Discover PB mulls maintenance district fees to pay for security, trash

Business property owners in parts of Pacific Beach could end up paying for cleaner sidewalks and repaired streets in Pacific Beach.

Community leaders propose that property owners of Pacific Beach businesses join together and charge themselves a fee that would pay for services such as more frequent trash collection, cleaner sidewalks, street improvements and offduty police officers patrolling along Garnet Avenue and Mission Boulevard, said Benjamin Nicholls, executive director of Discover Pacific


Discover Pacific Beach represents approximately 1,300 Pacific Beach businesses, mostly Garnet Avenue and Mission Boulevard.

"If you drop some gum on the sidewalk it would stay there forever," Nicholls said "Pressure washing of the sidewalks, nobody does that. This would provide for that sort of service."

Nicholls said he wants to get the program on a ballot in July for voting members of the Business Improvement District to decide. Each of the business owners and property owners participate on a voluntary basis, he said.

Nicholls said fees collected from the business-

DA releases man mistaken for PB shooter

An attempted murder charge involving a shooting in Pacific Beach has been dismissed against a young man after his attorney was able to persuade the District Attorney's Office it was prosecuting the wrong person because of misidentification of the defendant by a store's security camera.

The charge against David Minuk Park, 24, of Scripps Ranch, was dismissed "in furtherance of justice" by San Diego Superior Court Judge Jeff Fraser in a motion by Deputy District Attorney Makenzie Harvey on Jan. 7.

She said another person will be charged in the Sept. 23 incident that

"We pretty much convinced (the DA's office) he was innocent," said Park's attorney, Bill Nimmo.

Park had been in county jail since his arrest a few days after the incident, but the prosecutor agreed to let him out on his own recognizance about 10 days before Christmas while authorities reviewed the case.

Nimmo said the prosecution had a videotape from a store's security camera that they believed resembled Park, but he was able to show "it's clearly not the same person.

"I didn't think it was my client, so I be revealed upon arraignment. took photos of the face from the same left a man shot in both legs in front of angle as the store security camera. The

The DA's office also studied Park's cell phone records at the time of the shooting and afterward, and Park was making calls in North County. Nimmo said his client was in the Del Mar Heights area and made calls from his car. He was not in Pacific Beach or Mission Beach at the time.

So who did shoot Eric Joseph, 25, who also sustained a third gunshot wound besides being shot in both legs? "We have filed against someone

else," she said.

Angela Schuetz and her husband were watching the end of the president's State of the Union address inside their Mount Soledad home Monday when they were startled by the sound of gushing water.

"We heard all the rushing water," Schuetz said. "I ran to the back and saw our shed had moved, and there was gushing water.'

She said they also had an old chicken coop — empty from a previous raccoon attack — that had moved down the hillside. Several neighbors' yards were also affected by the slide.

Fire department and city personnel evacuated Schuetz and her neighbors around 8 p.m. at the 7700 block of Sierra Del Mar, along with residents on the 1700 block of Soledad Avenue, but SchUetz's husband refused to

"We knew our house would be okay," Schuetz said. She left anyway, going to a friend's house. while her husband stayed, she said. But Schuetz shares the edge of her backyard with her neighbors, who may not have fared as well.

The slide, at the 7700 block of Sierra Del Mar, where the Schuetz residence is located, shares property lines with homes on the 1700 block of Soledad Avenue. But some residents on Soledad Avenue said they were "reluctant to talk" about the incident.

What I understand was that the initial reports said that it was the pipes from the homeowner's backyard," said Arian Collins,

spokesman for the City of San located the shut-off valve for their Diego Water Department.

And according to a statement released Tuesday, Jan. 29 by Mayor Jerry Sanders' office, the city's water and storm drain systems were not the cause of Monday's slide.

"This was not a landslide and is unrelated to the ancient landslide site on Soledad Mountain Road that reactivated last October," the press release states. It refers to the slide as a "debris flow."

The mayor's office said soil in the area was saturated from heavy rains. Eventually, mud slid down the hill, encroaching in others' yards, breaking sprinklers and spraying water. When the fire department arrived, IT shut the water down until homeowners

sprinklers. There was minimal damage done to homes, save the mess from the mud.

"It's always possible that something will change once someone begins the investigation," Collins said.

The Oct. 3 landslide on the other side of Mount Soledad resulted in property loss and, according to attorneys representing the homeowners, loss of home value. While that landslide occurred on city property, this slide, officials said, is on private property. Homeowners affected by the October landslide are suing the city because of a series of events they say caused the slide, including water main and other

Officer fires at PB man pointing gun, 2 arrested

Two Pacific Beach residents are in jail on weapons charges following an officer-involved shooting on the 1700 block of Grand Avenue Sunday, Jan. 27, at approximately 10:30 p.m.

According to San Diego Police Department (SDPD) Lt. Kevin Rooney, Northern Division Sgt. Paul Phillips, a 16-year veteran with SDPD, was driving eastbound on Grand Avenue when he heard gunshots coming from the north side of the street. Phillips spotted Douglas Satterfield, 31, pass something to James Baich-

"There is no evidence that there was anything in particular they were shooting at," Rooney said. "We're still trying to determine if anything was damaged by the gunshots.'

