Hit-and-run victim describes attack and long road to recovery

For Keith Taylor, the night started out with a fun, friendly Christmas party at the Tavern at the Beach on Garnet Avenue. The night ended with him lying in the street with two broken legs after an intoxicated man deliberately ran over the 30-year-old Lemon Grove man and fled the scene.

The Dec. 5 altercation started when the Tavern's staff refused entry for the drunk man. The man then approached Taylor and his friends while they stood outside on the sidewalk. Taylor told the man to stop bothering them, and the drunk man walked away.

Taylor and his friend, Steven Rempel, noticed the man getting into a silver or gray Jeep Cherokee parked on Everts Street across from the pub. When Taylor pointed the man out to Rempel, the intoxicated man turned the wheels of the Jeep, punched the gas and barreled right for them.

Despite the effort to get out of the way, the Jeep sucked Taylor underneath and smashed his legs.

Rempel punched out the rear driver side window of the silver Jeep Cherokee as the friends tumbled out of the way.

"I remember looking up. He had ran over both my legs," Taylor said, "[then] he just peeled out across my legs with the back tire,"

Rempel briefly ran after the Jeep as Taylor lay on the ground in shock.

County alerts MBHS to possible TB exposure

The San Diego County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) alerted Mission Bay High School (MBHS) officials and parents that a student was recently diagnosed with tuberculosis (TB) and may have exposed students

and staff to the disease between Feb. 4 and March 13.

According to an HHSA announcement, approximately 200 students, teachers and staff may have been exposed during that time.

"We're going to be working with the school to provide testing on campus

sometime in the next week or so in case students can't get to their own doctor," said Dr. Kathy Moser, Director of the TB program with the County Public Health Services.

"Who knows when that person got

No end in sight for De Anza mobilehome relocation dispute

A decades-old legal battle over money and land between the city and residents of De Anza Mobilehome Park continues with small steps forward but no immediate resolution in sight.

The city still wants De Anza residents to move from the park to free up the public land for public use. But representatives for the residents continue to hold out for more money, saying that the city should give them anywhere from \$48 million to \$84 million in fair market value for their homes and other relocation expenses, according to Vincent Bartolotta, an attorney representing the De Anza residents.

In the past, the city has offered residents up to \$8,000 for moving out, which the residents rejected, Bartolotta said.

"If that home is worth \$130,000, which does not include any money from the land because they don't own the land, and you're taking it away, why shouldn't they get 130,000, the fair market value, the price of their home?" Bartolotta said.

Court rulings filed in March rejected the residents' claim that the city should pay fair market value for the

The group was formed to improve parking and solve some of the ongoing issues regarding parking in Pacific Beach. Current issues being discussed include the possible installation of parking meters, the use of parking permits for residents and regulating oversized vehicles, such as motorhomes, commercial trucks and boats.

Man riding in truck bed dies after driver hits tree

A San Diego man was charged with driving under the influence and vehicular manslaughter after he lost control of his pickup truck while driving at a high rate of speed and struck a tree on the 4300 block of Lamont Street Tuesday, April 8, at 2:32 a.m.

According to police reports, Quinto Dickens, 25, was driving a Dodge Ram truck with an extended cab with six occupants, five in the cab and one lying in the bed of the truck, when he hit the tree.

According to Det. Suzi Huntington with the San Diego Police Department's Traffic Division, the man riding in the bed of the truck, which is illegal, died at the scene of his injuries, and the five people riding inside the truck were transported to a hospital with numerous injuries, including a broken femur, broken back and fractured ribs.

The County Medical Examiner's Office identified the victim as 19-year-old Nikko Maeve, a resident of San Diego.

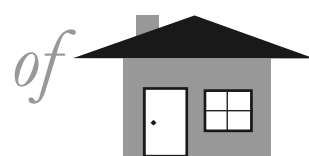
Least Tern nest site cleanup planned for Sat.

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Boat motor theft turns into high-speed chase

A man suspected of stealing a boat motor in the Crown Point area before leading police on a high-speed chase to Mount Soledad was ordered Wednesday, April 2, to stand trial on two counts of assault on two police officers for allegedly ramming their patrol car with the stolen car the suspect was driving.

William Steven Starke, 45, was also ordered to stand trial for evading police with reckless driving, receiving stolen property, auto theft and felony vandalism. San Diego Superior Court Judge Fred Maguire dismissed a grand theft charge and one count of resisting an executive officer at the end of the preliminary hearing.

Starke allegedly broke the locks and chains of an outboard motor on a boat in the Crown

Point area that was owned by the harbor police on March 15. Starke didn't realize the motor came equipped with a global positioning system that alerted Harbor Police of the theft around 1:30 a.m.

