Police prepare for 4th of July beach crowds

The beach provides a perfect setting to celebrate Independence Day while enjoying the fireworks.

With more than 700,000 people expected to flock to Pacific Beach, Mission Beach and Ocean Beach as well as La Jolla Shores this Fourth of July weekend, law enforcement and environmental groups prepare for the influx of people by educating visitors about beach rules, laws and common courtesies.

San Diego Police Department Northern Division Capt. Shelly Zimmerman said an increase in police staffing starts Thursday, July 3, in anticipation of the crowds expected to descend upon beach communities.

With the no-alcohol and nosmoking beach laws in effect, Zimmerman said she expects a lot less alcohol-related incidents but that staffing will increase nonetheless.

"We want people to enjoy them-selves," she said. "And we ask the public to educate themselves on the law.'

Police staffing increases include six beach divisions with uniformed officers on foot, motorcycles, bicycles, cars, in the air and on the water, she said.

Along with visible uniformed officer presence, undercover officers will be watching for illegal activity, Zimmerman. The gang suppression team will also be patrolling the areas.

Additional officers along with SDPD traffic division will also be monitoring beach-area clubs and bars throughout the weekend and monitoring parking lots.

The police department also works with lifeguards to monitor beach safety.

In addition to ramped-up police department staffing, other community members will be working to remind visitors to keep the beach


Danielle Miller, spokeswoman for San Diego Coastkeeper, said the organization will be posting signs and posters in local hotels, along the beaches and near shores reminding people to pick up after themselves.

San Diego Coastkeeper will also place an extra 150 trash and recycling receptacles along the city's beaches and bays.

"We want to make it at easy as possible [because] the last thing people think about is where to throw away their trash," Miller

Burglar nabbed by PB man gets 150 days for break-in

A judge sentenced a burglar captured by a Pacific Beach resident to 150 days in county jail Wednesday, June 18.

Matthew Dale Scott, 28, of Leucadia was also fined \$1,326 and given credit for 63 days already spent in jail, including time off for good behavior. San Diego Superior Court Judge Michael Smyth placed him on three year's probation and ordered him to pay \$1,127 in supervision costs.

Scott was arrested May 7 after he was found inside PB Tax Services taking money from a desk. Owner Darin Wilkinson walked in on Scott and asked him what he was doing inside the closed business stuffing money in his

According to court documents, Scott told Wilkinson he was looking for a bathroom and it was his money.

Wilkinson grabbed Scott in attempt to hold him for police, but the two started scuffling, which left Scott with a cut under one of his eyes and a torn shirt. Scott ran out of the building with Wilkinson following, but Scott managed to get away.

Police began searching for Scott and a police helicopter began broadcasting a description

of the suspect's appearance. Resident Tyler Smith was in his front vard on Reed Street near Cass Street when he heard the broadcast. Moments later, the suspect ran by. Smith grabbed

Trial set after alleged shooter fires 2nd attorney

A judge has set a Sept. 14 trial date after a suspected gunman, man in Pacific Beach in January 2007, hired his third lawyer.

Phillip Troy Relos, 24, has waived his right to have a speedy trial in San Diego Superior Court. He fired his second public defender May 19, and his new attorney requested to have more time to prepare his

Relos is charged with attempted murder, assault with a deadly weapon and discharging a firearm from a vehicle in the Jan. 21, 2007, incident in the 4500 block of Dawes Street at 2 a.m. Relos is accused of shooting David Fitzpatrick, 24, in the right side of the hip. The two men did not know each other.

Fitzpatrick was walking with friends and someone in a Saab fired a shot for no apparent reason and wounded him. The car drove off, but San Diego Police stopped the vehicle and Relos was arrested later that night.

Relos had posted \$50,000 bond, but after a judge heard testimony in the March 20, 2007, preliminary hearing, she increased the bail to \$1 million, citing the seriousness of the charges.

In January, another judge revoked bail, and Relos remains in the George F. Bailey Detention Facility without bail. He has pleaded not guilty to all charges.

'Hands-free' becomes law on Tuesday

The state's new "hand's-free" cell phone laws will take effect Tuesday, July 1, which will prohibit all drivers from using a handheld wireless phone while operating a motor vehicle.

However, drivers 18 and older can use hands-free device. It will be illegal for all drivers 16 and 17 years old from using either a cell phone or hands-free device while behind the wheel.

