SDUSD revotes: Marksmanship training will finish season

Students learning how to shoot air rifles in the junior ROTC marksmanship program at Mission Bay High School will be allowed to finish the season, decided the San Diego Unified Board of Education after voting to eliminate the program point blank.

The board 3-2 voted on Feb. 24 to allow the students to complete their seasonal competitions.

Board trustee John Lee Evans, who originally sought to end the air-gun training, voted to let the students finish out the season. He said he didn't know about seasonal competitions because "it was never brought up before."

"The board's decision seemed unfair to [the JROTC students] who entered the class this year when [marksmanship] was part of the curriculum," Evans said.

Board members John de Beck and Richard Barrera voted against the

motion to delay ending marksmanship training, reaffirming their earlier votes to halt the air-rifle program. De Beck represents schools in the beach communities. Board members Katherine Nakamura, Shelia Jackson and Evans voted to return the marksmanship training for the rest of the year.

Like other schools, Mission Bay and Point Loma high schools had several competitions left in the year when the school board voted down the program.

"I felt like all our hard work was poof, gone," said Mission Bay senior Edgar

A cadet commander, Lima said the marksmanship program is a collegiate and Olympic sport and not military weapons training.

The Point Loma marksmanship instructor, 1st Sgt. Jack Patague, said students were disappointed with the decision to take away the marksmanship training, which is a collegiate

"The biggest thing is that I think these kids ... felt they weren't given the opportunity to finish something they started," Patague said.

Mike Hom, a Mission Bay junior and former Marine Corps JROTC student said he was disappointed when the school board ended the marksmanship program.

"We're not firing off actual rounds," Hom said. "Its an air rifle. I don't understand how [the board of trustees] can justify taking it away."

Hom said the marksmanship program taught him responsibility and safety rules.

But David Morales, another Mission Bay High School student, said the board's decision to reinstate the program sends the wrong message to stu-

Mission Beach seeks curbside recycling

Mission Beach residents want curbside recycling to help stop trashcans from overflowing.

The population skyrockets during the summer months and, along with it, so does the rubbish, but the city stopped its supplemental trash pickup services during the summer.

The Mission Beach Town Council (MBTC) is now calling on the city to extend curbside recycling to Mission Beach, the only residential community in San Diego that doesn't have it. Overflowing garbage bins may cast a negative

image on the neighborhood and possibly hurt tourism, said MBTC member Bob Craig. "Unless we come up with a plan by summertime,

it's going to be a black eye – not just on Mission Beach but on the city [of San Diego]," Craig said. Dedicated recyclers in the area often load their

cars with a week's worth of recyclable material and deliver it to a pickup at Santa Clara Recreation Center in Mission Beach.


Many residents, however, simply toss recyclable material in the garbage, which goes straight to the Miramar landfill that is quickly filling to capacity. City officials recently worked with Marine Corps Air Station, Mirmar to extend the life of the city's sole landfill to 2017.

District-2 City Council representative Kevin Faulconer said the recycling program is long overdue. His office has requested a cost analysis of implementing a recycling program in Mission Beach. The community opted out of the program several years ago because some residents felt there was no room for the bins, said 20-year resident Bill Bradshaw.

"The community has talked about recycling for a long time," Faulconer said. "Some supported it in the past and some have not. Now there's some consensus and the community wants to have recycling...I think the city should do this."

The city requires recycling services for neighborhoods, according to Steven Grealy, waste reduction program manager with the city's Environmental Services Department. But with the city facing budget woes, a recycling program may not be affordable



Faulconer pushes again for oversized vehicle pilot program

Moving along oversized vehicles is getting another push from Councilman Kevin Faulconer.

The City Council delayed its vote on creating an oversized vehicle ordinance last October because most council members felt the \$2 million proposed cost, mainly to enforce the ordinance, was too high. Faulconer was one of them: he wanted the council to find a more cost-effective system.

