Advisory group wonders why city doesn't follow its advice

What good is an advisory group to the city if the city doesn't follow its

That's the question being asked after the city approved Stay Classy's April 19 Charity Jam despite the fact that the Pacific Beach Special Events Committee (PBSEC) voted 3-2 in March against approving the event.

Representatives for Stay Classy, a local social networking group, came before the PBSEC earlier in the year to tell the committee about efforts to make the event a bit more palatable than the previous year's pub crawl to the community, but not enough members gathered to officially vote on it.

To address the concern of public intoxication, the group repackaged the pub crawl, which involved several bars, into its Charity Jam at just

In a letter presented to the PBSEC, Pacific Beach resident Jennifer Sprofera asked the PBSEC board why the city allowed the event to take place despite the PBSEC voted against it.

"Why do we have such [special events committee] groups in our community?" Sprofera ask. "It's totally fallen short...if the city is not going to listen to them."

Carolyn Wormser with the City's Office of Special Events said the city allowed the event because Stay Classy "met the [city's] requirements and were willing to implement plans

PBTC mulls maintenance district fees

Should local property owners, area businesses or the city be responsible for keeping Garnet Avenue and other busy streets clean? At its May 21 meeting, the Pacific Beach Town Council (PBTC) debated whether area property owners should fund a maintenance assessment district. The advisory board also discussed how the recently implemented Administration Citation Program is targeting raucous house parties and heard how Pacific Beach Middle School is working to attract students.

The assessment district would provide trash and litter removal, sidewalk power washing, graffiti removal and other services designed to improve the area's cleanliness and overall appearance. The proposed area is bordered by Chalcedony and Felspar streets to the north, Gresham Street to the east, Thomas Street to the south and Ocean Boulevard to the west. Businesses and homeowners would foot the bill for the program's estimated annual costs

Runners pound a beat for the Rock 'n' Roll Marathon

Runners from around the world will flock to San Diego to run to the beat of drummers and all variety of musical acts in the Rock 'n' Roll Marathon Sunday, June 1. The marathon is part of a weekend full of health and fitness events.

The Rock 'n' Roll Marathon broke ground in the running industry, bringing entertainment to running," said Dan Cruz, public relations director for the event. "The fun aspect makes it what it is.

The marathon begins Sunday at 6:30 a.m. at Sixth Avenue and Palm Street in Balboa Park and finishes at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot. The Wheelchair Division begins at 6:25 a.m.

In last year's race, Kenyan Daniel Yego beat out a field of more than 17,000 participants to win the marathon with a time of 2:09:04, marking his first win in major marathon competition. Fellow Kenyan Hellen Kimutai was the top female finisher, completing the course in 2:32:40.

Cruz said one of the most notable bands on the docket is the 80z All-Stars. The '80s cover band will perform at the finish line from 10:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Four stages featuring eight bands will be set up around the Mission Bay leg of the race, performing from 7:40 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The stages will be located at the Mission Bay Park Visitors Center, Mission Bay High School, Vacation Road at Ingraham



Judge OKs 2nd degree murder charges in Kauanui case

A judge ordered five men to stand trial for second-degree murder in the slaying of professional surfer Emery Kauanui Jr., but the judge also dismissed allegations the defendants worked as a criminal street gang known as the Bird Rock Bandits.

Following nine days of testimony and arguments, San Diego Superior Court Judge John Einhorn told attorneys Thursday, May 22, he did not feel the slaying of Kauanui, 24, was firstdegree murder but felt there was enough evidence against all five to face a jury on a second-degree murder charge. Kauanui was beaten outside his mother's home in La Jolla on May 24, 2007, and died four days later on Memorial Day from a skull fracture and brain injuries.

Einhorn said the group known as the Bird Rock Bandits didn't fit the legal definition of a gang under state law. One prosecution witness, a gang expert, said it was law enforcement, and not gang members, who determine who is a gang member. All San Diego police officers and investigators who testified during the long preliminary hearing said they had never heard of the Bird Rock Bandits until after Kauanui was killed.

The judge also said that the group wasn't formed specifically to commit crimes. It was only after Kauanui died that charges were filed involving assaults against other victims going back

District Attorney spokesman Paul Levikow said afterwards that a decision to refile the gang allegations has not been made.

