
# San Diego holds vigil for transgender people murdered nationally

Event highlighted local discrimination despite efforts of LGBT+ public officials

The County Administration Building lit up in blue and pink for the transgender flag during a vigil held on Saturday, Nov. 20 in honor of the at least 47 transgender people murdered in the past year. The number has risen to at least 48 trans people since then, according to


A bottle of wine or spirits has always been a go-to gift that brings a smile to your family or friends.



# Hearing for Shinn's death rescheduled

A preliminary hearing was rescheduled to Jan. 4, 2022 for the drug impaired driver who is accused of killing architect Laura Shinn while she was riding her bicycle in North Park.

The hearing had been set for Nov. 24, which was the Wednesday before Thanksgiving for Adam David Milavetz, 38, of Pacific Beach, who is charged with second-degree murder and gross vehicular manslaughter while under the influence of drugs in the July 20 incident.

The Nov. 24 date was set at Milavetz's first court appearance in August, perhaps because attorneys didn't realize it was the day before Thanksgiving, which would have been difficult to subpoena witnesses. San Diego Superior Court Judge Robert Trentacosta recently re-set it for Jan. 4, according to court records.

Shinn, 57, was on Pershing Drive on her way to work at 7:30 a.m. as the director of facilities planning at San Diego State University when

she was struck from behind by Milavetz's 2011 Prius while she was in a bicycle lane.

A prosecutor said Milavetz was arrested a month before the incident on a charge of suspicion of driving under the influence of meth. On his Facebook page, Milavetz wrote he was a "420 mobilization tech" for a cannabis dispensary. He also wrote he was a delivery driver for another marijuana dispensary and sometimes worked from his PB home.

Milavetz has pleaded not guilty. He remains in the George Bailey Detention Facility without bail. San Diego police arrested Milavetz at the scene.

Shinn was an avid bicyclist and was riding to work as she often did, according to the American Institute of Architects San Diego. She was their board president this year.

# Ghost gun shooter's hearing set

A preliminary hearing of Feb. 3, 2022, has been set for a man suspected of using an unregistered "ghost gun" to shoot five men in Downtown San Diego in April including Justice Boldin, an Ace parking attendant who died.

Travis Fereydoun Sarreshteh, 33, is accused of murder in the April 22 death of Boldin, 28, and four counts of attempted murder of four men who survived their wounds.

San Diego Police Chief David Nisleit announced at a press conference that Sarreshteh shot the victims with an unregistered polymer "ghost gun" that was assembled, possibly from a prepackaged kit that was mailed to him.

Sarreshteh was irritated at his girlfriend for not staying with him at a Courtyard Marriott hotel on Broadway and he left her apartment at 10:20 p.m. very angry, according to a prosecution document.

Sarreshteh walked to the Pendry Hotel, which was just a block away, and shot Boldin, at "point blank range," the document says. He paced for 20 seconds and then shot the valet while he was on the ground.

Surveillance cameras caught footage of Sarreshteh shooting the parking valet and also showed him walking away at Fifth Avenue and J Street.

The gunman walked away and encountered three people who later told police he demanded the group salute him, according to court records. One man saluted him and he continued walking.

Several minutes later, Sarreshteh was walking on a sidewalk on Fifth Avenue and walked between three New Jersey men, who separated to allow him to pass.



Security. She analyzes women's roles and cultural mores in the 20th century which have ushered in women's suffrage in 1919, the Social Security Act in 1935, and "the pill" in 1961. Each piece in the show is about a feminine issue. The exhibition is dedicated to Francis Perkin who

was a fierce labor advocate. She worked toward abolishing child labor and was a role model for women getting an educating and joining the work force. One of MartyO's creations named "No No No" is about the need for consent. Another called "You Turn Me On" is about the way women have been objectified. "Still Life with Doves Quilt" is about how thin we must be and "Love Honor & Obey" is about how women are taught domestic skills.

Some of the pieces are really fun such as "Give her what she really wants for Christmas" which is a richly-embellished vacuum and a Dust Pan with

a mink collar. One piece that is meaningful to MartyO is the piece called "3 Generations." Her mom and grandma helped her on the piece that helps her remember her family. The title Social Security refers also to our rights as women to be secure with no fear of sexual assault, free to have contraceptives and the right to be seen as an individual, not as an object for others gratification.

OMA showcases artists' works, presenting innovative and dynamic exhibitions of significant local and regional art. This exhibit runs through Jan. 23, 2022.

# "to the yellow house" rambles through van Gogh's life

Art is a harsh mistress. So is public opinion. And a negative reaction – or being ignored – can do huge psychological damage to an artist who's "not like all the others."

