## With booze ban in place, PBTC eyes smoke shops

Police say the beach alcohol ban is making the beaches safer and cleaner. Now some residents are saying it's time for the smoke shops to go.

At its Feb. 12 meeting at the Earl & Birdie Taylor Library, the Pacific Beach Town Council (PBTC) also discussed how the Beach Area Community Court (BACC) is helping to reduce crime.

Incoming Northern Division Capt. Shelly Zimmerman of the San Diego Police Department (SDPD) said that feedback to the recently implemented beach alcohol ban has been positive.

Sgt. Darrell Esparza of the San Diego Lifeguard Service also said he has noticed "an immediate, positive result."

Town council members agreed that the ban is improving the quality of life in the beach communities.

"The beach had become the

place to drink," PBTC Director Joe Wilding said.

"The beaches are cleaner," said treasurer Mike Stevens.

"The test will be in the summer," PBTC Vice President Rose Galliher said.

Other town council members said they can walk the boardwalk without being accosted by the homeless population that regularly loiter there.

"The regulars aren't so regular anymore," Zimmerman said.

SDPD Officer Alan Alvarez said approximately 11 tickets have been written for alcohol-related offenses since the ban took effect.

Though the majority of tickets were written in the 92109 zip code, Zimmerman said the amount of citations is so small that the number is not statistically significant.

"We don't have the resources to go up to everyone with a red

## Committee lays down the rules for upcoming PB events

The Pacific Beach Special Events Committee (PBSEC) wants to make sure that the organizers behind Stay Classy's proposed party at PB Bar & Grill keep Garnet Avenue — well — classy.

Representatives from Stay Classy presented the group's plans for an environmentally themed live music jam Saturday, April 19. The event would require fencing off a parking lot at Bayard Street and Garnet Avenue for live music, food and happy hour drink specials from 1 to 9 p.m.

The discussion sparked constructive debate among the committee over loud music, foot traffic, security, litter and the negative impacts associated with events that attract large crowds.

Last year's event was dubbed the Charity Crawl, a pub crawl spread out between seven bars and venues along Garnet Avenue with two stages for live music. This year's planned event has been pared down to PB Bar & Grill with one live-music stage in the adjacent parking lot.

Some community members raised concern, however, that large-scale events, which include and promote the sale of alcohol, send the wrong message about Pacific Beach.

"We just need not to have this image of where you come to Pacific Beach to get wasted. We want to put a lid on that and showcase the better parts of the community," said Pacific Beach Special Events Committee member Marcie Beckett.

Beckett said that last year's Stay Classy event resulted in a lot of people walking around intoxicated in the street and surrounding neighborhood.

"It's a bad image for Pacific Beach," she said.

To address those and other concerns, Scot Chisholm, executive director of the Stay Classy Foundation, said the organization scaled down this year's event by containing it to one location and by increasing staff for added security.

Although alcohol would be sold there, Chisholm said the event isn't about drinking.

"This event is not focused around drinking, the event is focused around music, culture and the environmental initiatives that Stay Classy is executing throughout the year," he said.

He added that last year's event attracted about 2,000 people throughout the day and raised about \$11,000 for charitable causes.

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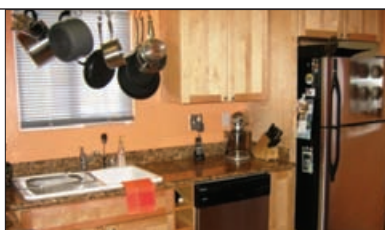
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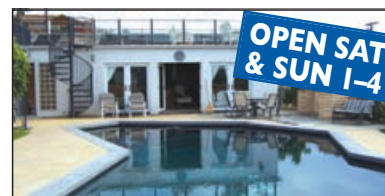

Police arrest suspect  
in Morena slaying

The San Diego Police Department Homicide Unit arrested a suspect in the stabbing death of a man discovered in the San Diego River bed Friday, Feb. 22. That evening, police received a

call at 8:15 p.m. reporting a man had been stabbed multiple times. Officers and paramedics located the victim, 44-year-old Jimmy Provencio, beneath the Morena Boulevard bridge and began CPR, but Provencio died at the scene.

After identifying the stabbing suspect Saturday, Feb. 23, Marvin Abramson, 47, turned himself in to law enforcement agents in El Cajon the following morning.