Defense attorney Mary Ellen Attridge, who represents Seth Cravens, said afterward the gang allegations "were ridiculous." All five defense attorneys had attacked the gang allegations, which could have led to increased sentences if the men are convicted.

As a result, several felony assault charges were reduced to misdemeanor battery crimes by the judge after he threw out the gang allegations. The other charges involve unrelated victims who said Cravens and other codefendants assaulted them after they crashed parties where alcohol was served.

The judge ordered Cravens, 22, Orlando Osuna, 23, Eric House, 21, Henri Quinn-William Hendricks, 22, and Matthew Yanke. 21, to be arraigned on the charges on June 10, when a trial date may be set.

One irony with the nickname of the Bird Rock Bandits is that none of the charges involves theft. Attridge and other defense attorneys asked each witness if thev ever saw anyone in the group display a gang sign or challenge or see gang graffiti. None of the witnesses said they had ever seen such a thing.

With the gang issue thrown out, it means the trial could be shorter since the prosecution would

not be presenting witnesses to prove they were in a gang.

Einhorn dismissed one charge against Cravens of dissuading a witness from testifying in a July 8, 2005, incident at a house in La Jolla. A police officer testified a witness thought someone was following him after someone velled at him from a truck that passed him following an earlier incident with Cravens. The judge did order Cravens to stand trial on a charge of making a criminal threat.

Cravens was ordered to stand trial on 10 other assault charges involving previous incidents. Osuna was ordered to stand trial in six assaults and one misdemeanor battery. Yanke and Hendricks were ordered to stand trial on three assaults and one battery that occurred on Dec. 31, 2006, when they crashed a party in La Jolla with Cravens.

Assault charges involving two women and two men who were allegedly punched in the face by Cravens and others were all reduced to a misdemeanor battery after the gang allegation was thrown out. One charge in the New Year's Eve party case was dropped by the prosecutor.

Cravens is the only one who has not been able to post bail, and he remains in the George F. Bailey Detention Facility on \$1.5 million bail. The other four are free on high bail figures, ranging from \$1 million to \$500,000, and bond conditions bar them from frequenting area beaches where they might run into other surfers.

Specifically Vasconcelos was given the prestigious Spirit of Volunteerism Award, which recognized her efforts as a Human Resources intern, "CPR Saturday" and countless hours during last year's wildfires.

"About the middle of last year as part of my college school work I was supposed to do a one- to two-month internship in human resources," she said. "When I began the internship with the American Red Cross, I was not sure how long I would be there."

The internship ended as scheduled but Vasconcelos kept on volunteering and assisting with chapter events, which made her part of the help efforts during the wildfires in October.

"During the wildfires I went to the shelters to be with people," she said. "Even after I had finished my hours I still wanted to stay and help. Just being there was comforting to people. You learn so

Vasconcelos, who is majoring in hotel management with an emphasis on human resources, presently works at a local hotel. However her longterm desire, borne out of her Brazilian culture and volunteer experiences in the United States, is to work for a nonprofit organization.

Sprofera's letter, which was also sent to city officials, outlined several problems she found with the event, including music she said was too loud at times and more than the usual number of cars parked in her neighborhood. She lives four blocks east of Pacific Beach Bar and Grill, 860 Garnet Ave. The event also took over the adjacent parking lot.

Sprofera's letter called the city's permission of the event "disturbing" in light of efforts by many community members to change the "party image" of Pacific Beach.

PBSEC member Marcie Beckett said she wants more family-oriented events in Pacific Beach like the annual BeachFest and the many restaurant walks throughout the year.

She added that the group should also put more resources toward environmental programs in Pacific Beach if they're going to use the area for fundraisers.

The event raised \$10,000 for environmental programs such as planting trees in Mission Bay and helping to install solar panels in local schools, Stay Classy representative Pat Walsh said.

According to its website, stayclassy.org teams with several organizations such as Surfrider Foundation, Urban Corps of San Diego and San Diego Coastkeeper for volunteer efforts. This is our neighborhood too and we want to take care of it and want to be respectful of it.

printed across his T-shirts, has been outspoken about his views while simultaneously earning points for his wisecracks at the front-runners' expense.

While Bidwell's mostly one-man campaign has barely remained above radar, he made local headlines recently when he exposed a scheme by Sanders' campaign manager Michael McSweeney to use him a mouthpiece to badmouth Francis during a May 22

The stunt cost McSweeney his job with Sanders's campaign and gave Bidwell a bigger platform to point out what he calls dishonesty by both front-runners.

