Conrad Prebys Foundation grants continue legacy of late philanthropist

The initial rollout of the Conrad Prebys Foundation grant cycle continuing the legacy of the famed late property developer and philanthropist was astounding: 121 grant projects totaling nearly \$78 million.

The size of the grants awarded ranged from a \$7,500 one-time grant to a \$15 million multi-year grant. The awarded applicants reflect a balance between focus areas of personal interest to Prebys, which included visual and performing arts, higher education, medical research, health care, youth development, and animal conservation.

"Our staff and board are honored to serve as stewards for The Conrad Prebys Foundation, and with our role comes the responsibility to empower the nonprofits creating meaningful change across San Diego," said Erin Decker, the foundation's director of grant-making. "The grantees have exhibited an extraordinary level of resilience, innovation, and compassion during this very challenging time, and it is these organizations that will heal our community in the months and years to come. The foundation is proud to be a part of their story."

Born in South Bend, Ind. in 1933, Prebys, a Point Loma

resident, died in July 2016 at age 92. An Indiana University grad, Prebys moved to San Diego in 1965 and co-founded Progress Construction. Over the years, Prebys shifted his focus from construction to property ownership. As of 2015, he owned 81 properties in greater San Diego valued at approximately \$1 billion.

Prebys was a prolific philanthropist and made major donations to biomedical research, higher education, and public broadcasting including donations to help underwrite the Conrad Prebys Music Center at UC San Diego and La Jollabased Sanford Burnham Prebys Medical Discovery Institute, Scripps Health, the San Diego Zoo and San Diego State University,

among many others.

In 2014, Prebys donated \$25 million to the Salk Institute for Biological Studies to fund cutting-edge biological research on a wide range of diseases. He gave his all-time largest gift of \$100 million to the Sanford-Burnham Medical Research Institute in June 2015 to support its 10-year strategic vision to develop and implement innovative medical treatments.

Of Conrad Prebys Foundation's continuing philanthropic mission, board member Erin Decker said: "One of the biggest messages, and my hope, is that this foundation launching is going to inspire additional giving in our region. This is a huge step for San Diego to be able to provide funding to over 200 organizations that have had such a hard year, and really need support to emerge from COVID. It is the broadest stroke of philanthropy San Diego has ever seen. We've been able to steward these funds, smartly and strategically, to help the entire community, which is awesome."

Decker is excited about the foundation's future.

"There's just so much darkness right now, and to have this gift of some light, some hope in the darkness to our community, it's just been really humbling," she said. "I'm just grateful to have been a part of it. I can't wait to see what we can do moving forward. It's just been a complete gift for San Diego."





Community Budget Alliance seeks to re-allocate police funding

ifferent mayor, same budget increase. That message was pointedly delivered by the Community Budget Alliance, a coalition of local organizations seeking to re-allocate funding that goes to the San Diego Police Department in this year's budget.

At a May 5 press conference prior to City budget deliberations, CBA members expressed, in no uncertain terms, their disappointment with this year's \$19 million proposed police increase in the City budget. If passed, the hike would mark the 11th consecutive year police funding has been increased in the City's annual budget.

During the protest, CBA members brandishing signs implored Mayor Todd Gloria to reverse his position increasing police spending. The coalition called instead for the City to support a "people's budget" diverting some police funding to community program alternatives prioritizing the welfare of under-served communities of color.

"We're not just asking for a policy change investing in a more sustainable future, we're asking for a marked shift in the way the City makes decisions about its money and its people," said CBA (cpisandiego.org/cba) member and community organizer Cris

Sotomayor. "We're asking for the City to prioritize San Diegans and their survival, not your pocketbooks, not your careers. Prioritizing everyday folks may seem radical, but we the people are here to let you know this is the bare minimum, this is your job."

"The CBA has been advocating for a long-term budget solution to bring equity to our marginalized

communities," said Jean-Huy Tran, an organizer for the Center on Policy Initiatives San Diego, a nonprofit dedicated to creating economic prosperity and sustainable communities for all.

"We've seen inequities deepen. With the new mayor, our communities were hopeful for a different budget where people will be prioritized for a change. Unfortunately, Mayor Gloria's budget continues with the same trend of increasing police budgets. One cannot approach the budget with the same process that has brought us inequities for years and expect different outcomes."

Added Tran: "We can do better than this. The mayor can do better than this. Our communities deserve better than this. The

budget is a moral document. The government says they do not have money for our communities, and vet they are proposing to fund almost \$600 million for the police. Fight for us. Fight with us."