Playwright Kimber Lee's "to the yellow house" - La Jolla Playhouse's latest offering - explores this problem. It was inspired by a voluminous biography of 19th-century artist Vincent van Gogh that details the (many) failures, hardships and psychological problems the artist had as an iconoclast trying to get viewers (and buyers) to appreciate his most unusual way of portraying the world on canvas.

Here's a little history: van Gogh never achieved fame during his lifetime, surviving mostly with the help of his brother Theo. He worked briefly as an art dealer. He took up religion and spent time as a Protestant missionary in Belgium before moving to Paris in 1886. Here he tried painting and took art classes, in which the teachers told him how and what to paint: "Draw only what you see." During this time, he befriended avant-garde artists like Paul Gauguin, who were reacting against the popular Impressionist movement in art.

He and brother Theo exchanged many letters, and this is the source of information we have about the artist. But all this time his psyche suffered. In 1888 he moved south to Arles, where he began to broaden his subjects to the olive trees, wheat fields and sunflowers we all know today. He also drank too much and fell in love with the wrong woman, triggering more depression. He eventually moved back to the Paris area (Auverssur-Oise) to be closer to the stability offered by Theo. This is where he would die by his own hand.

Powerbird

The play gives an unsettling portrait of an unstable personality who stubbornly painted what and how he wanted to, and would never know the fame he eventually would achieve. It's almost as difficult to watch this story as it must have been to live it, because no matter what Vincent does, it doesn't work out.

The set design by Takeshi Kata gives viewers the idea of Van Gogh's unstable life by use of black-and-white projections that change and float back and forth behind the action.

Neel Keller directs a diverse

#### **FATHER JOE'S VILLAGES**

Father Joe's Villages has been the premiere organization in San Diego for over 70 years when it comes to providing services for our homeless population. It has gone from a simple soup kitchen to now providing housing, health and dental care, and job training for their clients so they can achieve true independence and join the community once again. As with most foundations, they are busy year-round, however, the holiday season brings special programs. Deacon Jim F. Vargas, OFS is the President and Chief Executive Officer of Father Joe's Village and sees firsthand

the effects of homelessness on our children.

"Were preparing for Christmas, and Christmas is a special time at our village because it gives us an opportunity to really – especially for the kids – to provide some normalcy for them. Because you can imagine their situation isn't very typical," noted Vargas. "We serve 350 families – to put it in perspective for you – and about 900 children through our programs and our services. So it's a lot of families that we support and a lot of children."

On December 9, Vargas will host an event at the village designed to bring some holiday magic to the kids. "We'll have the Old Town Trolley – which for years and years has partnered with us – and will put together a Christmas event, and that's always a lot of fun," Vargas said. "Where the kids are able to have fun and we'll be able to provide some gifts for them and they will also be able to see Santa."

Due to Covid, the event had to be scaled down a bit last year, but Vargas is confident that the event will go on as normal. This includes hopping aboard the trolley for a fun nostalgic ride. "We do it in a very safe way obviously, so there's distancing and masks involved because we want to make sure that our kids are safe, and that everybody is safe. So it's both Santa and Mrs. Clause actually who will join us for that event."

The village typically provides up to 4000 meals each day year-round to their clients, but they plan on doing a special event on Christmas Eve with a festive ambiance with holiday music and decorations. And this year, there will again be a shopping event designed to save Christmas for the children housed at the village.

# Balboa Park exhibits innovative Japanese textiles

San Diego is the host of the first NUNO exhibit on the west coast in over a decade. The leader in innovative modern Japanese textiles has an exhibit called "The Language of Textiles" at the Japanese Friendship Garden through Feb. 27.

"Hundreds of years of tradition in Japan have influenced today's art which is also combined with a lot of high tech. Tradition, innovation — the balance between the two is really an interesting topic and something that NUNO textiles really reflect," said Chad Patton, the managing director of Material Things who curated the exhibit.

NUNO means "cloth" in Japanese and has become a world-famous textile company since being founded 35 years ago by Reiko Sudo with iconic textile creator Jun'ichi Ara. While many museums feature exhibits of the company's innovative textiles and often sell their products in the gift shop, this is the first exhibit curated specifically Material Things, NUNO's international distributor which is based in San Diego. The exhibit covers 20 years of Material Things' textiles they have sold since they were founded.

"It was really fun because it gave us an opportunity to look back at things that [NUNO] produced over the last 20 years that maybe we had forgotten about or

Patton approached the Japanese

cocoons made with short fibers that for hundreds of years were thought to be unusable. Instead of simply designing a new pattern of silk, she worked with women in the town to develop an entire new fabric made with the discarded kibiso fibers. One section of the exhibit shows the stages of turning the short fibers into threads that can be woven.

Another section shows off NUNO's patented process of origami pleats. The three-dimensional fabric is created by heating up polyester to 400 degrees Fahrenheit. The plasticity in polyester ensures that when heated to that temperature, the pleats become permanent.