Homicide detectives are continuing with the investigation.

Though this year's event would be in one place, community members at the meeting said last year's live music could be heard blocks away, which bothered some neighbors.

The concert-style event promises to feature about eight to 10 bands this year, Chisholm said.

To prevent overly loud music, Steven Hubbard, a manager of PB Bar & Grill, said event coordinators would use decibel meters to measure the volume and adjust accordingly.

Along with possibly placing extra portable restrooms near the restaurant, the foundation would also be busing people in from downtown and near Mission Bay to reduce the impact of hundreds of people walking and driving through community, he said.

He said the community's concerns about public intoxication are

warranted and that the restaurant is required to pay for extra police security as part of the permit. He said security would be in close contact with the police department. He also added that most people who attend the events act responsibly.

"A Stay Classy charity event isn't a bunch of punks or vagrants running around. These are people interested in charity and helping people out, as well as good music," Hubbard said.

He said PB Bar & Grill and Stay Classy would work with the community and the city to reduce the volume of music and add extra recycle bins and trash containers near the event.

Pacific Beach Town Council President Ruby Houck suggested organizers provide an extra dumpster at the event.

Though not enough Pacific Beach Special Events Committee members were present at last week's meeting to make an official recommendation to the city, they

suggested that Chisholm and other representatives return next month with more information on plans to reduce the negative impact on the community.

Stay Classy representatives said they plan to meet with City Council members as they complete the application process for the permit.

The committee was also scheduled to hear a proposal for a Brazilian-themed event slated for Sept. 7. However, that group failed to show up for last week's meeting.

The PBSEC meets every third Tuesday of the month at 6 p.m. at the Discover Pacific Beach offices, 1503 Garnet Ave. The committee acts as an advisory committee to the City Council and recommends approval or denial of applications for special events in Pacific Beach.

Discover Pacific Beach represents about 1,200 businesses in the Pacific Beach Business Improvement District and showcases several community events a year, including restaurant walks, charity beach runs and BeachFest.

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# Security camera program expands to LJ

In June 2007, the San Diego Police Department (SDPD) began a nine-month project in the Belmont Park area of Mission Beach, installing a five-camera security system at a cost of \$107,000 after four University of San Diego students were brutally attacked in a nearby condo.

Now a La Jolla committee recently voted to install a similar set-up at a nearby beach and park.

Lt. Brian Ahern with SDPD's Northern Division, spearheaded the Mission Beach effort, which consists of mounted cameras on area light poles. An injured or "light duty" officer monitors the feed from a nearby city facility, Ahern said.

Because the cameras are "monitored by a peace officer, they can recognize illegal behaviors and deploy an on-duty resource," Ahern said.

To date, Ahern calls the cameras "very effective," although the department only collected some data, comparing the area around the Belmont Park cameras to the rest of Mission Beach, and officers used a six-month period from June 2007 through January 2008, comparing the data with the same time frame from the previous year. According to Ahern, total crime in Mission Beach is down 13 percent.

Near the cameras, reported crime is down 20 percent, and calls for service went down 15 percent. While these figures aren't conclusive, Ahern said he's just happy crime didn't increase near the cameras.

The SDPD wants to use the camera technology to seek people violating the law, Ahern said.

"We want to recognize a crime in progress and we want to apprehend that offender," he said.

Members of the La Jolla Shores Association (LJSA) recently voted to install cameras at La Jolla Shores' Kellogg Park. La Jolla board members proposed something similar to the Mission Beach

project, saying La Jolla receives more people per square foot than any other place in San Diego — between 20,000 to 50,000 people visit the area during summer months and 2 million to 3 million a year, said Mary Coakley, La Jolla Shores Association board member.

A number of car break-ins and auto thefts have been reported in the area, and various other criminal acts have LJSA board members asking for a solution.

"There have been incidents in the area," Coakley said. "A [La Jolla] Beach and Tennis Club employee was assaulted at the restroom."

On an adjacent street, a couple was robbed at gunpoint, and there were robberies of businesses, she said. But the cameras won't cover that area. The board is also concerned with graffiti and drag racing, Coakley said.

"I think if it was the same situation, two or three years ago there would be a big push against [the cameras], but there have been so many problems it seems like the only alternative," Coakley said. "The police are so stretched they can't provide the coverage that's

needed."