The Mayor's Office has countered that most of the increase proposed for police in this year's budget is due to factors beyond its control, such as paying an extra \$15.1 million into the pension fund for retired police officers, as well as spending another approximately \$4.5 million on rising non-discretionary insurance rates and utility bills.

District 1 Councilmember Joe LaCava, representing La Jolla, and District 2 Councilmember and Council President Dr. Jennifer Campbell, representing the Peninsula and Mission and Pacific beaches, spoke on police defunding.

"I will continue to advocate for non-police response to emergencies with trauma-informed approaches, de-escalation, and harm-reduction techniques," said LaCava. "The City's contract with PATH (homeless assistance) is a step in the right direction that we need to expand on. I am also looking forward to the County's rollout of its Mobile Crisis Response Team. Let's keep our police focused on crime prevention and criminal activities and return to true community-oriented policing with officers walking their beat, connecting with residents and business owners."

"We have heard from residents on each side of the discussion around our police budget, something that shows how strongly many feel about this issue," said Campbell. "San Diego's budget is a statement of our values and I look forward to a spirited discussion over the next few weeks to determine how we can better align it with our vision for San Diego."

PB REC CENTER MURAL

The Pacific Beach Recreation Center has served the beach community for more than 65 years and is in need of improvements. Council members support restoring library funding in City's latest proposed budget

he welcome news about the proposed 10 percent reduction to funding libraries in this year's City budget is that the political fight exists to find a path forward to restoring those cuts.

The downside involves actually finding the financing, which will undoubtedly be difficult, time-consuming, and involve changing how library employees are paid.

In recent City Budget Review Committee hearings, library director Misty Jones pointed out San Diego's libraries have been underfunded compared to other large cities, while demand for services has multiplied.

"Our new Central Library opened in 2014 with the same amount of staff from the old library, and very little staff have been added in the last six years, while the number of visits has increased five times," said Jones. "San Diego's public library has one of the lowest materials budgets in California. There has not been an increase in 16 years.

"This means we are unable to keep up with patron demand. An increase in materials is critical in ensuring that libraries are not only maintaining what we are currently offering, but also to add high-demand materials and resources required by the San Diego community.'

Jones added the need to maintain library services was underscored by the fact that "all 36 of our San Diego libraries received the most drop-off ballots of any other location in last year's presidential election."

Noting libraries last year were closed from mid-March until June due to COVID, Jones said: "But being closed did not mean our engagement with the community stopped. At the end of 2020, there were over 2,200 members on the library's virtual Facebook page, and staff had done more than 600 programs online."

But being offline exacerbated

existing inequities in library access.

"The digital divide is still very much an issue in San Diego, and when we closed the libraries, we cut off access for many people," Jones said.

Addressing a possible path back toward restoring proposed library budget cuts, Jones noted, "Nearly one-third of the library's workforce is made up of hourly staff, positions that are difficult to recruit and retain, historically having a 25 percent to 30 percent attrition rate. Pre-COVID, almost half of the hourly positions were vacant. This is not a sustainable staffing model for an urban library system that serves seven million visitors a year."

"For years we have been strategizing how to change the library's operational structure," continued Jones. "But it has been difficult to accomplish and provide the same level of service. Knowing it will take a while to get back to pre-COVID levels, we are proposing a change to our budget model turning hourly employee positions into half- or full-time positions with benefits. This staffing change is necessary for the department to continue to grow services and programs."

"I am committed to working with the library director, Department of Finance, and the City Council to offer a proposal in the May budget revise to restore library hours," reacted Mayor Todd Gloria to budget deliberations. "It is my intent to get back to a seven-day-a-week schedule across our library system over the next year. Staff is still working through the details, but more information will be released later this month."

"I echo and amplify your voices about the importance of the library," said District 1 Councilmember Joe LaCava while pointing out to director Jones, "You have quite a bit of workload ahead of you to figure out how to convert hourly to budgeted for employees, for at least six days a week if not seven."

District 2 Councilmember and Council President Dr. Jennifer Campbell advocated restoring library funding in the May budget revise. "The library should be at the very top of priorities in the budget," she said. "I'm 100 percent behind restoring our library's budget.



VFW Post 5985 to reopen on Armed Services Day

FUNDRAISING BARBECUE SET FOR SATURDAY, MAY 15

The tradition continues as VFW Post 5985 in North Pacific Beach – closed 14 months due to the pandemic will reopen on Armed Services Day this Saturday, May 15.