No suit, no tie and no home, Bidwell is as far from the typical mayoral candidate as one can get.

A self-described anarchist, Bidwell has branded himself the "revolutionary mayor," and although he's used humor to spread his message, he is very serious about

City Attorney debate covers familiar territory

The five candidates running for San Diego City Attorney gathered at University City High School last Wednesday for another in a long list of debates that resembled recent, heated San Diego City Council meetings. The candidates answered audience-posed questions moderated by the League of Women Voters, which co-sponsored the event with the University City Community Association and La Jolla Village News.

recurring theme throughout the evening's debate – politics tainting the city attorney's role, and mainly its effects on decisions to take specific cases. Some claimed that if elected, they would take fewer cases, while others said they would continue taking difficult

Incumbent San Diego City Attorney Mike Aguirre helped set the high school's stage, staring into the distance while the two current council members attacked his past, but he countered by pointconduct regarding the council members and the city's pension

Candidate Brian Maienschein, District 5 Councilman, said, "[Aguirre] held press conferences saying 'everyone's a crook.' If that's true, then you need to turn that evidence over."

Aguirre responded by asking the audience to read his interim reports, 2, 6, 18 and 19, which he posted on the Internet.

'Read those reports," Aguirre The candidates brought up a said. "These people siphoned money from infrastructure ... in the amount of \$1.5 million.

> Candidate Scott Peters, San Diego City Council president and District 1 councilman, said, "Basic legal advice is not being dis-

Peters said if elected, he would give good legal advice and help solve problems.

"I get along with everybody except one person," Peters said, alluding to his relationship with the current city attorney.

The undercurrent of tension

ing out current allegations of mis- between the city attorney and the two council members continued. When asked what the city attornev's role is, Aguirre said that his "primary job is to make sure that disobeying the law is not a choice."

Aguirre said, "Developers and unions control decision making [in city council] ... Peters was controlled by the unions."

Aguirre reiterated that both Maienschein and Peters were involved in the city's pension debacle, which includes allegations of council members voting to underfund pension obligations to increase pension benefits but push the costs off to the future.

While the trio quibbled, Judge Jan Goldsmith, former Poway mayor, offered evenhanded answers.

Goldsmith said the city attorney should "represent the city but be accountable to the public – not be the mayor - and not do what the press wants."

Goldsmith said he's running for city attorney because "it's in a

really accessible," he said.

Though Bidwell did leave the city's school system before finishing high school, he passed the state's high school proficiency test and continues to educate himself via the internet. He said online political forums helped refine his debate skills.

Raised by a single mother who is supportive of his campaign, Bidwell has lived most of his life in the midcity areas of North Park, Golden Hill, but he also frequents Ocean Beach, he said.

Since about the age of 13, the San Diego native has been hanging out in coffee shops around the city learning about people, life and the internet using a laptop computer which was a gift from a local philanthropist who won the lottery. The benefactor also bought several children in the city computers, he said.

With opinions on every major political issue ranging from city finances, education, law enforcement to the election process itself, he often challenges core assumptions of commonly held beliefs. His views on city issues seem to result more from his personal experiences than any particular set of political principles.

For example, he's against the oversized vehicle ordinance (OVO) currently working its way through the city council regulatory process. That's probably because might be living in his own RV in a few weeks after he moves out of his girlfriend's home.

He said many residents want to effectively rid their communities of recreational vehicles whose owners often live in them because they don't look so appealing parked in neighborhoods.

He added that he understands that trailers also might pose a danger to drivers, cyclists and pedestrians by obstructing the view of oncoming traffic.

Bidwell's answer to the problem: enforce the law prohibiting parking a vehicle more that 72 hours law and paint more red curbs.

The unlikely candidate also doesn't necessarily agree with the harshness of the "selective enforcement" he sees with oversize vehicle ordinance — especially since he was issued four citations in less than 72 hours while his RV was parked on El Cajon Boulevard a few months ago, he said.

"It was totally harassment," he said. "It seems like it just might have been pissing [police] off,"

Bidwell also helped collect signatures to try to stop the beach alcohol ban last fall. He said an already stretched police force would have a hard time keeping people from drinking on the beach. Some people are just going to drink on the beach anyway, further burdening the police, he said.

"If we can't enforce the laws for a few people, its seems its going to be a lot harder to enforce it for a lot more people," he said.