"Law enforcement can rattle statistics about crime in camera areas, but they can't point to serious studies showing that cameras were responsible for the crime reduction," said Kevin Keenan, executive director with the American Civil Liberties Union, San Diego.

Keenan points to studies that show cameras move crime just outside the camera's view.

According to a report titled "Under the Watchful Eye..." issued by ACLU affiliates that cite several studies, including one from 2002 by the British Home Office, known for its proliferation of cameras, the authors found a reduction of car crime in parking garages but not in violent crime. In another British study, some crime increased while some decreased, the report said.

In La Jolla, tourists and locals converge, forming one of the most popular beach parks in California.

"What you're seeing in this case is that instead of going after crime they know exists, they want to do preventative policing and go after

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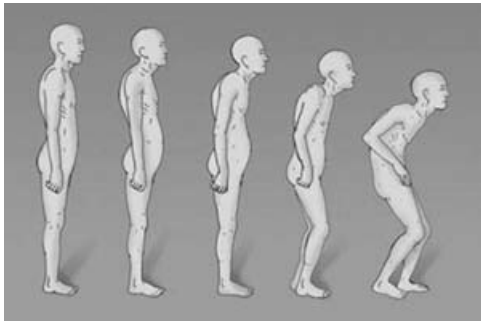
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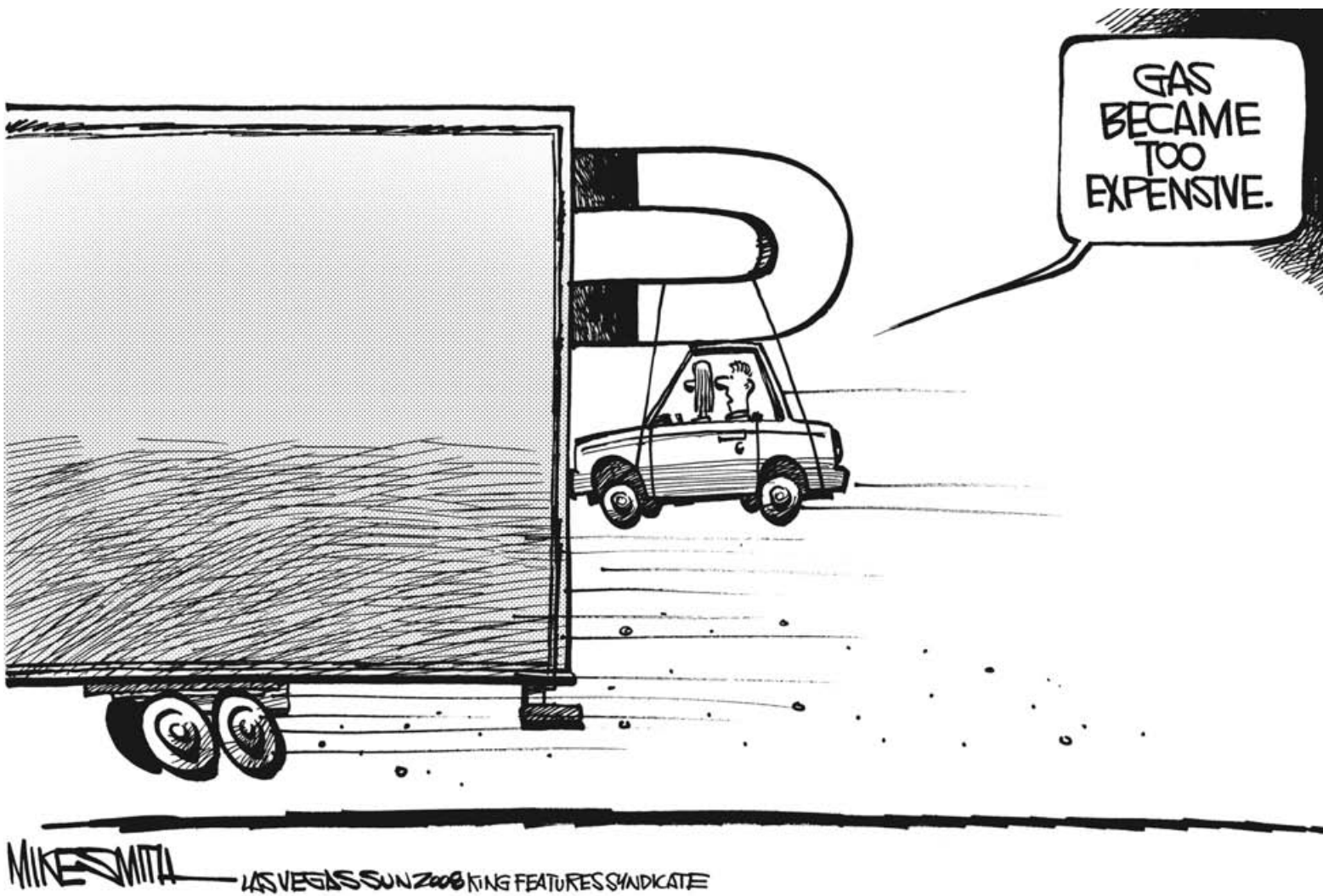