Harbor Police officers chased the thief, who refused to stop, and he allegedly rammed their patrol car deliberately on Avenida Manana in the Mount Soledad area of La Jolla. The officers weren't injured, and they identified Starke in court as the driver.

Starke didn't realize the street he was on was a cul-de-sac, and he found himself trapped in the Volkswagen Jetta, which was reportedly stolen. The Jetta had been reported stolen, with license plates allegedly stolen from another vehicle.

During the arrest, one of the officers broke his car window and cut his hand. Starke's dog, a

Rottweiler, got out of the car and allegedly charged officers, prompting two officers to shoot it. The dog died at the scene.

The grand theft charge that was dismissed involved the theft of the motor, which was described as a "bait motor" with a GPS tracking device. Deputy District Attorney Ryan Saunders said his office has not yet decided whether to refile that charge. The vandalism charge stems from the damages to the patrol car.

A trial date will be set on April 15, and Starke has pleaded not guilty to all charges. Starke had been on probation in two other cases from 2007. He was found to have violated probation, and warrants had been issued for his arrest in September 2007, according to court records.

He remains in the Vista Detention Facility in lieu of \$50,000 bail.

Aussie heads home after recovering from OB attack

A savage assault in Ocean Beach in February left Australian tourist Robert Schneider with life-threatening injuries — but has not quelled his indomitable spirit or love of travel.

The 26-year-old was released from the UC San Diego Medical Center in Hillcrest Friday evening and has returned to Adelaide after five weeks of rehabilitation in San Diego. He said, however, he is still eager to get back up on a surfboard and quench his thirst for adventure.

On Feb. 27, Schneider was brutally beaten unconscious with a skateboard and thrown into a blazing fire pit at the foot of Abbott Street in Ocean Beach. Schneider spent two weeks in a medically induced coma and had multiple skin grafts to treat 2nd- and 3rd-degree burns on his upper chest, back and stomach.

He will receive follow-up treatment at a trauma burn center in Adelaide and will be fitted with pressure garments to help with any scarring. He is healing well after reconstructive surgery on a severe skull fracture and a shattered eye socket.

Schneider and his parents, Peter and Judy, held a news conference at the hospital Thursday to express their gratitude to the doctors and nurses who saw them through their darkest hour. "He was pretty bashed up. It was horror, and I was broken," said Judy Schneider. "The surgeries they performed on him have really returned him to life for us, and we are so grateful. We know that God had no intentions to let our son die in that fire, and this is a testament to that."

Peter Schneider agreed. "Their compassion, their understanding, their love, has kept us up because there were days where we would have gone down," said Peter Schneider.

It was a team effort, according to Dr. Bruce Potenza, director of the Regional Burn Center.

"I'm hopeful that you've seen the best that our country has to offer after having lived through the worst," Potenza said.

He said Robert Schneider surpassed medical expectations and is expected to make a full recovery but that he may experience symptoms consistent with a traumatic brain injury.

"Headaches, memory loss, concentration, slight personality

changes, and over time I would expect those to improve," Potenza said.

The Schneiders praised the response from the San Diego

community.

"There were two bad people in San Diego; there's been thousands of people that have poured their hearts out to us," Peter Schneider said. "We can be standing here smiling today. Five weeks ago we were bawling our eyes out, really upset — the people of San Diego have lifted us up."

While the Schneiders are relieved by the recent arrests of two transients linked to Robert Schneider's beating — Damian Maple, 21, and Frank Montoya, 46, in Idaho and Oregon, respectively, on felony torture and mayhem charges — they said their first responsibility is to their son.

Maple, who has since been extradited to California, pleaded not guilty during an arraignment in San Diego court Monday. He is being held on \$1 million bail.

Montoya has yet to be extradited, according to prosecutors.

"They need to stand accounted for what they did to Robert; that's not acceptable," Peter Schneider

homes. The court order issued by Judge Charles R. Hayes requires the city to prepare a relocation plan in accordance with state law.

The order also requires that two "special masters," which is usually a retired judge, oversee the relocation process.

However, Bartolotta said the his firm filed a request in late March asking the court for detailed clarification of the relocation process, including an explanation of how the special masters are chosen.

"Does each side choose one (special master) or do we all get together and see who's going to do the report?" he said.

Bartolotta said the court has 15 days to respond to his request but

added that there may be delays.

The City Attorney's Office is trying to cooperate with the De Anza residents, said Deputy Attorney Mia Severson.

The city contacted the lawyers for De Anza, giving them 10 days to submit a list of candidates for special master. Severson said the city attorney's office heard no reply from Bartolotta's firm before the Friday, April 4, deadline.

"The city would like to comply with the court's order and would like to work towards a way of moving the property back to the public use in a way that's respectful to the residents and in a way that provides them reasonable mitigation that provides for relocation," Severson said.