Bidwell's opinions on law enforcement, overreaching legislation and other issues seem to have struck at least a funny bone—if not a resonating chord—with many San Diegans. He had the crowd of beach residents laughing at the beach-area mayoral debate

Friday, May 8, at La Jolla High School.

He said he liked the beach-area debate adding that it "was a fun one."

The unlikely road to the mayor's office has brought Bidwell some media attention, and he's been featured on major news outlets like NPR and various publications throughout the city.

With a laptop and a copy machine, he's branded his symbols on shirts and flyers, using stencil art.

The black and white image of a wrench falling between two gears is yet another logo he's printed on to wrinkled photocopied flyers that read "Vote Revolution."

The image is nearly symbolic since Bidwell is, in a sense, is attempting to monkey wrench the city's big political machine.

Assuming that he doesn't get elected mayor, Bidwell said he really doesn't know what he'll do next or whether he'll stay involved in politics. He did add however that he would be ineligible to be elected president of the United States until 2020. It's unlikely, but it's a possibility he's definitely researched.

state of shambles.

"I'll only take cases if they have merit," Goldsmith said. "Not for political reasons."

Amy Lepine, the self-described fresh and clean candidate, promised to go after tough cases but also to make nice with the mayor and city council.

As an attorney who used to work for Aguirre, Lepine said she was disenchanted but that she has "no conflicted votes and no special interest money."

"I practice law every day," Lepine said. "I'll take the hard cases and I'll take the hard line. I'm not afraid of that."

"I'm the only one up here that will take the politics out of this," she said, "and that will take the egos out of this."

All the candidates were asked about their stance on one of the most controversial issues in the community, the Regents Road Bridge Project. While Lepine said she hadn't had time to research the issue and Goldsmith said he didn't have a position, the other candidates capitalized on the issue.

"Most people know I'm for the


Regents Road Bridge," Peters said. "It's a decision for the city council and the mayor to make."

"It's not normally the type of thing I'd support," Maienschein said. But after what he went through with the fires in his district, he said he supports the project for safety reasons.

"It's imperative that we follow the law whenever there's a hotly contested issue," Aguirre said.

In closing, the candidates reiterated their positions.

"Eight and a half years ago, you have me a chance ... I'm asking you to help me," Aguirre said. "Take my signs."

next day. It is not uncommon for Mariana to be the last out of the building on a Friday evening."

Furthermore, according to ARC records, Vasconcelos has averaged 32-40 hours per month of volunteer work, and during the wildfires she helped every day in the first week.

Despite the perception of many, the American Red Cross "A common utterance from is not a federal government agency. It depends on the support and generosity of the American people. of almost \$475,000.

While the assessment district addresses litter, graffiti and other chronic complaints of town council members, many were largely critical of the proposal.

"I could never endorse this if it puts a burden on businesses that aren't part of the problem," town council director Marcie Beckett said.

Individual businesses would only be responsible for their "fair share," Discover Pacific Beach program manager Sara Berns said. Factors such as foot traffic and linear feet of street frontage would determine fees, she explained.

Berns estimated that homeowners would pay roughly \$70 per year.

Discover Pacific Beach already receives money from businesses, town council director Bozier Demaree said.

Discover Pacific Beach's budget of roughly \$400,000 is intended to promote, rather than maintain, area businesses. Berns said.

The city and Pacific Beach's business improvement district currently share such maintenance duties as street sweeping and litter removal. While many town council members agree that more needs to be done to make Garnet Avenue and other high-volume streets

responsibility for the area.

"The thing that disturbs me is that we're starting to get into the city's areas," said PBTC treasurer Mike Stevens, who presided in Ruby Houck's absence.

"I'm torn because I think that's part of our responsibility," town council director and Safe and Beautiful Committee chairperson Jerry Hall said. "I don't see our business improvement district taking on this work and I'm sick of seeing Pacific Beach trashed."

"We've had a lot of support from bigger property owners," Berns

"The little people don't really matter," Beckett said. "You didn't do a good job of going to the community. You've only reached out to big business owners."

Berns responded that area business owners received information on the proposed district.

"That's not enough," Beckett

Other town council members shared Beckett's concern that owners of large businesses could have more than their fair share of influence on whether the assessment district is approved.