**100 Years Ago:** "A party was given at Hotel Balboa Friday evening in honor of Mr. and Mrs. O. C. Foster of Nome, Alaska," reported the San Diego Union. "There were old-fashioned dances and songs in the ballroom, and duplicate whist entertained a number of the guests in the card room." The controversy over the loose railroad ties on Grand Avenue continued. Both the City Street Committee and the City Engineer were supposed to submit reports to the Common Council.

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## Cities join forces to deal with looming water crisis

The mayors of some of the largest cities in California, including San Diego Mayor Jerry Sanders, met in Sacramento this month to work toward a statewide voter-approved water bond that would secure water for San Diego and other cities in the future. The meeting marks Sanders' latest efforts to improve the city's water-system infrastructure.

As part of his effort, Sanders also secured a \$150 million loan from financing firm J.P. Morgan to improve the city's water pipes, pumps and other infrastructure, said Sanders' spokesman Bill Harris. Sanders made the deal in advance of the city's expected return to the public bond market later this year, Harris said. The City Council secured the loan Tuesday, Feb. 19 at a rate of 3.3 percent over 12 months, according to city documents.

Meanwhile, the mayoral summit at the capitol on Feb. 13 brought together mayors from across the state to set guidelines for the creation of a water bond beneficial to all California cities. Recent events, including a 2007 federal court decision that city officials say could reduce the water supply to San Diego by 12 percent or more, spurred the cities' leaders to act in advance of impending future shortages.

"[The meeting] was a continuation of Mayor Sanders' effort to coordinate cities and their support for a statewide water bond," Harris said. "[Sanders] didn't want it to be a [Southern California-versus-Northern California] issue."

plan for the San Joaquin-Sacramento River Delta, as well as a plan to better transport and store water in the future, Harris said.

So far, a monetary range has not been established regarding the potential bond issue.

With mayors and mayoral representatives from cities such as San Jose, Fresno, Los Angeles and Oakland in attendance, the meeting builds on a previous meeting Sanders helped organize in January, according to a statement from Sanders' office.

Tim Barnett, a climate expert with the Scripps Institution of Oceanography, joined the mayors in Sacramento and talked about problems with getting water from the Colorado River.

"In the future there is going to be less water in the [Colorado] River and somebody who's getting it now is not going to get it," Barnett said.

Barnett said current estimates predict 10 to 30 percent less water coming from the Colorado River because of current drought conditions, along with the overuse of the river water and climate changes linked to greenhouse gasses.

Barnett said there could be pressure on farmers to use less water

so that it could go to cities. Barnett said combined efforts of conservation and using recycled water will help deal with looming shortages.

"It took all of us to get into this mess and it's going to take all of us to get out of it. We need some good, strong leadership, I think," he said.

Barnett said he was glad to see that the mayors were deeply concerned about the problem and pointed to other cities like Las Vegas as examples of efficient water recycling programs. Las Vegas recycles as much as 70 percent of its wastewater, Barnett said.

The city's Water Department is currently studying a water reuse plan more expansive than the "purple-pipe" system that currently reuses treated wastewater primarily for landscape irrigation, according to city officials.

The City Council voted in December to overturn Sanders' veto of the so-called "toilet-to-tap" program and directed the city's Water Department to explore the costs associated with implementing such a program.