The city had plans to close the park in November 2003 to make room for public use of the area. Since then, De Anza residents have been arguing with the city over how much the city should be required to compensate residents.

Some of residents have medical needs or are on a fixed income and may not be able to afford housing somewhere else, attorneys for De

Anza residents said.

De Anza Mobilehome Timeline

- May 1951 - The city enters into a 50-year lease starting Nov. 24, 1953 through Nov. 23, 2003.
- 1978 - The State of California enacts the Mobile Home Residency Law, which provides state-mandated benefits to residents upon closure of a mobile home park.
- 1980 - The state found De Anza Mobilehome Park was an improper use of state land and that a "phase-out" of the park was required.
- 1981 - California Legislature passes Assembly Bill 447, known as the Kapiloff Bill. The bill provided that the mobilehome park could remain in operation until Nov. 23, 2003.
- 1982 - The city passes resolution endorsing the Kapiloff Bill on the condition that the park's rental rates increase up to 20 percent during final years of park operation.
- November 2003 - The city passes a resolution exempting De Anza from the relocation benefits from the city.

said. "But, from our point of view, Robert's alive (and) he's recovering."

The case was brought to a successful resolution through the joint efforts of police, witnesses who came forward and aided by an outpouring from the community.

"In all honesty, this is probably one of the more brutal, sadistic-type crimes that I've heard, and I think that this thing just got out of hand," said Capt. Bill Edwards of the police department's Western Division.

Even before the Feb. 27 incident, recent media reports of crimes against overseas travelers left family members concerned, they said.

"Robert's been away since May last year and there was always that little niggling thing in the back of the head, 'We hope it doesn't happen to us,'" Peter Schneider said.

With the life-altering event behind him, Robert Schneider had a few parting words for the city that embraced him.

"Thank you, everyone. Thank you, San Diego," he said.

Additionally, a fundraising dinner event is planned for Sunday, April 13 from 2 to 6 p.m. at Bondi, 333 5th Ave. in the Gaslamp Quarter of downtown. Admission is \$8 and includes an Australian barbecue, a live band and a raffle for grand prizes: two tickets to Australia and a trip for two to Fiji.

"I was on the ground. I couldn't move. I couldn't do anything," he said.

Taylor's thinking fogged as he looked down at his legs. His left shin now bent at an unnatural right angle to his thigh. He instinctively tried to place his leg back to its natural position before paramedics arrived to rush him to the hospital.

Security cameras took photos of the suspect when he tried to enter the bar. Police describe him as a white male 30 to 40 years old, between 5-feet 10 inches and 6 feet tall, approximately 160 to 175 pounds. He had short, brown spiky hair and a goatee. The vehicle may have a partial license plate number "4A," police said.

Using a partial license plate, police can dig through reports and local databases containing information on anybody cited or contacted by the police within the last few years, said San Diego police Detective Garrick Nugent.

Police can also enlist the help of California Department of Motor Vehicles to gather a list of possible suspects based on vehicle information.

"[The databases] often lead to viable leads that often, in turn, lead to righteous arrests," Nugent said.

Public online databases such as the Automated Regional Justice Information System (ARJIS) can map basic crime statistics by date, location and type of crime. A user name and password, however, give authorities access to additional information.

Along with crime-busting technology like ARJIS, police also rely

on help from community to catch suspects like the man who ran over Taylor.

Taylor's case marks one of many similar incidences in Pacific Beach, and throughout the city, where a driver leaves the scene of an accident after hitting and possibly injuring someone.

The police department's traffic division reports about 17 hit-and-run injury accidents in the city and more than 5,000 reports of someone damaging property or causing a minor injury and driving away — a misdemeanor crime,

according to police.

Not including the assault on Taylor, Pacific and Mission Beach communities saw three accidents that seriously injured victims.

Some cases remain open.

Police said a female driving in a 2000 or 2002 Nissan Maxima hit and seriously injured two young women at the intersection of Cass Street and Garnet Avenue Friday, August 10, at about 10 p.m.

The driver and a female passenger fled the scene after the accident, according to police.

"We are still looking for any

information on this accident," SDPD Sgt. Jeff Fellows said, "We are continuing our investigation and would appreciate any assistance."

Because of the time and location of the incident, police said the driver might have been intoxicated. Anybody with information on the case can call Det. Suzi Huntington at (858) 495-7812.

Leaving the scene of accident that causes injury carries a felony charge for the driver. A drunk driver might take a gamble and leave the scene to avoid getting

caught, but if found, the driver can be charged with an additional felony, according to police.

"Is [leaving] better or worse? I can't say, but I can tell you that it presents a higher probability that the punishment would be much more severe," Nugent said.