The San Diego Police Department is allowing a 30-day grace period

and will begin issuing citations on violations beginning Aug. 1, but other law enforcement agencies, such as the California Highway Patrol or sheriffs could possibly issue tickets for drivers using cell

The penalty will be \$97 for the who is charged with shooting a first offense and \$211 for the sec-

Animal Services offers discounted pet adoptions

The Department of Animal Services is encouraging families looking to expand with a four-legged friend to visit any of the three county animal shelters. The adoption fees for senior cats (six months and older) and dogs (five years and older) and those that have been at the shelter for 30 days are being waived through August 31.

The fee waiving began on May 31 as the result of a seasonal influx of animals. The shelters want to get the animals adopted to prevent an overflow at the shelters.

The cost to adopt is normally \$35 for senior cats and dogs, \$58 for cats or kittens and \$69 for dogs or pups. The fee includes costs of required surgical sterilization, vaccinations and other medical services.

Prior to going home with their new family, the animals will be spayed or neutered, microchipped and vaccinated. If the animal is unable to be altered at the time of adoption, a \$40 refundable sterilization deposit is required. Two animals per person may be adopted.

The Department also has a "Better with a Buddy" program in which someone can adopt a kitten at the full price of \$58 and adopt a second kitten at half price.

PB Town Council looks at summer staffing

PBTC member Karl Jaedtke then presented Ester Kim with the Dan Froelich Youth Award, given annually to a student for exceptional service to the com-

"The perception is that the bay will be the place to go nuts this year," Rick Oldham, town council director, said.

The harbor patrol unit has two boats at its disposal, having recently lost one.

"I'm very comfortable with "Community service is what what we have planned," said Sgt. Rick Strobel of the San Diego school," said the recent Mission Lifeguard Service. Lifeguards and other law enforcement are taking steps to address potential problems on the bay, he said.

Nisleit said he was not comfortable releasing exact staffing levels because that information could endanger officer safety, but he did disclose that police presence would be comparable to last


Law enforcement will also enlist the help of officers on horses, gang patrol and K-9 units, several motor squads and a helicopter.

Police also plan to work with local media to get the word out on rules and regulations on the beaches. Pacific Beach has traditionally attracted Fourth of July revelers from as far away as Arizona. Some of those visitors may not be aware of the beach alco-

OTL alcohol permit should be no surprise

It's easy to doze off during public meetings and miss something important. Apparently, a few people dozed off a lot during meetings regarding the beach alcohol issue. Whenever the

alcohol-free beach idea was brought up, someone would ask, "What about Over the Line?" This question came up at town council meetings. It came up at Beach Alcohol Task Force meetings. It came up at San Diego City Council meetings. And the answer was always the same: Permits will be granted to groups willing to take responsibility for special events.

Planning a beach volleyball tournament? A wedding? A company picnic? Want to serve or sell alcohol? You'll need a permit. In fact, there was a permit process in place before the ban for large group events like OMBAC puts on and it was modified when the ban was enacted to encompass all events with alcohol.

Any group that's willing to take responsibility for a special event can request a permit. Special event permits are not the problem.

The problem of out-of-control. unaccountable beach behavior has been solved. Now, the problem is a few people didn't pay attention at meetings and are making groundless complaints.

The article about the Over The Line tournament and the beach alcohol ban was somewhat misleading.

Throughout the discussions of a possible beach alcohol ban, it was made clear that organizers of special events like OTL could get permits from the city for their

The purpose of the alcohol-free beach ordinance was to reduce underage drinking, and binge drinking that result in public health and safety problems. Noise, public urination, and fights are issues that arise when large groups of people drink heavily on the beach. And when no one is responsible for the actions of these groups, maintaining peace on the sand becomes a challenge for cops and lifeguards.

The worst-case scenario was the riot in PB last Labor Day, but other problems occur continuously on a smaller scale.

With well-run events like the OTL tournament, the organizers take on the responsibility of keeping the peace and making sure their event is enjoyable for everyone. Bad behavior simply isn't tolerated. The kinds of problems that inspired the alcoholfree beach ordinance are greatly reduced if not eliminated entirely. That's why there is a process for acquiring special event permits.

Even nicer at ninety...She's always been good-natured. So when the heat hit 93 degrees on Saturday, June Sandford stood outside the Mission Beach Woman's Club greeting guests to her 90th birthday party with a smile. A sweet, warm smile.

June's three kids were all there -Olive, Ed and Julie, along with cousins, nieces and nephews. Her family helpfully prepared name tags for everyone with headings: PB United Methodist Church friends, PB Town Council friends, her Beryl Street neighbors and general friends. There were lots of us, covering the years since she arrived in PB in the

June and her late husband Pug were among the founders of the church and were very active through the years. When I mentioned I couldn't find parking at Santa Clara Point (where the Mission Beach Woman's Club sits at the corner of Bayside Lane and Santa Clara), she nodded. And when I told her I parked in PB and walked over, she smiled and remembered a great story.