Now is the time to revisit the subject, urged Faulconer, who represents Pacific Beach, Mission Beach, Ocean Beach and Point Loma. The Board of Port Commissioners passed their own oversized vehicle ordinance on Feb. 3 to stop people storing their RVs or parking overnight along the bay front. Faulconer is concerned the displaced vehicles will move to the beach community to park.

Faulconer wants to know how much it will cost the city to implement a pilot program that covers the beach communities - from Point Loma to La Jolla - plus northern downtown and the Morena business district. Faulconer sent a memorandum to Chief Operating Officer Jay Goldstone to look into the cost. Goldstone had not calculated the figure as of press time.

The city estimated it would cost \$2 million to implement the program citywide because the city would need to hire a night shift of parking patrollers, plus the cost of signage to inform people of the new law. Yet, early last year, the deputy director of transportation, Deborah Van Wanseele, reported the pilot program would be cost neutral because the city would recover costs through permit fees and citations.

"Implementation of the ordinance in the pilot area would determine whether such an ordinance would be cost neutral and revenue generating citywide," Faulconer wrote in a memorandum to the city's Chief Operating Officer, Jay Goldstone.

The ordinance proposes to prohibit people from park-

ing oversized, non-motorized and recreational vehicles on any public street between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. Residents with large vehicles and no driveways will receive a permit to park on the street.

The port district's new oversized vehicle ordinance will prohibit parking along Shelter Island Drive from 3 a.m. to 4:30 a.m. The ordinance is meant to stop people storing vacant RV's along the street, and to curb overnight parking, explained Jim Hutzelman, a spokesperson for the port district.

The ordinance also gave the port's executive director the authority to strategically designate 26 parking spaces for large vehicles. The idea is to prevent large vehicles from blocking views to the bay.

"People stay at Shelter Island hotels that they pay for – and their view corridors are blocked," Hutzelman said, who added the intent behind the ordinance is to maximize access to the bay front for day users.

Crime dropped last quarter; spring break arrives

Crime in the beach communities dropped last quarter, October to December, compared to the same quarter in 2007, reported Captain Shelley Zimmerman of the Northern Division at the Pacific Beach Town Council on Feb. 19. The report includes Pacific Beach, Mission Beach, Mission Bay, La Jolla and Torrey Pines.

Violent crime in the beach area dropped 17 percent from the year before. Rape decreased 85.7 percent from a reported seven cases in the 2007 quarter to only one this past quarter. Property crime decreased 17.2 percent from last year. Car theft alone declined 17 percent.

Officers issued approximately 2,000 traffic citations.

Zimmerman credits the decline to the partnership between the var-

ious city departments – from the police station to the mayor's office and Councilmember Kevin Faulconer's office – to the Neighborhood Watch groups and numerous active citizens. The division has also taken on new programs, including wearing reflective vests to create higher visibility and educating the public on taking a "no bystander" approach to crime.

The Northern Division has also begun saturating an area occasionally to create a strong police presence. On Friday evening, Feb. 17, police saturated PB and arrested 17 people and issued 17 citations.


"You can't put a crime statistic on what we deter [by being visible]," Zimmerman said.

The Northern Division has also been working with the Irish Consulate in San Francisco to educate the thousands of Irish students that visit San Diego each year on "how to be a good neighbor." Zimmerman said between 2,500 to 3,000 students from Ireland will arrive in the summer on work visas and many will either live or frequent the beaches and bars. Zimmerman has personally met with an ambassador from the Irish Consulate to discuss the problems stemming from some of the Irish students.

"Those we had issues with in the past were particularly students from Ireland," Zimmerman said.

Spring break begins March 6 and will continue for seven weeks into April, reported Zimmerman. The Northern Division has sent reminders to universities to remind students alcohol is not allowed on the beach.

Boom! Bang!

Summertime fireworks continue at SeaWorld following a lawsuit, three-year study and the Regional Water Quality Control Board agreeing the fireworks did not contain cadmium, lead, copper or zinc.