Though police haven't found the man who hit Taylor or the young girls, they have caught others.

Heather Renee Lamb pleaded guilty in December to driving intoxicated and causing injury to a victim. A judge sentenced her to one year in a work furlough center for driving onto sand in Mission Beach Sunday, July 29, at about 2 a.m. and seriously injuring 19-year-old Kayla Morrales Alcala. Lamb also hit a dumpster and a parked car on the 700 Block of Ventura Place.

In another incident, an 18-year-old male failed to stop at a stop sign and collided with a vehicle at the intersection of Gresham Street and Loring Street Saturday, June 30, at about 7 p.m. The victim was hospitalized and treated for pelvis fractures, police said.

Witnesses followed the suspects fleeing on foot and alerted police to their location. The driver was charged with felony drunk driving, felony hit and run and other traffic charges, police said.

The most recent hit and run occurred Tuesday, April 1, when two men were hit by a vehicle on the 1300 block of Garnet. Witnesses described the vehicle as a newer silver Jeep Grand Cherokee driven by a male.

One victim, Salvatore Defranco, 21 sustained serious head injuries. The second victim, Damon Seamons, 24 suffered minor cuts and scrapes. Crime Stoppers is offering a \$1,000

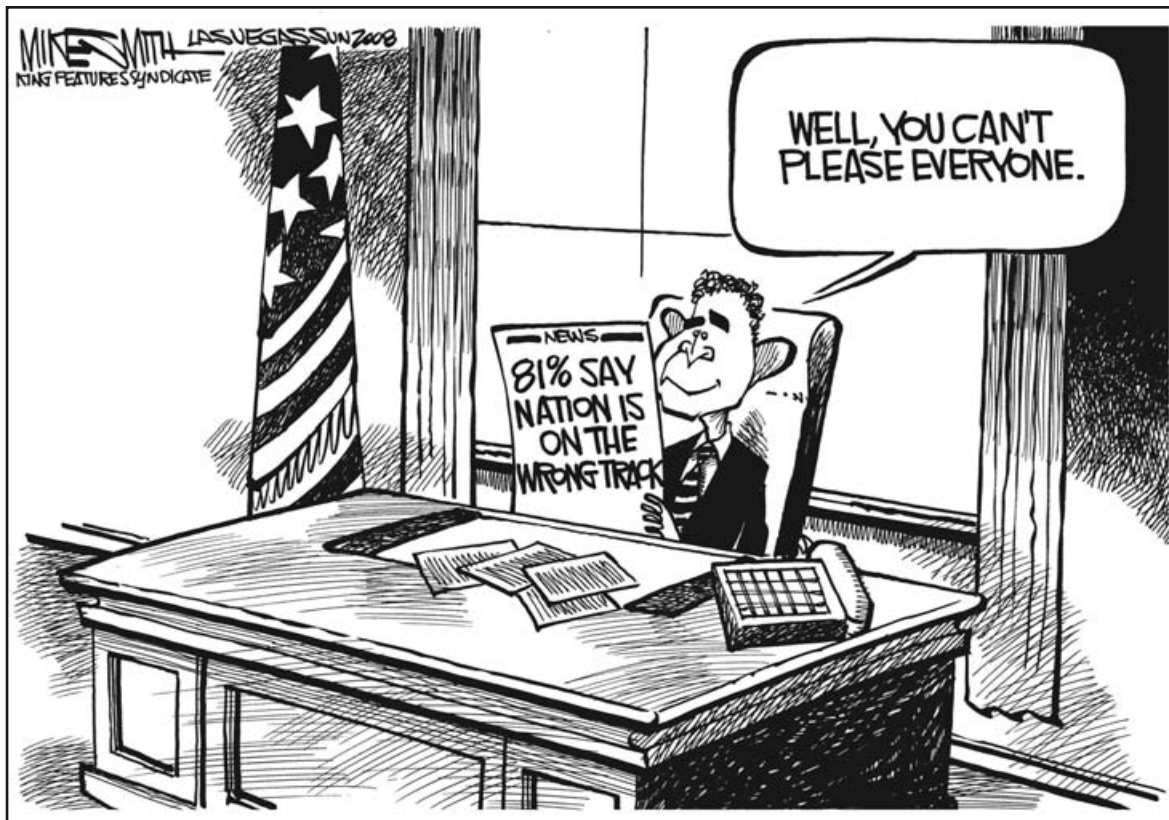
What is this if it's not an expression of political will?

Leonard 35 years ago when I moved to La Jolla. It was her love of flowers and gardening that brought us together. After admiring each other's garden she said that I had a green thumb up to my elbow. I replied that she could be "Mrs. Jolly Green Giant" because even a dried up stick would soon be in full bloom under her determined gentle care.