"We planned a picnic for the church youth group, here at Santa Clara," she recalled. "All the kids came with us except one young man who had a paper route in Crown Point. We figured he'd be late — but I looked around and there he was! I asked him, 'How did you get here so soon?' And he said, 'I walked across. This was 1949," June explained, "and it was low tide." (Mission Bay wasn't dredged until the early 1950s.)

Warm testimonials came from her neighbors on Beryl Street, where she's welcomed generations of kids. And from PB Town Council friends, remembering her service as president, vice-president, honorary mayor and longtime parliamentarian.

June, you've earned every bit of the praise. Keep enjoying it.

Belmont's ups and downs...Our family has always loved Belmont Park's roller coaster. When it was threatened with demolition, we volunteered to paint it.

I wrote about it, hoping others would help to save the coaster.

In 1986, when voters had the choice of a public park or a shopping center, of course they nixed the shopping center.

The city then gave former Councilman Mike Gotch (who died May 18 at age 60) a lose-lose proposition: We'll tear down the coaster and The Plunge because we can't afford to repair them or you accept commercial development which will pay for them.

He reluctantly — and sadly agreed. Mike later confided that the developers made promises they didn't keep.

Ideas floated on how to sink ships for reefs

Any mention of a sunken ship full of valuable treasures will evoke romantic visions of Spanish galleons sitting on the ocean floor beneath blue waters.

Yet mention a sinking a mothballed battleship to create an artificial reef and suddenly the attitude changes to concern for the environment.

To alleviate those attitudes and recruit people to help with their efforts, the organization California Ships to Reef will be hosting a meeting on Saturday, June 28, at Marina Village, 1936 Quivira Way, at 1 p.m. (a room location will be posted).

"There are a lot of people who do not know what we do," said Dick Long, an active member of the organization and local leader in creating artificial reefs with sunken ships. "Particularly those people who are concerned with the environment."

According to Long, there's a perception that they're doing nothing more than dumping twisted, rusty metal into the ocean at taxpayers expense.

"We (California Ships to Reef) do not want to put trash in the ocean,"

ing people who care about the ocean and want things to be done right."

As past president of the San Diego Oceans Foundation, Long said when it comes time to retire a military ship there are only three options.

"The Navy can use them for target practice or you can scrap them," he said. "Or you can reef them."

All three can carry a steep price in the millions of dollars, primarily to prepare them for any of the three options. A large expense goes toward eliminating hazardous materials and chemicals.

"Reefing" a ship creates longer term benefits than the other two options according to Long who served as the Chairman of Project Yukon, which created a reef two miles west of Mission Beach by sinking the decommissioned Canadian warship HMCS Yukon in 2000, believes part of the challenge is changing the perception of what people see when a ship is still above water to when it is sunk.

"Where the Yukon was sunk to create an artificial reef there was nothing there," he explained. "Now there is a thriving eco-system. The

he said. "The organization is seek- Yukon is covered with life. Anything which stands vertically off the ocean floor like the Yukon is going to attract fish and other sea life like crazy."

> Long further notes the Yukon now generates revenue for the City of San Diego.

"Ten percent of the price paid by every person who takes a commercial boat ride to see the Yukon location goes to our local government," he said. "Currently this amounts to about \$45,000 a year which goes directly to the City of San Diego."

The sinking of the Yukon and subsequent result was so successful, according to Long, it has become a model of how the process should go.

"Today almost anywhere in the world when a ship is put down to create an artificial reef, the procedures used are those which were developed for the Yukon," he said.

For those interested in attending the meeting, Long said the organization needs assistance in a variety of areas.

"We need people who can do internet research and write articles on what we are doing and why," he said, "We need those who are good at public speaking. We have committees someone can

Long knows from his many experiences the way to change perception is to directly confront the con-

"We want to be challenged (at the meeting) and asked questions because then we can share what we are doing and why," Long said. "People flush their toilets every day and have no idea where it all goes. We will explain what happens when a ship is put in the water to create an artificial reef."