The council gave the Water Department three months to study the issue and present the information to councilmembers.

No date, however, has been set for the City Council to hear the results of the study, according to city documents.

Meanwhile, the \$150 million loan from J.P. Morgan will finance additional upgrades for aging pipes, pump stations and bolstering security measures.

The city would pay the money back in about 12 months. By then, according to Harris, the city should be back in the public bond market.

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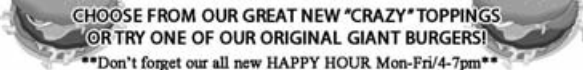

people they think are going to commit lower-level offenses," Keenan said. "They'll be able to target folks who have their beer or wine or a cigarette and think they're getting out the bad influence."

The best way to keep a neighborhood safe is to increase the police presence, Keenan said.

"Whenever new technology is being implemented, we like to ask 'what is the goal?'" said Melissa Ngo, senior counsel and director of the Identification and Surveillance Project, established in Washington, D.C., in 1994 with the goal of informing the public about civil liberties and the First Amendment.

Like the ACLU, Ngo said studies show that cameras do not reduce crime. Both Keenan and Ngo said the police do not catch people in the act of committing a crime. The main argument the police have, Keenan said, is they can prosecute an offender after the fact. But better lighting has been shown to prevent car crimes more than cameras, he said.

Keenan said the ACLU believes the SDPD would be much better off if it invested in its police and not in the surveillance system.

"It's certainly not cheap to hire police officers, but it provides real security as opposed to a false sense of security like the cameras," Keenan said.

The Shores Association tried unsuccessfully to employ a park ranger before voting on the camera surveillance system, Coakley said. Both Coakley and Ahern said crowd control is another major issue for Kellogg Park.

"I don't think it's for crowd control," Ngo said. "I think it's a way to identify everyone. We've experi-

enced this during protests. They can zoom in on protesters. That's one way in which crowd control can be used."

And many local beaches, including La Jolla, have people that continue to drink although San Diego imposed an alcohol ban, Ahern said. Kellogg Park at La Jolla Shores is an alcohol-free area, he said.

"But people continue to drink there," Ahern said. "Significant crowds go to that park, and cameras will assist with preventing or being proactive in potential problems."

Once you think cameras are a way to fight crime, Keenan said, law enforcement is going to creep in. The ACLU is concerned about the slow, steady march toward a surveillance society, he said.

But according to Ahern, the LJSA requested the police department's help. The board asked the police for assistance and would like a police officer to monitor their camera feeds, Ahern said.

"This is another grassroots project developing at their request," he said. "Everybody has the right to install a security camera at their home or community. What everybody needs to understand is that this is a project being initiated by the community."

Keenan agreed that the Constitution is fuzzy regarding privacy and a person's expectation of privacy, but he said that once a person walks outside the front door there are no laws to protect them.

But, he said, most people don't believe that they've given up their rights to be ogled by a camera monitor once they are in public.

"Usually there's no policy or no good policy for monitoring how the cameras are used and how the images are used afterwards," he said.

"It's always interesting when people say that new technology makes it easy to violate privacy," Ngo said. "Do you really want your [time at the] beach broadcast and played back?"

Ngo said she wonders what officials in La Jolla and San Diego are trying to protect the citizens from.

"When people say 'I have nothing to hide' it's just about you going through your daily life not being considered a suspect," Ngo said. "If you knew there was a camera watching you, would you really walk into the fertility clinic ... it is as if you are constantly under scrutiny and they're waiting for you to do something wrong."

The SDPD could expand the program citywide, monitoring citizens from their front doors as they move throughout the city.

Ahern and others said that eventually they want a network that can "talk to each other," meaning whoever is monitoring can bring up any camera from around the county from which to deploy resources.

"We're hoping to get our security cameras tied in to the SDPD," Coakley said. "The city would like to have them eventually throughout the city of San Diego."

"If a tsunami or wildfire occurs, then public safety officials can pull up all the cameras operating in the city, even at a water treatment facility or a camera in a [scrap] yard," Ahern said.

But the ACLU's Keenan finds this concept "creepy." Even though the law currently says a person does not have an expectation of privacy in public, he said he is confident the public will realize what is happening and demand the laws change.

