Ocean Beach will be the scene of the 8th annual Ocean Beach Men's A Volleyball Tournament, to be held the weekend of July 31st.



OVER THE WHAT?

Over-the-line is the essence of Southern California beach life at it's most notorious, and is San Diego's very own. Since it's birth in 1953, OTL has grown and become many things to many people. To the handful of teams that win every tournament, it's an activity in which they excel and deem very important. To lovers of spirits, it's a legitimate excuse to get totally laquered. To svelte, socially desireable Southern Californian's it's a chance to strut and register reactions. To the Old Mission Beach Athletic Club (OM-BAC), it's a goldmine.

As the story goes the standardized game was developed in 1953 by a group of beach residents who were waiting their turn to play volleyball. Why they had bats when they were waiting to play volleyball is still open to debate.

Basically, the game is played with 3 players to a side. Hits and runs are scored when the ball safely lands within a designated rectangular area. No gloves are allowed, except in the women's divisions. OTL was not, however, invented here. It's an activity that is played throughout the nation, in one form or other. It caught hold in South Mission Beach which has always

been narrow. Having no nearby parks the kids used what was at hand namely sand and seaweed. The first courts were made with seaweed and the game took off.

Eight teams showed up at the first OTL tournament in 1954. This year, OMBAC official Mike Curren expects 900 teams to play over the two weekends. No longer a casual inside joke to locals, OTL has come out of the closet and become a happening.

WHEN, WHERE AND HOW. This year's tournament will be held at Fiesta Island off Mission Bay Drive on July 10, 11 and 17, 18. If you haven't already entered, forget it. The tournament was completely filled the first morning applications were being accepted; such is it's popularity. Spectator's are more than welcome; you won't feel alone. Some 10,000 people will be there right alongside you. The police allow no cars on the island past 10 a.m. on tourney days so take the free shuttle that runs from Belmont Park and back again. OMBAC suggests leaving home glass bottles, dogs and small children. Team names are risque, so be forwarned. Above all go early, stay late and have a good time.