Summer comedies dominate the box office



Little person Verne Troyer steals "The Love Guru" right out from under Mike Myers. He seems to be the comic foil in all Myers' pictures, and I love him. He is so funny. He takes abuse as the "fall guy" as his fate in films, with resignation. He is often used as a football, a beanbag or as a modern version of Curly of "The Three Stooges." Troyer is one of those great Hollywood character actors who deserve more recognition. They slyly get it on their own by shining in all their brief but crucial scenes. The most hilarious scene in "Guru" has Troyer faking a heart attack and getting an electric shock from the medics. He ultimately ends up being used as a hockey puck. Classic visual come-

Of course, the genius behind "The Love Guru" is Canadian comic Meyers. There must be something funny about being born in Canada because we have many comics from that beautiful country to the north, including Jim Carrey. Myers dreamed up the character of Guru Pitka while he was making the "Austin Powers" films. Enduring a personal and private grief over the loss of his father, Meyers sought out spiritual enlightenment from gurus and ashrams. Guru Pitka sees his role in humanity to make people happy, and try he does, though he sometimes bungles it all or says the wrong things. Stem cell researcher awarded \$150K

Dr. Martin Madaus, president Millipore Corporation, gave Dr. Jeanne Loring, founding director of The Scripps Research Institute, a \$150,000 grant to continue her work in stem cell research. The presentation was part of San Diego's Bio International Conven-

"This is part of our corporate giving program," Madaus said. "It's a \$150,000 grant to advance her research with no strings attached."

Founded in 1954, Millipore, a company that provides myriad tools to laboratories - and recently acquired four more companies is headquartered in Billerica, Mass. The company describes itself as able to help its pharmaceutical and biotechnology clients optimize their manufacturing productivity to ensure high-quality drugs.

The grant is the first the compa-

researcher on the West Coast.

"It's still a new field," Madaus and chief executive officer of the said, explaining different diseases targeted by stem cell research, including Alzheimer's and other neurodegenerative diseases. "We need many Dr. Lorings to make this happen."

"San Diego has taken a strong stand in stem cells," Loring said.

Four different institutions leading the way in stem cell research plan to come together at a new building near the Gliderport at Torrey Pines, she said.

'There's plans for a new building with representatives from UCSD, Salk Institute, Scripps and the Burnham Institute for Medical Research, in the spirit of collaboration," Loring said.

This new building will focus on stem cell research.

"Part of the idea is to involve companies like Millipore," Loring

Researchers said they are searching for a revolution in human health, thanks to stem cells, which can become any type of cell.

Loring said she's focusing on several different diseases, including Parkinson's, heart disease and failure, Type I diabetes and spinal cord injuries. Researchers are try-

ny has awarded to a stem-cell ing to replace cells wherever they have died. Loring said cells lost to diabetes are different than cells lost from Parkinson's.

The Scripps Research Institute team spent time studying all the facets of stem cells to understand the basics, which led to the discovery phase, where they've had small breakthroughs, according to Lor-

'We're doing the groundwork right now," Loring said. "We want to know everything there is to know."

Louise Laurent, a clinician and scientist working alongside Loring, said she began researching stem cells to parallel her work in obstet-

"Certain mothers are at higher risk. We know there's higher risk with certain [groups] but we can't put our finger on why," Laurent said. "The reason I got into this is that I'd like to treat and diagnose early stages of pregnancy.'

Laurent said she studies stem cells specifically to see what can go wrong and to diagnose problems related to those unknown problems in pregnancy.



Speargun maker reels in SD's divers

San Diego waters have a lot of competition to contend with surfing, kayaking, scuba diving, snorkeling, and the list continues. Then, there's fishing — big game fishing. For local fisherman, the harvesting of big game fish is the ultimate rush, battling species 50 pounds and up.

For these blue water hunters, the speargun is the tool of the trade, and Joel Mojica of Clairemont has spent the last three years designing and creating custom wood spearguns for a growing circle of friends.

He has about 30 guns under his belt now and says his favorite part of making the guns is working with the wood.

"Wood is a material that has a mind of its own," he said.

Many of San Diego's finest career lifeguards are Mojica's clients, though in most cases he says he's "paid in fish and boat rides," which he says he doesn't mind at all.

"He puts a great deal of thought into them [the guns] and he's an expert craftsman," said Bill Bender, a San Diego lifeguard sergeant. "He takes pride in the appearance and every detail of the gun."

Bender, who has been spearfishing for 23 years, now owns two of Mojica's custom guns.

"I like that they are custom, beautiful and accurate." he said.

One of the reasons Mojica's guns are so functional and easy to use is due in part to the extensive research he has conducted, learning every aspect of the sport.

Each speargun is one of a kind, featuring various combinations of wood, including stripped bloodwood, a dense red wood which is one of Mojica's favorites to work with due to its unique, rich color. Other woods incorporated in Mojica's designs include ebony, teak and Filipino or African mahogany. Each gun takes about 30 to 40 hours to make and on average is about 60 inches long.

two are alike," Mojica said.