Her love of flowers started in high school. Little did she know that this passion would influence so much of her life. Libby was a regular at all the flower shows in San Diego and she took prize-winning photos of her favorite subject.

Libby had another passion in life, one that started in 1926 when she was just 6 years old. She loved her hometown of Boston but always looked forward to Sunday afternoon visits to her uncle's country home, where she could play with the turtles that lived in his pond.

I suppose all Bostonians are patriotic, but some put it into action. In 1942 Libby enlisted in the U.S. Coast Guard. That choice was probably motivated by her grandfather, a Bostonian sea captain whose ship regularly sailed from Boston to Nicaragua.

Libby came out to California one November, and, after seeing so many flowers blooming in winter she returned home, sold her house and moved to San Diego. She was so impressed by the colorful flowers that grew along our freeways that she decided to work with the Division of Highways. It was there that she was naturally attracted to the supervi-

sor of landscape and horticulture, Leonard Zink. They were married a year later.

Leonard had built a home in Pacific Beach and the acre lot left plenty of room for Libby to develop her two main passions. Flowers, vegetables and a few fruit trees took over all but 1,000 square feet.

That area was specifically built for turtles. This electrically heated turtle pond was divided between box turtles and water turtles. As the saying goes, "If you build it they will come."

And soon this home for injured and unwanted turtles was filled to capacity, though if necessary Libby would always find room for one more.

For years she was a member of the San Diego Turtle Society. They passed many homeless and injured turtles on to her, some needing medical attention. After

proper veterinary care they would come home to Libby's turtle infirmary. Fish tanks on shelves lined the walls of one of the bedrooms. Each tank was fitted with a heating pad to keep the turtles' temperatures up during convalescence. Leonard always said that "she was crazy over turtles all of her life."

Libby was as unassuming and tranquil as her turtles. At her request before she died on Feb. 13, 2008, all 30 of her turtles were placed in good homes. Last week a plaque of Libby and Leonard (who was a Marine in World War II) was added to the Mount Soledad Veterans Memorial in La Jolla.

infected, but for whatever reason, the TB came out of its dormancy, so the person had an active disease and got sick. So now we have the opportunity with the other people to find them when they just have the early infection so they don't get sick," she said.

The test for the disease involves injecting a protein under the skin and gauging the reaction. If the person has a large skin reaction, the person would need a chest X-ray to see if the disease has become active. Moser said treatment would require antibiotics and the disease is curable.

"Last year we had 280 newly diagnosed cases in the county,"

Moser said. "It's been running in the 280 to 300 range for many years. As far as infection, those people who may or may not know they breathed in the infection at some point, the national number is about 5 to 10 percent of the U.S. population has the dormant infection, many of whom have no idea. But 30 percent of the world's population has that infection, which is why TB is such a big deal in other countries."

Moser said the student was at a lower end of infectiousness and expects the student to be back in class within a week or two.

"The school sent letters to parents and did our best to let everyone know. It's back to normal at the school," said Jack Brandais, media spokesman with the San Diego Unified School District.

reward for information leading to the driver's arrest.

Unfortunately, many times the injuries have long-lasting consequences for victims like Taylor.

Taylor, who worked as an industrial appliance technician, is temporarily unemployed and will need to go back to the hospital for multiple surgeries throughout the year, which will cost him up to \$100,000 in medical bills. Though he has insurance, it doesn't cover some costs like the ambulance ride.

After being in a wheelchair for weeks after the accident, he could barely walk a month after the accident. Scars from surgeries still zipper across his knees. He said doctors told him his legs would "never be 100 percent" and that he might need surgery in about 10 to 15 years for knee problems.

Nugent said the case involving Taylor's attack remains inactive until new information becomes available. Anybody with information can call Nugent at (858) 552-1724.

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Currents determine whether a “mint” of sand dollars stand up or lay flat on the seafloor.

Sand dollars make sense on the seafloor

Sure, I’ve found money underwater. For instance, I nabbed a dollar bill off the Cove and pocketed another greenback off the Marine Room, but that’s chump change next to the thousands of dollars strewn across the sand off La Jolla Shores. I refer to the local sand dollar, *Dendraster excentricus*, a disk typically a couple of inches across. Likened to a silver dollar in shape and size, a living dollar is thickly covered by short, fine, mauve-colored spines that look velvety. By moving the spines together in waves (picture a field of grain slowly blown by wind), a sand dollar can, bit by bit, travel across the sand. As the dollar’s entire side plows through the sand like a shovel, it leaves a distinctive wide, shallow track.