Located at 853 Turquoise St. since 1938, the post is reactivating in style with a fundraising barbecue from 1-5 p.m. on the military holiday at its longtime home, known for its American flag painted above the front door.

All proceeds from the \$10 perplate food fest including hamburger, cheeseburger or hot dog, sides and dessert will benefit the post, which needs help to remain open.

"We are struggling," confessed Nancy Person, treasurer-secretary of PB American Legion Auxiliary Unit 552, one of four organizations now sharing Post 5985's space along with the American Legion, Sons of the American Legion, and the Pacific Beach Woman's Club.

"Even before COVID-19 hit, our membership numbers were decreasing by natural attrition, with members dying or moving

away. Now each of the four organizations is hanging on precariously. We are taking this time to try to upgrade the post and make the building facility more physically welcoming."

The American Legion is a patriotic veterans organization committed to mentoring youth and sponsorship of wholesome programs. The American Legion Auxiliary and the Sons of the American Legion were founded to support the American Legion and to honor the sacrifice of those who serve. The PB Woman's Club sold and moved out of their historic building on Hornblend Street recently, and have found a new nest at Post 5985.

Commander Mike Hill said holding Post 5985's grand reopening on the military holiday paying tribute to men and women serving in the armed forces "seemed like a good day to do it."

Hill agreed the resurgent post needs an infusion of new members and a higher profile in the community. He added members can come – and do – come from anywhere, not just PB and the beachfront. He noted the post's membership demographic has changed over time as vets from WWII and the Korean War have aged and given way to younger vets who served in Vietnam, the Gulf, Iraq, and Afghanistan.

'Greatest "America's Generation' (those born from 1901 to 1927) has given way to the jungle generation and now the sandbox generation with young vets returning, grabbing the GI Bill and restarting and rebuilding their lives," said Hill.

According to Hill, the post's historic home could use some TLC.

"It's an old Quonset hut from

Camp Elliott (now NAS Miramar, then a WWII Marine training site)," said Hill of the post's home that resembles a single-family house. "They've amended and appended it since it was dropped in next door to a surfboard shop, which was then merged into one building."

The MVPs at VFW Post 5985 are local couple Crystal Burns and Scott Menn, who cater under the name Plate Tectonics. The duo has helped the post provide meals to the public. From January 2019 through March 2020, they sold approximately 800 meals that were picked up by diners or eaten at the VFW on Friday nights.

When the post closed in March of 2020, they began twice-weekly delivery of dinners, two-thirds of which were brought to housebound veterans and other community members who could not get out.

Burns and Menn have served almost 9,000 meals in the past 14 months, totaling almost 10,000 since they started. They continue to provide dinners on Tuesdays

and Fridays, either for pick-up in PB or delivery.

Hill said Post 5985 is worth saving, pointing out its veterans are "a group of people, diverse as all heck, with huge hearts, all trying to do the same thing - help other veterans."

Safe deposit boxes, which are located in a financial institution's vault, are typically used by individuals to store important items, such as jewelry, coins, and certain documents like a will, declaration of trust, or title to a car. Most people do not fully understand the nature of the agreement between the institution and themselves for use of the box or the ramifications of naming themselves and/or additional people on it.

A safe deposit box is rented under a lease agreement with a financial institution. So, although you might say informally that you have, or own, a safe deposit box, you are really just renting it from the institution, usually for an annual fee.

Typically, the number of named renters under a rental agreement is limited to four, and a maximum of two keys will be provided regardless of how many renters are listed. Under the simplest scenario, you would rent a box in solely your name. So long as you are alive, this is satisfactory, because as the sole renter, you would be the only one with access to the box and its contents. However, if you die, the executor of your estate will have to either petition the local court for a probate administration to obtain letters testamentary to gain access to your box—very expensive and time-consuming—or will have to furnish a small estate affidavit where the contents of your box, together with any other assets in your estate, are worth less than a total of \$166,250.

Where it is unknown if a deceased renter of a safe deposit box had left a will or a trust, there is a special "access rule" under California Probate Code Section 331 which allows an individual to search the contents of the box for a will or declaration of trust. The search must be performed under the supervision of an employee of the financial institution, and the individual must provide the institution with his or her identification, a death certificate for the decedent, and a key for the box. If there is a will or a declaration of trust, the institution can make a photocopy of it, and have the individual nut the copy in the box and keep the original (in the case of a will, the original must be deposited with the local superior court). No other contents of the box can be removed under this procedure.