Mojica said he's been a hunter, fisherman and outdoorsman all his life. Combined with 15 years of woodworking experience consisting of formal schooling, an apprenticeship in a high-end cabinet shop and numerous private commissions, he says making spearguns was a natural progression.

"I like woodworking, but I also like that I'm making a real practical tool, a weapon," Mojica said.

The basic speargun costs between \$700 and \$800. Depending on the level of customization, the price can rise from there. Adding wings, certain handle placements and graphic tracks can raise the price upward to \$1,800 to \$2,000.

Serious spearfisherman are Mojica's target demographic, many hunting amberjack, grouper and cabrilla, all indigenous fish to Loretta, Mexico. Off the coast of San Diego, they hunt yellowtail, dorado — which is also known as mahi-mahi — as well as white seabass, the elusive, prize fish for the area. Mojica's guns have been used at depths of 100 feet for both freedivers and scuba divers alike.

He is also beginning to work with "My spearguns are handcrafted one of his friends, Juan Gonzalez, who also happens to be the owner

of Mojica's very first custom gun. Gonzalez has come on as Mojica's apprentice and design partner.

'The cool thing about Joel's custom-made guns is the different kinds of woods," Gonzalez said.

"I like building my own gun that I've made for myself with my own ideas of what works, improving on what stores try to sell you," he

Mojica is the former owner of Killer Bees Wax, a surf wax manufacturer in Pacific Beach, and calls the San Diego beach boardwalk (Ocean Front Walk) his park. By day, he patrols the beach and provides ground maintenance work and landscaping from Pacific Beach Drive south to Ventura. His nights are spent in his workshop building his custom spearguns.

He is offering his crafted custom spearguns for sale to the public. Mojica can be contacted by email at jdmojica@gmail.com.

In the meantime, Mojica is happy doing what he loves — a combina-tion of woodwork, hunting and spending time at the ocean — and being paid in fish and boat rides. Bender recently dropped off 40 pounds of yellowtail shot by one of Mojica's guns for the gunmaker's 40th birthday party last Saturday.

Not a bad trade-off.

Composting Made Easy

By Jay North

Composting is the simple act of recycling and it's as easy to do as taking out the garbage! Not everyone wants to grow their own garden; not everyone CAN grow their own food. But everyone can seek out organically grown products at the grocer. Those of us who do garden, or farm, know the pure joy of growing one's own food and the pleasure of beautiful landscapes that we've created for ourselves, not to mention the exercise and extra vitamins we get from the sun. Composting is an important ingredient to a successful organic garden and is done by simply creating a box or a space for table scraps of vegetables and fruits and adding whatever you can find in the neighborhood to add nutrients. If you live near where livestock in raised, sold, bred or kept, ask the owner of the property if you can collect some of the manure. Cows, horses, chickens, pigeons, doves, rabbits, and pigs all create material tailor-made for your compost heap, even your morning coffee grounds are great material for your compost bin; as is your fall leaf droppings. Add all the organic matter you can to your compost bin.

- Here are a few tips for composting: 1 Yes, it smells and attracts flies. By hanging a non-toxic pest strips nearby, you can reduce
- infestation of pest, and once compost breaks down, pests are no longer a major problem. Be sure to place your compost bin as far away from the house as possible. Or if you live in an apartment and just want to start composting, do it under the kitchen sink. Latter us your composted
- materials for house plants--indoors 3 Turn the material in your compost bin to allow for air circulation and to heat what may be too low or too high in the bin to break down quickly.
- 4 Building the bin is easily done with recycled chain link fence, wooden pallets, or a plastic bar-5 If you must, you can purchase ready-made organic compost such as Bumper Crop from your
- local garden shop. Whether you buy it or make it yourself, add compost to your garden area in spring and winter. Works very well to feed indoor plants to. When you add the compost also consider adding decomposing pine needles, straw, wood chips, fish guts, fallen leaves, fireplace ashes and decomposed seaweed. Many of these contain essential minerals that actually create the flavor of the foods, or add color to the pretty things that
- 7 Large-scale growers should first gather all the free compost materials possible, then seek low cost items next.

I remember when living near the polo fields in Santa Barbara, California. The management there was always happy to see our truck leave every week with a fresh load from the horse stalls. You will be surprised how people will help you, by providing composting materials, if you ask. The circle of life begins by feeding the earth. I hope you remember to give Mother Earth what she craves - the natural goodness from compost--and she will continue to supply you in return.