Because no official name exists to describe a group of sand dollars (such as herd, flock, et cetera), I choose “mint.” From a distance, mints of sand dollars appear as long, dark swaths against the pale sand. Find them about 150 yards offshore at depths of about 30 to 55 feet, where, close up, individual dollars are aligned parallel to the shoreline. Their proximity to each other is critical for successful reproduction, because when eggs of some and sperm of others are released directly into the water, they need to find each other for fertilization to take place.

Currents mostly determine whether sand dollars stand up or lie down. In light current, they bury the bottom third of their disk into the sand in an oblique position and slant their exposed upper disk toward the current. When I first noticed the mint members all lean-

ing identically, I thought some divers must have had too much time on their hands. Not true. The dollars’ military formation is a good strategy, because a higher profile permits them to better capture food as it whisks by. However, it’s as fruitless for sand dollars to try standing in a strong current as it would be for us to comfortably stand in a 50-mile-an-hour wind. To resist being blown away, the dollars temporarily abandon their soldier stance and lie down, which morphs their orderly appearance into one of poker chips strewn haphazardly on a table.

Dealing with current isn’t the only challenge for sand dollars. They are easy marks for predators such as fish and sea stars. Even snails a fraction of a dollar’s size take advantage of the nearly immovable feast. One parasite, a tiny, white eulimid snail, lives exclusively on the sand dollar. Using a noselike organ, it drills through a dollar’s skeleton to reach the dollar’s soft body, and then enjoys a lifetime of nutrition. Human predators hunt sand dollars not for consumption but for curios. When dead, their patterned, white skele-

tons are in demand. Consequently, a sand dollar’s worth has risen over the years, making it the only local dollar presently increasing in value.

If a sand dollar can navigate around life’s pitfalls, it may live 10 years. Over the last month, I’ve seen millions of sand “dots” grow into “dimes” off the Shores. This healthy deposit will hopefully net a hefty return — and with interest — as ocean alchemy turns the dimes into dollars.

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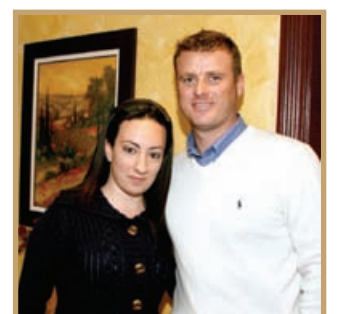
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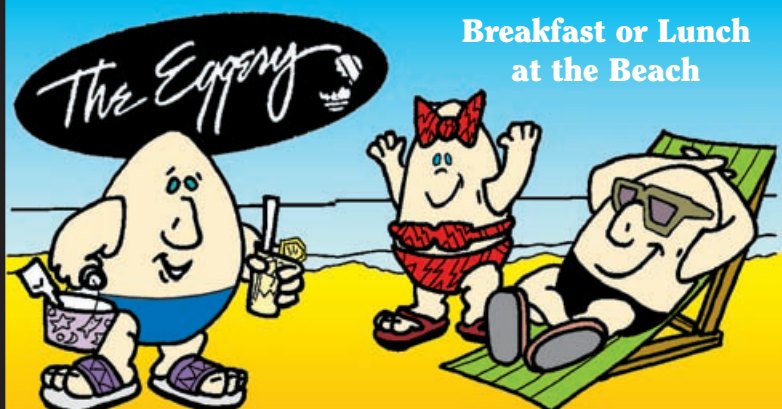

At Bustamante's, breakfast comes with tradition

Ask any PB old-timer about Garnet and he or she will tell you how much it's changed over the past few decades. The drugstore, the hardware and the department stores are all gone, but Bustamante's, the small restaurant in the middle of the 900 block between Bayard and Cass, has managed to survive Garnet's transformation from a "main street" to an entertainment district.

Margee McCormick, a Pacific Beach resident since 1968, said it's one of her favorites places to eat. She frequently walks from her home on Beryl Street to dine at the

place she calls her "nonalcoholic sports bar."

At first glance, it's a wonder how a small, unassuming restaurant that serves only breakfast and lunch has remained a staple of Pacific Beach for approximately 50 years.

Other than three name changes, little has changed since it originally opened its doors sometime in the 1960s. Even the menu remained the same over the last 20 or so years.

Some customers, like McCormick, have been coming here for a while.

"It's been here for so long, some people are gone for 20 years and they come back and find out it's still

The storefront, complete with the sun-faded sign, hasn't changed in decades, said co-owner and cook Edwardo Ramirez. He and his wife Chiko Vargas run the restaurant together seven days a week.

He cooks, she serves. It's a formula that's kept them in business since they bought the restaurant from former owner Bertha Bustamante in 1998. Vargas and Ramirez kept the name and menu because "Everybody knows Bustamante's," he said.