Phillips exited his car, he saw Baichtal point the gun down the street. Phillips ordered Baichtal to drop the gun, and Baichtal spun around and pointed the gun at Phillips, who fired one shot at Baichtal dropped the gun.

While Baichtal was being

arrested, Satterfield left the Thomas with the help of the staff scene. A Canine Unit officer searching the area found Satterfield hiding under a bush on the 1800 block of Grand Avenue two hours later at approximately 12:30 a.m.

Baichtal was arrested for assault with a deadly weapon on a peace officer and possession of a loaded firearm. Satterfield was arrested for reckless discharge of a firearm and possession of a loaded firearm.



Flying Leatherneck Museum wants to take off at MCAS

Looking at our neighbor to the east, Marine Corps Air Station Miramar (MCAS), what comes to mind? "The few, the brave, the proud, the Marines" may be your answer. The sound of freedom might be your choice as you hear and watch F-18s soar through the sky or do touch-and-go take-offs and landings. Finally, the word gratitude may roll off your lips, directed to those who serve us in the military, whether you embrace the Iraq mission or rail against it.

Recently this writer made her way over to the Flying Leatherneck Aviation Museum, located just north of the North Gate at MCAS on Miramar Road. I was greeted by two former Marines, museum volunteers, one who served during World War II and one who had seen duty more recently. The first Marine joked about how his generation could possibly have won the Second World War because "we weren't as smart as these kids today. You can't believe how smart and welltrained they are."

The younger of the two volunteers told me that he loved his volunteer work in the temporary quarters of the museum, the only official Marine Corps aviation museum in the western United States, according to Col. Chris O'Connor, commanding officer at Miramar. The Marines are hoping to raise funds to build a beautiful, permanent museum or exhibit hall.

"We meet people from all over the country and we hear their stories," the volunteer said. "Volunteering here is a most interesting joh."

The museum displays World War II, Korean War and Vietnam War vintage aircraft outside the temporary facilities. MCAS Miramar is home to the 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing, the Aviation Combat Element of the 1st Marine Expeditionary Force. According to the San Diego Union-Tribune, at least 200 service members left Miramar Marine Corps Air Station last Saturday, Jan. 19, to join Marines and sailors on a combat tour as part of a major series of deployments to Iraq for troops based in San Diego County. In the coming weeks, about 11,000 members of the 1st Marine Expeditionary Force will head to Anbar in Iraq. Most of them are stationed at Miramar or Camp Pendleton.

In honor of those who serve us

as Marine aviators today and for an understanding of the interesting history of Marine aviation, it would be worth the drive on Miramar Road to visit this museum. Various military aircraft are on display, including the F4U (Corsair) used by aviators in World War II, as well as an F/A-18A, with about 30 aircraft on display at any time.

The museum has the most complete exhibit of the history of women in the Marine Corps from 1918 to the present. In July 1993, 2nd Lt. Sarah Deal became the first female Marine selected for Naval aviation training. She received her wings on April 21, 1995 and served as a CH-53E helicopter pilot.

The first USMC pilots, Alfred Cunningham and Roy Gieger, began their aviation career in 1912. They flew anti-submarine patrols and front-line bombing missions


Three famous Marine aviators include John Glenn, an American astronaut who was a fighter pilot with the Marines. He piloted F4U Corsair planes and flew 59 combat missions in World War II.

Ted Williams, baseball's best, served as a Marine pilot during World War II and the Korean War, where he recorded 38 combat missions.

Jerry Coleman, once the voice of the Padres, signed with the New York Yankees in 1942, but he postponed his baseball career and joined the Marines as a Naval aviation cadet. He flew 51 combat missions at Guadalcanal, Solomon Islands and the Philippines. In 1952, Coleman was recalled to active duty for combat service in the Korean War. He flew 63 close air support and interdiction strike missions. He remained in the Marine reserves until 1964, when he retired.

Since 2012 will mark the 100th birthday of Marine aviation, it would be great to have the new museum ready to open. In the meantime, the temporary headquarters provide an opportunity to relive the history of Marine aviation. A gift shop gives you a chance to pick up souvenirs and Marine mementos. Right now the public is invited to the museum Tuesday through Sunday, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., and admission is free. However, the opportunity to join the Flying Leatherneck Historical Foundation is available. The e-mail address is flhf@flyingleathernecks.org.

Faulconer needs to visit OB to gauge ban's impact



CRYSTAL PIER owned by ALIENS? I decided to devote the January issue of the Pacific Historical Society newsletter to the storms that, 25 years ago, destroyed one third of Crystal Pier. I used the Optical Character Reader (OCR) on my computer to scan an Evening Tribune article by Preston Turegano about the event. What could go wrong? If OCR makes a mistake, spell check will pick it up. Or not. Which is how the newsletter attributed ownership of Crystal Pier to the Willis M. Alien family. If you'd like a copy, contact me at one of the numbers below.