"We don't think that every moment should be watched by the government," Keenan said. "It just gives them too much power."

cup," Zimmerman said. "The point is to enforce [penalties for] rowdy behavior."

Zimmerman plans to maintain current staffing levels at the beach.

Educating the public is critical, Alvarez said. Tourists especially will need to be made aware of the new rules, he said.

Education is also essential to the success of the Beach Area Community Court. The program allows persons who receive a citation for glass on the beach, public urination and other misdemeanor offenses to participate in BACC rather than the traditional court.

Offenders who opt for community court listen to a two-hour educational presentation featuring a panel of community members who share how public drunkenness and other crimes affect their quality of life. Community panelists have included police officers, residents and nurses who share how excessive alcohol use can endanger health and damage lives.

Community court participants also perform three hours of com-

munity service in the area where they received their citation. Past projects have included picking up trash, clearing Rose Creek of transients' encampments and painting rules and regulations on trash cans. The BACC has contributed \$10,620 in labor and 1,416 hours of service to the beach communities in the past year.

Deputy City Attorney Teresa Fout said that after completing the community court program, one participant said, "It made me realize that this is more than just a beach but a neighborhood." Another participant said, "I always heard about this stuff on TV, but hearing it from people that live here made much more sense."

"It's a dialogue that goes back and forth," Fout said. "It breaks down a lot of barriers."

It also has a tremendous impact on recidivism. From May 2006 to September 2007, 50 people who went through traditional court reoffended — compared to 4 BACC participants.

The BACC is seeking volunteers to serve as community panelists and community service supervisors. To get involved, call (858) 273-3303.

It will take citizen involvement

to drive the city's smoke shops out of business, said Lisa Silverman of the North City Prevention Coalition and Social Advocates for Youth (SAY).

Despite a cease and desist order from City Attorney Mike Aguirre instructing smoke shops to remove all drug paraphernalia from their stores, items associated with marijuana are still on the shelves, Silverman said.

Because the city included pictures of the very small pipes used to smoke methamphetamine in the literature they sent, shop owners removed those pipes but still sell bongos and other items used to smoke marijuana, Silverman said.

Pacific Beach has the highest concentration of smoke shops in San Diego. Teens in other parts of the city know they can purchase drug paraphernalia in Pacific Beach, said Silverman.

She urged concerned residents to contact their council representative and demand action. To contact Silverman, call (858) 414-3161.

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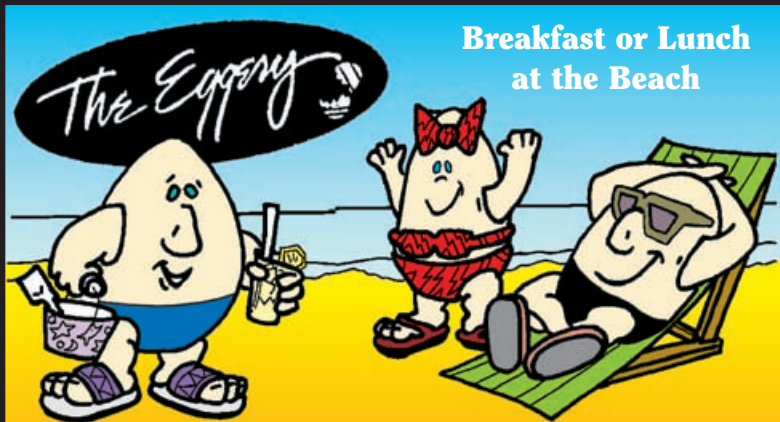
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**Pompeii casts capture daily Roman life & culture**

What were you doing the day the world ended? The earthquakes delivered plenty of advance warning, and yet you decided to hunker down at home and wait out what was coming, whatever that was. Those who remained in Pompeii, and some who attempted to escape the city, were frozen in time, and over the centuries their flesh disintegrated, leaving memorial cavities.

It wasn't just any garden-variety catastrophe that took place August 24, A.D. 79. It was the interment of a society, its artifacts and its environs. Visitors to the San Diego Natural History Museum's "A Day in Pompeii," running through June 15, can share the terror and empathize with the citizens of a once-thriving seaport south of Naples.