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World Beer Cup competition returns to SD

San Diego will host the 2008 World Beer Cup competition when the fifth annual Craft Brewers Conference returns April 16 through 19.

The conference is an industry event for brewing professionals from all over the country and will feature four days of seminars, classes on new brewing techniques and beer marketing, competitions and beer. Lots and lots of beer.

"It's the one time a year you'll be in a group of your peers that large," said Matt Walsh, head brewer at Karl Strauss Brewing Company. Walsh said both local and national breweries participate, and more than 2,500 people are expected over the course of the conference.

This will be the second time the Craft Brewers Conference is held in San Diego. It was held in San Diego in 2004, according to Walsh. It has also been held in Austin and Seattle.

"We are a national epicenter of beer," said Melody Daversa, marketing events manager for Karl Strauss.

The Craft Brewers Conference starts with a welcome reception at Stone Brewery and culminates in two main events — the San

The fifth annual beer and music fest benefits the Surfrider Foun-

ation. Last year Karl Strauss donated \$15,000 to Surfrider, and this year it is taking the message of conservation and environmental protection even further by emphasizing recycling and helping organize a large Creek to Bay Clean up day in Mission Beach Saturday, April 24.

The day of Beach to Brewery, free shuttles will run from the Earl & Birdie Taylor Library, 4275 Cass St., and Dusty Rhodes Park in Ocean Beach. Performers for the event include The Shys, Hotel St. George, Stranger, and a yet-to-be-announced headliner.

Pre-sale tickets online are \$15 or \$20 at the door. Last year the event sold out, so advance purchase is encouraged. The event is 21 years and up and includes five beer tasters and the concert. For more information on tickets and the beach cleanup visit www.karl-strauss.com.

Old Chargers, Padres and Dodgers flags drape the wall. Frames filled with photo collages of friends and regulars hang above the few tables inside. A T-shirt autographed by pop legend Donna Summer also hangs on another wall, a souvenir from her visit there two Thanksgivings ago.

A quick trip through the kitchen, past Edwardo's skillfully worked skillet, reveals a secluded outdoor patio in the back.

U. of Washington Huskies dominate Crew Classic

At the largest gathering of eight person crews in the U.S. in four years, including more than 90 teams and 3,000 athletes, the historic favorites proved their power over the waters with the University of Washington returned after a three-year absence to win the top men's and women's events.

The Huskies took home the men's Copley Cup and the women's Jessop-Whittier Cup Sunday, April 6, from the 35th annual Crew Classic on Mission Bay at Crown Point Shores. Washington's dominance has not been felt since 2002. Since then Cal, Stanford and USC have stepped into their absence from the Crew Classic. But it seemed the big dogs are back.

Yale, Harvard, Princeton, Purdue, Stanford, UCLA, USC, Notre Dame — name a great university and they probably were there.

Local crews also made impressive strides rowing against the elite crews. UCSD posted a 6-minute time against teams from Ohio State, Syracuse and Penn. The time was 7 seconds from a win and 20 seconds off the best of the best, but to be that close in the Copley Cup class, the accomplishment for a non-scholarship Division II school was like Joes versus the Pros.

The UCSD men moved up to the top class in 2008 after winning the Cal Cup in 2007.

The top women's performance of the weekend was put in by the USD varsity crew.

The Toreros finished second in the women's Cal Cup, just under a

second behind UC Davis and 10 seconds ahead of SDSU, who came in 5th.

"Second place is our best-ever performance. We got a third before, so we are moving up," said first year head coach Kim Cupini. "It was a great race — I'm happy."

After two years as assistant coach, the USD alum knows her competition.

"We have met and beaten all the other teams in our (WCC) conference," Cupini continued. "But we haven't met Gonzaga, so the conference championships in three weeks (May 2) should be a good matchup."

Helping pull the Toreros to a silver medal pace was senior crew member from San Diego, Robin Smith. Helping to call the USD varsity pace was coxswain Allyn Delozier.

"Allyn is just a freshman but she is an excellent coxswain," Cupini said. "She knows rowing, she makes adjustments well, she is dependable, and most importantly, her crewmates trust her."

The local universities haven't seen a women's team win a major victory since the SDSU women won the women's Cal Cup race in 2005.

On April 12 the City Championships between USD, UCSD and SDSU will be played out on Mission Bay.

Other highlights of the Crew Classic competition included both the men's masters from the San Diego Rowing Club (SDRC) and women's masters from ZLAC

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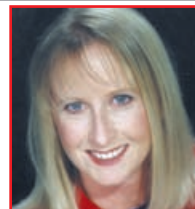
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Olympian swimmer Lenny Krayzelburg gets pumped for Maccabi Games

Olympian Lenny Krayzelburg's life has been characterized by challenges. In 1989, he immigrated with his family to the United States from the former Soviet Union. He swam competitively until 2004 and won four gold medals despite multiple shoulder surgeries.