SeaWorld fires off 250 shells during each summer night's fireworks show, and then skims the bay's surface and cleans the sands of any debris following each show, according to SeaWorld spokesperson Patrick Owen. Twice a year, Sea-World sends divers to the bottom of the bay to search for sunken shells. As part of SeaWorld's water quality control permit, it will continue water and sediment testing.

Grealy recommends recycling plastic grocery bags at a grocery store. Plastic bags become too dirty and unusable when tossed in a blue bin with other material.

The city earns revenue from its partnerships with national recycling companies. Last year, the city made about \$6.1 million, according to Grealv.

State law requires the city to recycle about half of its waste. The city recycled approximately 55 percent of its waste stream in 2006, according to Grealy.

Mission Beach resident Jasmine Kung said the city should pay attention to the recycling needs of Mission Beach residents.

"We have to make recycling easier for people," Kung said. "All we're asking from the city is that they provide us with the blue bins and provide us with the service they already provide for every other community in the city."

Mission Beach Town Council representatives recommend residents write to Councilmember Faulconer and the mayor's office to request curbside recycling.

Freedom Fighters on My Mind



When it comes to freedom fighters, I've met a few.

I once shook hands with Martin Luther King long before he gave birth to his wonder-

I twice sang to Rosa Parks and basked in her beautiful and warm smile, so thankful that she once sat down so I could stand up

I remember sipping wine with Pete Seeger and kicking back while he sang and waxed eloquently about civil and human rights and his efforts to get the world to "study war no more."

Needless to say these were thrilling moments in my life but no more so than the moments I've spent, over the last year, with a number of freedom fighting students from Lincoln and Mission Bay High.

These kids, over a hundred strong, most of them Latinos along with a smattering of African Americans, didn't set out to change their world. No, they were just trying to make their grades and get their homework in on time and get ahead in the lunchline.

Then one day, they suddenly came to realize that some of their peers who were looking for college preparatory courses were steered into JROTC (which is often a direct path into the military) based on the lie that the program has academic value.

And they got wind of plans for weapons training on their campuses which they sensibly felt made a hypocrisy out of the school district's "no excuses, no exceptions" zero tolerance policy regarding weapons.

As they pondered what to do and who to turn to, a couple of brilliant caring teachers, Kiki Ochoa at Lincoln and Luis Villanueva at Mission Bay, came to their rescue with open arms. They were joined by parents and a few other educators and community activists like me. We became the Education Not Arms Coalition and set out on a quest which has been, figuratively speaking, reminiscent of the freedom struggles of yore.

Those who marched for justice in the streets of the deep South in the 60's came up against fire hoses and police attack dogs. Our petitions and rallies and presentations were met by authorities, for the most part, with sober cold "Whatever, who cares?" attitudes.

The students in our coalition were accused of being "coached and manipulated" by a bunch of "uninformed special interest groups." But, in reality, some of them, based on both personal and reported nega-

tive experiences with JROTC, educated themselves about their issues and concerns and organized forums where they presented what they had learned from their meticulous research. Quite simply, they knew what they expected of their schools and set out to make it happen.

The powers that be in Montgomery frowned at Rosa's refusal to give up her bus seat because "segregation is just the way it

San Diego city schools, early on, dismissed the students' protestations against weapons training because "it has existed in the district since 1919."

But like their counterparts from long ago, the students and their allies won. Students in the school system can no longer be lied to about or railroaded into JROTC and weapons training has seen its last days.

The beauty of it all to me, as an educator, is that these students' teachers steadily, along the way, guided them and nurtured them and helped them make the journey from innocent victims to sophisticated community activists who now know how to create the kinds of social changes that are needed in our society - if people are to truly be

I will forever hold these young pursuers of justice, these new heroes of mine, in a place in my heart and soul alongside the freedom fighters of old.

Touring Turquoise...One of the pleasures of PB's restaurant walks is the "walking" part – actually strolling from place to place, rather than driving to your destination, eating and taking off again.

North PB has the right idea - just a bit of greenery, multiplied, adds a lot of charm.

Getting rid of Graffiti...Right on cue, the rain stopped at 8:30 a.m., allowing graffitibusters to fan out through PB. PB Town Council's Jerry Hall coordinates the annual clean-up, this year led by Gregg Barnes.