Visitors to the exhibit first become acquainted with Pompeii's 12,000 citizens of the Roman Empire by walking through rooms that show what they ate, worshipped and used for adornments. A small film re-imagines their magnificent homes — think the television series 'Rome,' only sunnier. A leisurely stroll through written narratives and frescoes (a free Spanish or English audio guide is included with admission price) ends in the room that contains body casts of the fatalities, whether they were covered with ash, succumbed to gas or were buried in the massive mud flow. If one didn't get you, the other would, according to Joseph Smith, curator of the exhibition.

Smith pointed out the levels of ash and mud in a room that contains plaster casts of the spaces left by those who made the wrong choice. He believes that the dog, whose cast he stands before, was chained and probably ran in circles till the rising level of ash and cinders brought him to the end of his tether. One plaster man covers his face with a kerchief, another hugs his wife and still another hunkers down in a doorway, covering his head with his arms.

That's what many did the day the world ended. All but 1,100 escaped and lived to tell the tale, including Pliny the Younger, who was visiting in nearby Misenum and who left an invaluable account

that says, "Many raised their hands to the gods, and even more believed that there were no gods any longer and that this was one unending night for the world."

Pliny's uncle, Pliny the Elder, perished in rescue efforts. He was a Roman fleet commander and vulcanologist.

The San Diego Natural History Museum is located at 1788 El Prado in Balboa Park.

Admission to "A Day in Pompeii" is not included in general museum admission. Tickets are \$22 for adults, \$19 for seniors and \$14 for children ages 3 to 12.

Tickets are timed and dated and include admission to all other exhibitions and films, including the BBC's "Pompeii: The Last Day."

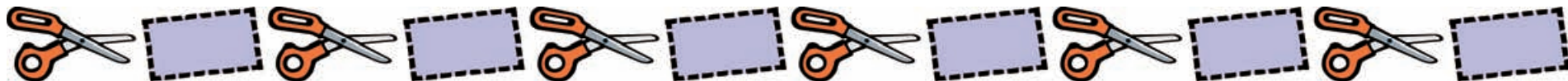

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# Pacific Coast Championship returns to LJ tennis club

The first Pacific Coast Men's Doubles Championship tournament was not held last century but the century before — in 1890, to be exact. Dwight D. Davis, for whom the Davis Cup tennis competition is named, was one of the original competitors.

also been champions."

Therefore, the players seen at this event may be some of the same people showcased in a few years on the professional tour.

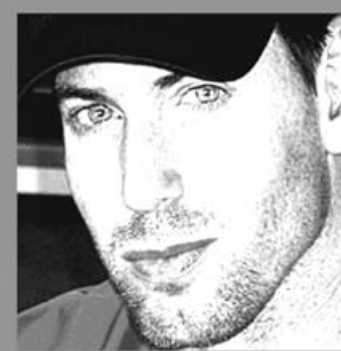
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State plans \$16 mil. retrofit for Harbor Dr. bridge

The North Harbor Drive Bridge will be retrofitted and reinforced with concrete support piles under the deck to protect it from possible future earthquake damage, according to city officials. The City Council gave its unanimous approval to move forward with the project Feb. 5.

Primarily funded through a state infrastructure program, the \$16 million project is not expected to begin until about April, said Kris Shackelford, a project manager for the city.

“We’re going to be strengthening the foundation by putting in 180, 24-inch (diameter) piles underneath,” she said. “I wouldn’t say [the bridge] is in bad condition, but if there is a major earthquake, this would help keep the bridge a lot more stable.”

Though there will be trucks delivering the material and pouring the concrete, Shackelford said the project shouldn’t interrupt traffic on North Harbor Drive because work will be mostly occurring underneath the bridge.

She said the city has been working with the Navy Submarine Base and the Corky McMillin Cos. to determine work schedules. McMillin currently has hotels under construction at Liberty Station near the northwest corner of the channel, she said.

Community planning boards were not notified of the project because the city considers the project a safety issue and not a land-use project. She added, however, that the city plans to inform surrounding community planning boards within the next months through informational presentations.

Design firm consultant TY Lin International would design the project but a contract for actual construction has not been awarded. The city plans to send the project out for bid, she said.

Details regarding the number of trucks, delivery schedule of materials and total traffic impact is unknown because the contract has not been awarded, she said.

The North Harbor Drive Bridge is the last of nine bridges in San Diego mandated by the state for

retrofit.

