Wonderland Amusement Park. The tradition was continued, but shortlived. In the turbulent years following, the community, divided by fear of the growing drug culture, Real Estate shifts and the Viet Nam War, lost its soul...until the spring of 1980.

A new and energetic Merchants Association had just been formed, the James Gang had recently ridden into town and the Ocean Beach "image" was of general concern. All it took to generate enthusiasm was a little digging into the past, reminiscing on the good feelings; throw out some ideas and the belief that we could do an O.B. event again. Before we knew it, things were rolling. Again, raised eyebrows and scepticism had to be overcome. Short of public funds available for such frivolity, the James Gang pledged to back the financing if the community support fell through. T-Shirts (now a collector's item) were sold by the thousands. An auction was held at the Sunshine Co. and the show was on. (\$3,000 was raised that first year.) In 1980 over 50,000 people watched this 4th of July feat; an exciting proof of co-operation by not only the merchants but the residents also.

In 1981 the fireworks celebration was a little easier; there were two precedents already set, one the 1980 fireworks, the other our O.B. Christmas Tree. (Close to \$5,000 was raised.)

1982 promises to outdo any previous sky-show. \$10,000 worth of fireworks will be displayed with the co-sponsorship of K.P.R.I. More T-shirts than ever before have been sold. (This year's auction alone raised \$2,490, thanks to 204 different donations by merchants and residents.) Activities (check schedule of fireworks festivities) are many, and given the fact that ye old sun has been hiding so long, we may have clear skies. This year Gerald Roberts of Astro Pyrotechnics is putting on the show, all electronic. The Grand Finale will be a 75-foot cascade, once again flooding over the western arm of the pier with a large "O.B." looming above it all.

This sky extravaganza will start at 9 p.m. (O.B. time).