Over 150 people gathered at PB Presbyterian Church to receive the basics: "Goofoff," a magic spray that removes most graffiti, and assorted paints to cover the rest.

I joined the dumpster cleaning crew, partnering with Steve Pearson. Our territory was the alley between Grand and Thomas, where we discovered as much damage on trashcans as dumpsters. For the dumpsters, we had matching paint donated by their companies. Good old "Goof-off" quickly took care of the trashcans.

As we worked, residents poked heads out of apartments to thank us. And suddenly I remembered: Back before Discover PB, I worked with the PB Business Improvement Association. We couldn't mail our newsletter on our meager budget, so after writing it, I delivered newsletters on Garnet, from Crystal Pier to Morrell. Just once. Then I found block captains on each business block for future deliveries.

Wouldn't it be great to have "alley captains" watching residential blocks and business block captains coordinating their areas?

Police chase six men through PB, OB

Six men in a van fled from police in a chase that ensued along Sea World Drive, and that ended with several of the men tumbling out of the van as it swerved through an Ocean Beach neighborhood on Saturday, Feb. 21 at approximately 11:30 p.m.

Police received a call that a group of men were trying to cause fights along the 700 block of Garnet Avenue. The suspects left the area in a van onto southbound I-5, according to a statement from San Diego Police spokeswoman Mònica Muñoz. A canine officer stopped the van near the Grand Avenue exit. The driver stopped, but then continued driving as police continued the chase. The driver led police along Sea World Drive before driving into Ocean Beach via Sunset Cliffs Boulevard.

The van swerved onto Long Branch Avenue in Ocean Beach before turning again onto Bacon Street. Some of the men jumped or fell from the vehicle along Bacon Street before police arrested them.

The driver of the van tried to walk away calmly before police arrested him. Police took the rest of the men into custody after they fled from the van in all directions.

Police later placed one of the suspects, 20-year-old David Ochoa, under arrest for an alleged assault that occurred in January on the 300 block of 39th Street, according to police.

City asks for \$\$ to keep fire pits burning

San Diegans who wish to keep the fire pits burning on the beach are being asked to donate to the city budget.

The city is calling on donors to help raise \$173,000 by Dec. 15, 2009 to ensure the 2011 budget will cover the cost to maintain the

Last December, the mayor directed staff to rip out the fire pits to save \$173,000 a year by eliminating two positions from the Park and Recreation Department. The two employees monitor the 186 rings, cleaning them of ash and debris using a front loader that takes about 30 minutes per ring.

Last December, an anonymous donor gave \$259,000 to save the remaining fire rings and keep them maintained until June 2010.

If the city does not manage to raise enough money to maintain the fire pits, it promises to reimburse donors. Spokesperson Darren Pudgil said the city will reevaluate funding the fire pits once the economy rebounds.

"When the economy ultimately returns, then we will certainly take another look at it," Pudgil said.







Culinary sweethearts open shop

Sweet and Savory Café opened at 4614 Mission Blvd. to offer gourmet sandwiches with handseasoned-and-sliced meats, handwhipped mayonnaises and onsitebaked bread.

Each sandwich has its own twist, like the Cuban-style with homemade pepperoni chili relish or the spicy Asian wrap with a peanutchili crusted chicken breast.

Husband and wife ownership team, Michael and Alle Karijanian, who met in culinary school, run the café that is open for breakfast and lunch seven days a week from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

"For three days I thought about what I wanted," Michael said. "I envisioned sandwiches with specialty made spreads and flavored mayos, and we went from there. My goal is to bring sandwiches to a whole new level, and I try to let the ingredients speak for themselves."

Michael trusts that a loud enough statement will be made by the six different mayonnaises they prepare, including cranberry, horseradish gorgonzola, guacamole, teriyaki, lemon roasted garlic, or tangy buffalo wing mayo. The sauces spread across turkey, chicken, pork tenderloin, roast beef and tri-tip that employee Jack, a retired butcher of 33 years, carves up.