Krayzelburg is still taking on new challenges. Though retired from competitive swimming, he cannot stay away from the pool, currently running a swim school in Los Angeles and appearing across the nation at swim camps and clinics year-round.

His family life is also challenging; Krayzelburg and his wife, Irina, have 3-year-old twin daughters, Alexa and Daniela.

"I honestly wouldn't have it any other way," Krayzelburg, 32, said. "One would be not enough now."

In all facets of his life, meeting challenges is not a problem for Krayzelburg.

At the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Krayzelburg won gold medals in the 100-meter and 200-meter backstroke events and was part of the United States' gold medal-winning 4-by-100 meter medley relay team. In Athens in 2004, he earned a gold medal as part of the 4-by-100-meter team by swimming a relay in prelims.

"The satisfaction of being the

best at something that you commit so much time to it and made a life to it and achieve the highest success of it is extremely gratifying," Krayzelburg said.

He said his most memorable gold medal was the first one he earned in Sydney.

"Just really remembering the race, the leading up to the race, winning it, putting my hand on the wall first — these things are all very clearly stuck in my mind," Krayzel-

burg said.

As someone who has tasted Olympic glory, Krayzelburg said the significance of the Olympic Games to an athlete is far too great to be boycotted. This comes despite the claim by some long-distance runners that the air quality in China is too poor for them to participate in the games.

"I think that's just a bluff. I can't imagine — no matter how bad their experiences are, the setting

is, in terms of participating because of the pollution or other factors — the bottom line is that it's the Olympic Games," Krayzelburg said.

Although Krayzelburg retired from competitive swimming four years ago, he said he still misses it.

"I miss the environment, the cul-

ture of it," Krayzelburg said, "the reality that you're somewhat living in a dream world, in a sense that it's not a real-life grind."

Krayzelburg was recently in San Diego to help promote the JCC

Maccabi Games. The Olympic-style competition for Jewish athletes ages 13 to 16 will be held in San Diego Aug. 3-8, and more than 1,500 athletes are expected to compete. The JCC will be one of the venues hosting events. Krayzelburg himself participated in the Maccabi Games in 1990 and 1992.

"This is very close to my heart. I remember as a kid being part of it and how special it was. I never dreamed at that time that I would go to the Olympics," Krayzelburg said. "To me, that was the Olympics of that time."

Four gold medals and an Olympic career later, Krayzelburg revealed the secret to his success.

"A lot of success that I was able to achieve attributed to [the fact] that I try to have as much fun as

possible," Krayzelburg said. "I try to do things with a smile on my face and enjoy the moment, because life goes by way too fast and sometimes we take things for granted."

It doesn't appear that the former U.S. immigrant has taken anything for granted. And he has dived into the post-swimming chapter of his life.

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Seaforth construction nears completion

After nearly 40 years of conducting business in the same buildings, Seaforth Boat Rentals, Seaforth Sportfishing and Seaforth Marina all located around the 1700 block of Quivira Road began a major rebuilding and renovation effort last October and now the project is nearly done.

“It is definitely major construction,” said Jeton Prince, manager of Seaforth Boat Rentals. “Not only were the old buildings themselves leveled, the foundations were also removed.”

As anyone who has upgraded an older building knows, a major part of any such effort is simply making sure the new facility complies with today’s government standards and codes.

“The boardwalk has been doubled in size with lighting and landscaping,” Prince said. “All the restrooms and parking lot now meet ADA requirements. [Runoff from] the parking lot now drains into a sewer as opposed to the bay.”

The reconstruction was largely due to the leases for the businesses being up for renewal, according to Prince. In other words, the City of San Diego essentially said if the three businesses wished to renew their bayfront leases in order to stay in operation, there were going to be some changes needed.

“As a result of the construction now we have a new 40-year lease,” he said.

On the inside of the sportfishing and boat rental businesses, customers can expect to see a much larger retail area than in the previous buildings, Prince said.

“The Marina building is about the same size as before,” he said.

The completion date for the construction is scheduled for the end of May.

“The project must be completed by June 1 because no construction is allowed on or around the bay during the summer months,” he said. “Fortunately the construction is ahead of schedule so everything should be done on time.”

Despite having building materials and heavy equipment take over the area, Prince said the construction has not seriously hurt revenues.

“It (construction) has had a minimal impact on our business levels,” he said. “Considering the old buildings were completely leveled to begin with, the overall numbers are pretty good.”

One issue which will probably continue despite the new buildings is the confusion by customers over the business names.

“All three of the businesses are actually separate from each other in how they operate,” Prince said.