Perhaps by your will you have left your estate to your three children, but you named only one of them as a renter on the box along with yourself in order to provide that child access should you die or become unable to get into the box. This could result in some unfortunate consequences. Your child would have unfettered access to the box and could remove all its contents, claiming falsely that you intended the contents were his alone.

One remedy providing for both uninterrunted access to the box and assuring that the contents will pass on your death to your intended beneficiaries is to make sure you have set up a living trust for yourself, and specify therein who is/are to receive the contents of the box on your death. In the rental agreement you would designate as the renter yourself in your capacity as trustee of your trust. This way, only you would have access to the box during your life. When you die, your successor trustee could then go to the financial institution with the appropriate paperwork - a death certificate for you and a copy of your declaration of trust - and become the new renter of the box as your successor trustee. Since your trustee has fiduciary responsibilities to carry out the terms of your trust, and the trust directs the disposition of the contents of your box. your successor trustee should carry out your disposition objectives without hesitation.



PB entrepreneur wins 2021 Global Amazon Alexa Skills Challenge to help rescue women

San Diego transplant and Brazil native Danielle Vantini was named the top prize winner at the 2021 Global Innovation Summit for her Alexa voice application prototype aimed at combating domestic violence by discretely helping rescue women from dangerous environments.

Powered by artificial intelligence (AI), the application called Glow Up, Damas was recognized as a technology solution that leverages Amazon Web Services (AWS) to address one of the 17 United Nations (UN) Sustainable Development Goals: gender equality.

In the event of a domestic violence threat, Glow Up, Damas would use coded language and responses to arrange an escape from an abuser. By covertly calling a free self-driving taxi, Glow Up, Damas could help women get away from an abusive environment.

Vantini, also the co-founder of San Diego-based PowerFuel Damas, was inspired to create the application after experiencing sexual harassment in her Brazilian workplace.

"Gender equality is such an important topic in the world," she said. "Brazil is a very chauvinist country, where every

four minutes the police register violence against women and every nine minutes a woman is raped. It's my passion to take this business idea further to make the world more equal for all of us women."

Now in beta, Glow Up, Damas found its runway at the Global Innovation Summit hosted by San Diego-based EDequity. Global. The Alexa voice application uses artificial intelligence to potentially rescue countless women who are financially dependent on their partners. In the event of a threat, the app Glow Up, Damas activates by using coded language and responses to arrange an escape from an abuser. By silently calling a free self-driving taxi, Glow Up, Damas will help

women leave a dangerous environment and arrange an escape from their abusers.

In advance of the summit, Vantini was among the 46 women, marginalized college/ university students, and entrepreneurs from Nigeria, North America, India, Kenya, Brazil and Mexico, who completed the Global Amazon Alexa Skills Challenge, a five-week foundational-level AI training program that results in Alexa-powered business ideas that address one or more of the UN Sustainable Development Goals. The participants go on to present at the Global Innovation Summit, where this year, Vantini was named a firstplace winner.

EDequity.Global is a global coalition of partners advancing cloud education and economic equity for women and BIPOC youth leveraging Amazon Web Services (AWS). EDequity. Global is a brand under We Connect The Dots, a nonprofit educational organization based in Westbury, N.Y.

Duck Dive ready to ride the wave of this summer season

amed for a surfing maneuver, Duck Dive in Pacific Beach is gearing up for the busy summer season as the pandemic wanes.

A Hennessey's in a past life, Duck Dive at 4650 Mission Blvd. has been owned and operated by Thomas Winn for the past nine years, who is now working alongside his wife Rebekah.

Winn talked about his apprenticeship as a restaurateur.

"I worked for Paul Hennessey as an assistant manager for about seven or eight years in the Gaslamp Quarter," he said. "When I found out he was looking to sell this PB location, I called Paul and asked to sit down and talk with him about buying. That's how it all started."

After the sale was consummated, Winn and his business partners performed a major overhaul of the eatery. "We did a total gut of the inside and a complete remodel," he said, adding the former Hennessey's was transformed into a neighborhood beach lounge with a handcrafted surf ceiling and custom surf-inspired art.

Then came the time to figure out a new identity and brand for the establishment. "The idea was just to rifle off names and we took turns with names we thought would fit into a concept," Winn said. "We came to surf terms and duck dive, when you paddle out and take your board and nosedive under the wave, came up."

Then it was a matter of matching the restaurant's new name with its décor.