Others included the West Mission Bay Drive Bridge and the Voltaire Street Bridge over Nimitz Boulevard, she said.

State inspectors determined the bridges needed reinforcement after the Loma Prieta earthquake in 1989 that shook the San Francisco Bay Area and the Northridge earthquake that rocked Los Angeles County in 1994.

State inspectors evaluate the North Harbor Drive Bridge as a routine practice every two years. The last inspection of the North Harbor Drive Bridge in January 2006 found the bridge to be sound, though a report recommended the removal of some plants under the bridge, said Ed Cartagena, California Transportation Department representative.

He added that the bridge is scheduled for another routine inspection within the next few weeks.

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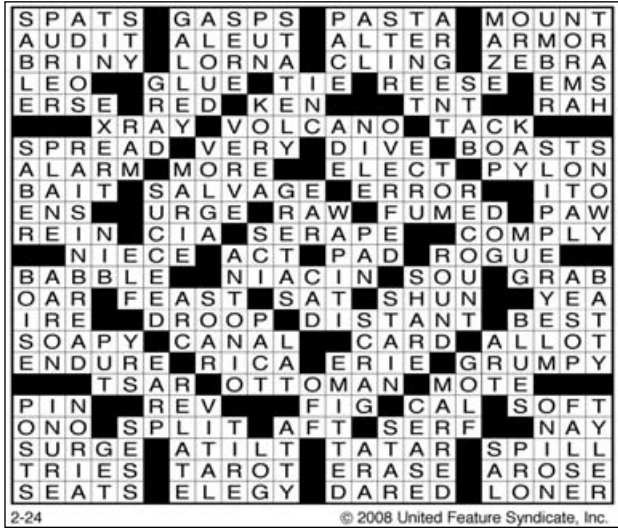

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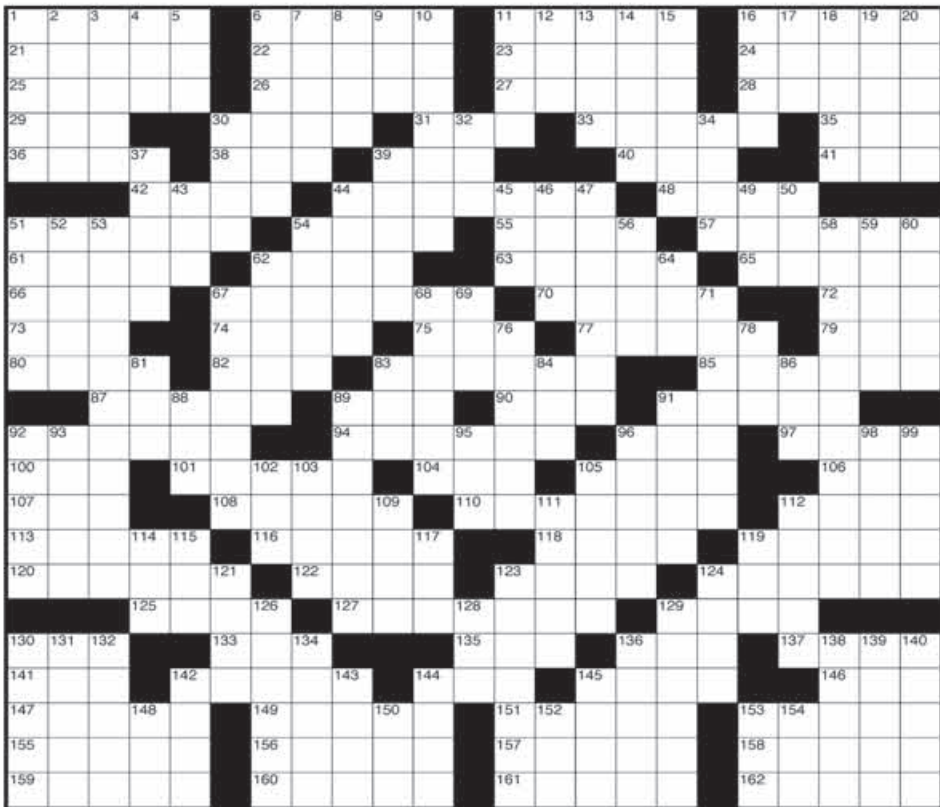