"We take the unprocessed meat directly from the provider and we

marinate, dry-rub, brine and then cook the meat ourselves," Michael said. "Then the meat is handcarved to order."

For the veggie lover, the café offers gourmet salads (ice-berg lettuce free), and veggie deluxe sandwiches like the portabella, roasted vegetables, or caprice with the chef's special Asiago pesto.

The couple met in a culinary class at the Art Institute of San Diego.

"The class was on baking and pastries. I really didn't care for the class, and Alle only distracted me more," Michael said.

The opening of their restaurant will come only a month before Alley is due to give birth to their first child, Grayce.

March lineup weaves vampire bygone and Beatle-esque new wave

Though teen vampire films are in vogue at the moment, they are nothing new. In 1987, the film The Lost Boys emerged as a precursor to such modern day, wide screen fare as Twilight. On March 6 at 8 p.m., members of the cast and soundtrack for the film The Lost Boys will gather at Brick by Brick for a special reunion concert and autograph session. On hand will be actors Brooke McCarter, Jamison Newlander and Chance Corbitt, as well as musician GTom Mac, who sang the movie's theme song "Cry Little Sister." The night's big draw, however, will be actor Corey Haim, best known from a series of '80's teen comedies and subsequent tabloid fame. Though *The Lost Boys* was released when most of today's club goers were toddlers, the combination of both the music and film worlds should make this night a memorable one.

It's safe to say that no other local show packs the amount of talent into a short time span as the Acoustic Alliance series, taking place at Brick By Brick on March 8 at 6 p.m. Each edition features a dozen performers onstage in groups of four, playing their best three songs, round robin style. This month's show includes such noted local singer-songwriters as Brooklyn, Laura Kuebel and John Katchur, but where the series really excels is in coaxing rock musicians out of their bands and into a rare solo spot. Highlights are sure to include Superunloader drummer Chad Farran and Transfer frontman Matt Molarius. With this many different artists in one location, though, there will be something on offer for just about every music fan.

Perhaps the only Southland blues band to feature a brother and sister frontline, Fat Man's Misery is as rock solid as their namesake geographical landmark in Zion National Park.

Based around the guitar playing of Lee Loveless and the bass playing of sibling Kathleen, the band appears on March 13 at O'Connell's, starting at 7 p.m. Specializ-



ing in classic tunes, such as Creams' "Sunshine of Your Love," and John Lee Hooker's "Boom Boom," Lee has an excellent blues voice and a laid back demeanor that belies the fury of the lead runs he seems to whip off effortlessly. While there will be few titles in the set list that aren't blues staples, there's a spark and passion in this group that elevates them above the typical bar band.

With a name like Get Back Loretta, a band might be expected to have a few Beatle-esque hooks in their songs, but this quintet surpasses expectations. The five-time San Diego Music awards winners, who perform at the 710 Beach Club on March 27 at 9 p.m., mix new wave, powerpop, rock and anything else with a surplus of melody and energy, molding it into a sound uniquely their own. While the music biz may be in the doldrums, Get Back Loretta is one of the few groups that has seen a major upswing in its fortunes over the past few years. Perennially on tour, they have built a solid fan base outside of San Diego, while keeping their crown as one of the most exciting combos the city has produced in the new millennium.

Music fans looking for something a little off the beaten path should investigate Flamenco night at the Turquoise Bar Europa, held each Tuesday evening in March. With it's European stylings and menu selections, this restaurant is the perfect venue for the signature sound of Spain. On hand each week are dancers Juan Carlos and Mishelle as well as guitarist El Cana and assorted side musicians, creating a festive and lively dining experience. With its fluid mix rhythmic acoustic guitar, costumes and rapid dance steps, this Flamenco show livens up the dining experience, making a night out at the Turquoise the next best thing to a flight to Europe.



Finding a Balanced Camp: Technology and the Outdoors

One concern of parents sending children to computer-based camps is how active the experience will be. Will the whole day be spent in front of the computer?