Artistic Licenses: I spotted "OOHWAH" going north on I-15. Couldn't decide if it was a '50s music fan or Elmer Fudd's version of the Marine Corps shout. "HAFMIND" was driving pretty well under the circumstances. The car stopped for the red light ahead of me.

25 Years Ago: One of the strongest storms ever to hit Crystal Pier damaged the 725-foot pier on the morning of Jan. 27, 1983. A 150-foot section at the end of the structure fell into the sea. High tides and storm surf had been anticipated and police had closed the pier to the public.

es would provide for daily trash pickup along Garnet Avenue and Mission Boulevard in Pacific Beach. Though the city provides for some of the services, it's not enough, he said.

He said many other communities such as Little Italy and downtown San Diego have benefited from creating such Maintenance Assessment Districts (MAD).

Funds from the MAD would also pay for two pairs of off-duty police officers to patrol Garnet Avenue Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights. The officers would deal specifically with security, working at the bars along Garnet Avenue. Additional security would patrol the boardwalk more fees are the best way to to deal with graffiti and other criminal activity along with homeless issues, he said.

The program also sets aside funds for minor sidewalk repair and other improvements, he said.

The entire program would have a budget of about \$470,000, Nicholls said. Property owners would pay into the program based on how much service the

he said.

For example, a bar on Garnett Avenue that benefits from trash pickup service and security services would pay more into the program than a small business on Mission Boulevard that benefits only from trash pickup ser-

Tom Frost, owner-operator of Beach Cottages, 4255 Ocean Blvd., said he thinks the Maintenance Assessment District would benefit the area greatly.

"This program helps fill in where the city leaves off and the police department leaves off," he said.

Frost said a clean area with more police would help tourists feel safer.

Others, however, don't think handle the problems.

Richard Peña, general manager of Plum Crazy Saloon, 1060 Garnet Ave., said the business he helps run already pressure-washes the sidewalk. He added that businesses shouldn't have to pay for that service if they already do it on their own.

"I think certain things should businesses and that shouldn't

businesses in the area receive, have to be dependent on the city or whoever," ĥe said.

Jeff Kinney, owner of PB Surf Club Surf Shop, 952 Garnet Ave., said he was not aware about the proposed program. He said he thinks the idea is terrible because fees levied on property owners would just get passed down to renters, resulting in higher prices for consumers.

Kinney said he plays zero role in the Business Improvement District adding that the fees he already pays into the district now should pay for a lot of the services in the proposed program.

"I'm all for a cleaner and better PB. but before we put our hands out for more money, why don't we look to make sure we're being as efficient as possible with money we already have," he said.

Created in 1997, Discover Pacific Beach represents the Pacific Beach Business Improvement District. The district uses funds to install street lighting, promote BeachFest and other outdoor festivals and remove graffiti.

Giants feel confident against perfect Pats

In a Week 12 home game in November, the New York Giants were at their lowest point after a 41-17 thumping by the Minnesota Vikings. Early in the fourth quarter, Eli Manning sat on the ground looking up, bewildered by yet another interception returned for a touchdown. were hard on Manning and the Manning said. "I never saw a locker room so upbeat after a loss, because we played so well, did some good things and hung in there in a game where we didn't have to play. We wanted to. We wanted to come out and play well, and we did that."

> The New England game was a confidence builder. It was a booster shot that propelled the Giants to three straight road wins during the NFC playoffs. Manning hasn't thrown an interception throughout the postseason after getting picked off 20 times prior.





Tiger reigns again at a wet Buick Invitational

Tiger Woods added to his golf legend with a dominating performance during his fourth consecutive Buick Invitational victory at La Jolla's Torrey Pines Golf Course Saturday, Jan 27.

Woods has won five of the last six PGA tournaments at Torrey Pines and six since 1999, even while the course has been significantly remodeled to be more difficult.

Woods led all four days of the tournament while shooting a 67, 65, 66 and 71 for an 8-shot margin over Ryuji Imada, Rory Sabbatini and Stewart Cink.

"Even though I didn't drive the ball particularly well this week, I still was able to do what I was able to do, which was nice," Woods said.

What he did do was shoot 19 under par. At one point he was 21 under. But late Sunday the weather affected everyone's game while the wind was gusting around 25 miles per hour and it finally began to rain again.

Only seven players finished the final round under par. Woods 71 was his first above the 60s in 14 rounds of tournament play.

"It wasn't easy today. It was breezy and cold," Woods added. "The wind changed a lot — it was impossible to get close sometimes.'

Woods hit less than half of the fairways in his first event of the season, but his short-game and putting was spectacular. Huge putts found the cup for Woods while other players reading of the greens were less perfect. On the 11th, Woods looped a putt over 60 feet, curling 30 feet off-line and finding its way into the back of the cup.

racy but No. 1 in putts per round and birdies.

The victory was the 62nd in Woods 11 years on-tour, tied with the great Arnold Palmer at No. 4 on the career PGA victories list. But he has accomplished the feat in less than half the time than the other champions on the list, Ben Hogan, Jack Nicklaus and Sam Sneed.