"Originally, we had surfboards cut up into a honeycomb-shaped bar top," Winn said. "One of the walls was wrapped in a picture we had a friend do. We had another photo of a girl duck diving in a wave crashing off Hawaii. It was what we wanted to do: something new and fresh for a beach lounge with coastal cuisine where people could come to have a good meal and hang out."

Of the eatery's cuisine, Winn noted: "We have tacos. Duck Dive's burgers are really well known as well as our sandwiches. We also have oysters and surf-and-turf filets with lobster tails. The menu has evolved and changed over the years. We've had sea bass and pork chops on the menu. Right now our brunch is a big hit."

Duck Dive's current menu serving all three daily meals features a diverse array of items including breakfast burritos and omelets, avocado toast, chorizo hash, French toast, wings, shrimp ceviche, ahi poke, tacos, burgers, chicken sandwiches, grilled fresh fish, and salads.

Two dessert favorites are churros con caramel with chocolate dipping sauce and chocolate chip pazookie served with ice cream.

Enduring the pandemic was admittedly tough, but Winn is encouraged by signs that "people are wanting to get out and dine, have some drinks and a meal and spend time together.

"We've had a lot of our regulars coming back," said Winn pointing out his clientele is a mix of supportive locals and tourists from all around who come annually for the summer prime time.

"We have repeat customers from Arizona and elsewhere who, when they come back to the beach, they come back to Duck Dive," said Winn adding, "Memorial Day is always a big weekend for us and a kick-off for summer."

Winn credits his long-term employees for much of his success. "My management team and staff has been amazing," he said. "That has been really key for us, being able to keep doing what we're doing. I'm very thankful for my staff."

SAN DIEGO UNIFIED SUPERINTENDENT MARTEN CONFIRMED

Asian moms fight against AAPI hate in San Diego

top AAPI Hate, a national coalition aimed at addressing anti-Asian American discrimination released data on March 16 about receiving a total of 3,795 reports of hate incidents against Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (AAPIs) across the U.S. between March 19, 2020, and Feb. 28, 2021.

That same night the data was released, the number of hate incidents would increase in a terrible way as a mass shooter killed eight people, including six Asian women, at spas and massage parlors in Atlanta.

Reports about other Asian women across the nation facing violence quickly made national headlines in the following days.

As the onslaught of news about attacks continued, a group of Asian mothers in San Diego turned to each other for ideas on how to combat racism and defend themselves.

Viva Kwan-Nguyen started the Facebook group Asian Moms San Diego 10 years ago when she first moved to the city and wanted help from other parents raising bilingual children. In the past few months, the group has pivoted to take on thornier topics.

"Now the group is more than

just a regular mom group, we discuss racism, and how do we respond, how do we explain this to our kids," Kwan-Nguyen said.

When someone's son faced discrimination, the other moms were able to offer advice on how to respond and give support.

One member, Raquel Cusi, knows self-defense and is planning classes across the county for members of the group. Many of the recent attacks have targeted Asian women and elderly people. Kwan-Nguyen said the women want to be prepared for a situation in which they may need to protect themselves and their children.

Since the group refocused, a lot of new members have attempted to join the private group. Kwan-Nguyen carefully vets them before letting them join. Currently, there are just over 500 members.

"I want to create a safe and judgment-free zone for the members to share experience, especially right now with so many things that are going on," she said. "We have familiarity as minorities. We understand this. We understand each other and most of us experienced this before so it's nice to have a place where you can share specific things without racism in the group, without being judged."

Stop AAPI Hate was founded

in 2020 amid growing racially motivated violence against Asian Americans tied to the COVID-19 pandemic.

"I believe that we get blamed because of this coronavirus because it's coming from China. But you know, we are American. We live here so we have nothing to do with that," Kwan-Nguyen said. "But if we look like Chinese people, they don't even care [that] they affect Asians, they don't care if we are Korean or Vietnamese. They don't see the difference."

In the data Stop AAPI collected, there were 343 reports of hate incidents against children age 0-17 years between March 19, 2020, and February 2021.

A national report found Asian American children were returning to in-person school at lower rates than their peers. A U.S. Education Department survey





shows that as of February 2021, almost 7 in 10 Asian American K-12 students were still learning online only. While there are many factors affecting this disparity, it has been partially attributed to the increase in hate incidents in the past year.

Kwan-Nguyen does not want her children, a first-grade boy, and a preschooler, to experience the same racism she has. Although she has not faced a

violent attack, she has been called names and racial slurs in the past.