Votes are divided by parcels, rather than individual properties. For example, homeowners might have one vote for the section of land their single-family home occupies. A business, on the other hand, could have 20 votes. If more than 50 percent of the parcels approve the proposal, it will pass.

Before local property owners cast their votes, the City Council must approve the proposal. The council voted May 27 to table the measure for two weeks.

Business and homeowners will have a chance to weigh in on the assessment district at a June 5

> The area's Administrative Citation Program is helping police more effectively manage disturbances, Officer Charlie Wetzel of the San Diego Police Department said.

> Implemented in December, the program allows officers to fine tenants and owners \$1,000 for noise from parties and other disturbances that can be heard 50 feet from the dwelling.

> "It's another tool we throw on officers' tool belts," Wetzel said.

Of the 26 citations written in the Northern Division, 22 have been in Pacific Beach, Wetzel said. All of the citations have been appealed and upheld, he added. Violators have also had to pay court fees and other administrative costs.

Another program having an impact on the community is the International Baccalaureate Program at Pacific Beach Middle School (PBMS).

Designed to emphasize criticalthinking skills and community service, the program is one of the few of its kind in the state.

"One of our primary goals is to make our school one that parents in the neighborhood would be proud to send their children to,' PBMS principal Julie Martel said.

The San Diego Unified School district is unique in that residency does not determine where a student attends school. Many of the students in local schools are bussed in from other parts of the city.



Selis soars with new 'Angles & Eagles' CD

Long considered San Diego's Queen of Americana, singer Eve Selis is no longer one of San Diego's best-kept secrets. Over the past few years, Selis has begun to build a significant European following for her music, with major BBC radio airplay and several successful tours to her credit. Much more is on the horizon.

On May 31, Selis celebrates the release of her sixth full-length, "Angels & Eagles," with a CD release show at the Museum of Contemporary Art's Sherwood Hall, kicking off a round of touring which will take Selis and her band to England and Norway.

For Selis, music has been a lifelong passion.

"When I was about 8 or 9 years old, during a family living room concert, I heard my grandmother whisper to my father that I had a good voice," she recalled. "I believed her and took up piano and guitar (though) I am just invite the band on as producers." barely able to play.

Selis began performing on local stages as a teenager with a group called Gyros before moving on to a stint fronting cover bands, including Notice to Appear and The Heroes. In the mid-'90s she shifted to playing original music forming Kings Road, with the band changing its name to hers in 1998. Their debut album, "Out on a Wire," followed later that same year.

While "Angels & Eagles" continues Selis' excellent mix of roadhouse rock, country and folk influences, the album had a major shift in its creation.

"This is the first CD that the band has been a part of producing," Selis said. "Our last two releases were recorded and produced in Nashville with Kim McLean. This time we decided to stay in San Diego to record and

McLean instead came to San Diego, joining Alan Sanderson as co-producer. Another big change was in the recording's funding. Eschewing traditional means, she went to her fans, sending out an email asking for donations to help record the album. With each

donation level came different perks, culminating with the largest donors getting to record a singing part on the CD.

"It's an amazing album," Sanderson said.

Having worked with everyone from Burt Bacharach to The Rolling Stones, he considers "Angels & Eagles" a favorite pro-

"Everybody plays great and there was a really good atmosphere at those sessions," he said. "But what really makes an album is the songs, and this disc is full of music that makes you want to lis-

The contributions from fans must be considered some sort of karmic return for Selis and her band's tireless work hosting benefit concerts for numerous causes, including local wildfire victims.

"I have always felt strongly about giving back to our community," she said. "If I had millions to donate to the charities I support, I would. Since I don't have those kind of resources, giving of my time and music is the next best thing. If it helps to bring awareness to a cause and gets people out to support an event, then I feel like I have done something good.

Selis, a mother of four, considers finding the right balance of a music career and a family to be crucial to her success.

"Singing and playing music is such a huge part of who I am that it's woven into the everyday of my life," she said. "It's just what mommy does for a living."

She concedes that touring can be extremely difficult, however. "I've never liked being on the road for too long because I want to be home with my family," Selis said. "The other option is bringing (the kids) with me, but that's very expensive and it's hard to stay focused on work when they are there."

Despite the hard work, Selis is thrilled to still be making music after two decades.

"I love singing and performing with my band and as an indie artist," she said. "I am in complete control of my career (but) sometimes I ask myself why I am still doing this. And the answer comes quickly every time: I can't live without it.'




