history from those who attended the school when it was new. They learned some of the traditions and how much the school meant to the alumni. I was so proud of our kids."

Price reflected on the day: "The Vietnam War Memorial that was rededicated at MBHS was a long time coming. It is nice to know that each Memorial Day there will be a tribute to the students who were killed in the Vietnam War. For years, it was just me going over with my clippers to trim back the grass and weeds, standing for a moment of silence to honor my six friends. Now the school is

deeply involved. I have told our four grandchildren that they will be the keepers of the Vietnam War Memorial at the school in the years to come, to honor and respect it forever."

For the Class of 1958, it was a time for tears... and laughter. It was about generations making a connection with one another — young and old together showing respect for fellow Buccaneers who made the supreme sacrifice for our country despite conflicted attitudes on the homefront. It was about sharing the importance of education, public service and the greater good of society.

A special reserved table with settings for Rose and Stevens was prepared for Saturday evening's reunion dinner party at the Mission Bay Yacht Club. The class of 1958 donated \$500 to help pay off the remaining debt on the memorial. Additionally, a Gordon & Smith poster was auctioned for \$270.





# Y3K brings the party to RT's Longboard

The cover band business is a tough one. Changing musical trends, format shifting nightclubs and fickle audiences make longevity in the competitive club scene a difficult prospect. Now entering its 10th year, local cover band Y3K has proven to be an exception to the rule, adapting and thriving on the local circuit. Though the band's name, does have connotations of the 1999 computer melt down scare, Y3K percussionist Preacher Patterson said the band's name variation has staying power built into it.

"Meltdown? Nothing like that," Patterson said. "Keyboardist John Weber and guitarist Ed Been founded the band and they wanted a name to last the millennia."

He admits that club goers sometimes get the name a little wrong. "People will come up with variations. We get a kick out of that. But once you get it, it sticks," he said.

The band, who perform at RT's Longboard Grill on Friday, Oct. 17, also includes vocalist Andi Judge and drummer Rocko. They have seen many changes in the local club scene since their inception. Indeed, Patterson considers this show to be a return to the beach area after the shuttering of several of their regular venues. They last performed in the area in 2004 at the Catamaran Hotel's now defunct Cannibal Bar. The former

nightspot is now a spa.

"Venues come and go or the management flips for something different," Patterson said. "That's why we favor clubs with a track record. They seem to survive when the pendulum changes."

With most group's having a life span of three years or three albums, which ever comes first, a decade is also long time to hang on to a fan base, but Y 3K has been able to keep theirs through a constantly changing song list and high-energy performances.

"We joke that the crowd keeps getting younger and we're heading in the opposite direction," guitarist Been said. "Lots of people have been with us since the beginning, but we've also picked up folks along the way."

For Patterson, the reasons for

# **Bolts get payback with big win over Pats**

With their backs to the wall, and possibly their season on the line, the San Diego Chargers responded with a big win at home on Sunday, Oct. 12 night over the New England Patriots.

From Philip Rivers' three touchdown passes to a defense that stopped the Patriots cold on fourthand-goal from the 1-yard line, the Chargers were on their game in a 30-10 rout.

The Chargers evened their record at 3-3, moving one game behind AFC West, leading Denver, which lost to Jacksonville.

"This was obviously a big game for us," Rivers said. "It was big because of the situation we are in, because it gets us back to .500 before we go on this world tour here the next couple of weeks."

The world tour Rivers refers to is a game at Buffalo on Sunday, followed by a trip to London to play New Orleans on Oct. 26.

Rivers, who went 18 of 27 for 306 yards, threw TD passes of 49 yards to Malcolm Floyd, four yards to Vincent Jackson and one yard to Antonio Gates.

The icing on the cake was beat-

ing the Patriots, who the Chargers lost to in the AFC Championship game last season. New England had won three straight over the Chargers, including twice in the postseason.

New England (3-2), which is playing without injured quarter-back Tom Brady for the remainder of the season, scored its fewest points since a 21-0 loss to Miami on Dec. 10, 2006.

The Chargers defense punished Brady's backup, Matt Cassel, by sacking him four times and intercepting him once.

"We knew that there was going to be a lot of energy in the stadium tonight," Cassel said. "We knew that they were gonna come out and try to shut us out early. They did a good job."

New England's regular-season road winning streak was snapped at 12 with the loss.

Chargers running back LaDainian Tomlinson, who has been hobbled with a sprained toe this season, became the 17th running back to rush for more than 11,000 career yards.

Rams get first win: Don't give up on the St. Louis Rams quite yet.

They pulled off a 19-17 upset win at Washington on Sunday, ending their eight-game losing streak over two seasons.

The Rams cooled off the Redskins, who were seeking their fifth straight win. St. Louis forced Washington into committing its first three turnovers of the season. Josh Brown's 49-yard field goal on the last play of the game won it.

Did the Redskins overlook the

"We hadn't thought ahead all season long until this week," Redskins running back Clinton Portis said. "The previous four games, the focus was there."

All it takes is 11 seconds: The Chicago Bears may have celebrated their comeback prematurely on Sunday at Atlanta. And many Falcons fans left too early.