"It sounds small, just calling you names, but it hurts. That type of thing, it's been a lot of Asian women's experiences. I really think my experience is something that does lead to trauma," she said. "I believe it's not okay and not acceptable in any way, verbally, physically, anything."

Kwan-Nguyen, who lives in Chula Vista, called on the wider San Diego community to support Asian Americans living here. She suggested raising awareness on

social media by sharing articles, something she noticed made a big difference during the Black Lives Matter protests last summer. She does not want this discrimination to continue being overlooked. She also asked people to intervene if they noticed a hate incident happening in front of them as well as to report it so hate incidents are not undercounted.

"I think everybody can contribute and support to end the violence because it's been going on way too long and way too many victims already," Kwan-Nguyen






My recent, minimally invasive glaucoma surgery



Doing it **Better**

"Your eye pressure is 50," says Dr. Robert Weinreb, director of the Shiley Eye Institute and my ophthalmologist, whose expertise is glaucoma. "We have been unable to control your eye pressure with drops; I am recommending eye surgery."

I, of course, am immediately reluctant and ask, "What happens if we don't operate?"

"You may lose the sight of your eye or have a blocked blood vessel in the eye — something like a stroke," is his response. "There really is no choice."

At that glum prediction, I acquiesce. "When I ask?

"Today is Friday," he replies. "We'll do it Monday."

I also have macular degeneration and receive regular shots in that eye from Dr. Eric Nudleman; that disease has been improving. "What are you going to do?" I ask with anxiety rising as the inevitability of the looming operation becomes reality.

Dr. Weinreb explains that

it is one of several new procedures classified as minimally invasive glaucoma surgery (MIGS). A tiny gel implant is placed inside the outer part of the eye. The implant is actually a tiny tube with an inner diameter of 45 microns, that allows the fluid in the eye to drain slowly and lower the eye pressure. It is called MIGS as there is minimal tissue disruption, short surgical time, simple instrumentation, and fast post-operative recovery. This procedure should take about 15 minutes. I have to stay in the recovery room on the third floor for a while in order for the anesthetic to wear off.

"Oh my goodness," I say. I had read that for people my age, anesthesia can impact cognition. I am reassured that it won't be general, just enough to relax me. I will not be allowed to bend down or lift heavy objects for two weeks following the surgery, so I have two days to arrange my apartment. I have restless nights.

Monday does eventually come. Sheri, one of our White Sands drivers, takes me at 8:15 in the morning. Upon arrival, after registering, I am taken to a pre-op room to change into the proverbial hospital gown that ties in the back. I lie down on a gurney with an IV, a blood

pressure monitor (that inflates itself every few minutes throughout the operation), and a pulse oximeter on my finger. Dr. Mark Schwartz, the anesthesiologist, comes over. I tell him of my concern about the pending loss of brain cells from the anesthesia for people my age (I am 94). He agrees to give me very little Versed, the usual culprit, and some Fentanyl. After just a couple of minutes of conversation, Dr. Schwartz says: "Don't micro-manage during the operation." How did he get my number so quickly?

Dr. Weinreb comes over to reassure me and tells me everything is ready. I am wheeled into the operating room and a sheet is placed over my face with an opening over my eye. After some numbing eye drops, I feel no pain during the operation, only some pressure over the eye. I know how to relax from my meditation class. Before I know it, Dr. Weinreb says that the operation is over. He is pleased; the procedure was successful. The entire staff was impressed as he performed it in a mere four minutes.

I rest on my gurney for half an hour, and I'm off in a wheelchair to the waiting car. Sheri had already called ahead to White Sands so that upon my arrival a wheelchair was waiting to take me to my room. My wonderful caregiver, Melissa, puts a drop in my eye; thereafter, I could do the drops on my own — every two hours while I'm awake. I sleep well; I am surprised that I have no aftereffects from the anesthesia. My eye is barely sore.

The next morning I return to the hospital for a post-op follow-up appointment. While Dr. Weinreb examines me, he invites a resident and two fellows to come and take a look at the results of a successful operation. (The institute is a teaching hospital.) My eye pressure went from 50 to nine.

MIGS, the type of surgery performed by Dr. Weinreb, has been available for only a few years and is replacing much riskier procedures for many patients with glaucoma. I feel fortunate to be able benefit from this miracle of modern surgery and very grateful to Dr. Weinreb, Dr. Nudleman, and their entire team at the Shiley Eye Institute. I am now free of the fear of losing my sight.