The third textile the exhibit focuses on is called feather flurries. While making the double weave silk, the loom is stopped and feathers are manually put into pockets before the loom resumes. The feathers come from game birds eaten at restaurants such as ducks and pheasants, meaning the feathers are essentially recycled into the pockets of the silk fabric.

The exhibit opened on Nov. 12 to much interest from the public. Patton was excited to show modern Japanese art rather than historic pieces. The setting of the traditional garden offsets the changing Japanese aesthetic.

"The modern Japanese aesthetic is something that's very, very interesting and it's something that has been influenced by the traditional but today's Japan is just as beautiful and just as interesting as 500 years ago Japan," Patton said. "I wanted people to see that."

Through Feb. 27, people can visit the exhibit and experience modern Japanese design for themselves. General admission at the Japanese Friendship Garden is \$12. The garden is open from 10 a.m.-6 p.m. daily at the heart of Balboa Park.

#### TIPS TO STAY CONNECTED DURING NATURAL DISASTERS, WILDFIRE SEASON



It's always important to prepare your loved ones, home and business in the event of a natural disaster, which can strike without warning. For San Diego residents, that also means preparing and protecting your home or business in the event of a wildfire.

A top priority for Cox during a wildfire or other natural disaster is to keep customers connected so they can stay informed, check in with family and friends, and even access their shows and movies if they're evacuated.

Cox also works hard to keep business customers, including hospitals and offices of Emergency Services, connected so they can continue to serve their customers and the public.

Wildfire season typically occurs from May through October. However, wildfires can occur at any time. Some of the most destructive and deadliest wildfires in California have occurred in November

(Camp Fire in Northern California in 2018) and December (Thomas Fire in Santa Barbara in 2017).

Cox prepares all year long for natural disasters, including wildfires, by reviewing its business continuity plan and running through simulated events such as a wildfire or earthquake so that employees in all facets of its operations will be prepared and know their role and responsibilities during a natural disaster.

When weather conditions increase the risk for wildfires, the local power company may notify you and Cox that they're implementing a PSPS. If you're in a neighborhood where power is shut off, your Cox services may be interrupted. You need power to run your devices and we need commercial power for our network.

We'll work closely with the power company and public safety agencies to monitor the situation and ensure the safety of our network and facilities to continue to serve our customers.

Here are some tips to help better prepare for an unexpected event or Public Safety Power Shutoff.

Have a charged backup battery for your landline phone





She died at the young age of 55 from aggressive breast cancer and he believes it absolutely could have been prevented if she would have been given the knowledge and resources to seek out a plant based diet earlier in life. That being said, this is not a health food restaurant. His goal is to start a conversation about what plant based cuisine can be.



Petal, Cucumber and Pickle. The Scorpion Pepper Vodka is spicy and perfect for mixing Bloody Marys or any other cocktail with a kick. The Pickle Vodka is briny and makes a perfect addition to a hip pickle-whiskey cocktail or a Pickle-tini. Apostolopoulos uses locally sourced ingredients for his vodkas and distills them entirely from cane sugar, resulting in a uniquely clean and smooth taste, texture, and natural absence of gluten.

The vodkas can be bought for \$29 each or in a three-pack for \$70. That's the best deal because you can either split it and give three friends a bottle apiece, or give your primo three craft vodkas and look like a king!

#### **COOKING OIL**

Celebrity chef Brian Malarkey became a fixture in San Diego with his fabric named restaurants including Searsucker, Gingham, Gabardine and Burlap. Now, he has joined in with the trendy ampersand-themed restaurant clique with his new eateries Herb & Wood and Herb & Sea. But during the Covid shutdown, a series of events unfolded resulting in Malarkey launching his own brand of cooking oils called Chefs Knowledge.

"During Covid, we were doing a lot of online cooking classes and stuff for our employee relief

fund - Zoom classes where people would pay and get recipes and stuff," Malarkey said. "And then we eventually turned it into a whole operation – and actually into another business called 'Chef in a Box'... I was getting to go out and visit everybody in their own kitchen! And I never had the opportunity to do that before!"

During this program, Malarkey realized that many home cooks were not fully informed on how to use basic ingredients in their recipes. This revelation inspired Malarkey to create his line of cooking oils where he could transfer his vast culinary knowledge to the home cooks around the nation. Each bottle is clearly labeled with the phrase "Use this oil for..." with a list of how to use the oil, making it a no-brainer for the home chefs. The three categories are: for cooking, for blending (as in sauces) and for finishing. "I wanted it to be chef's knowledge passed on to the consumer and that's where we got the name from," added Malarkey

Cooking with extra virgin olive oil (EVOO) was the first concern

that jumped out at Malarkey while Zooming with the home

"I realized that everybody was cooking with EVOO - most of the people I talked to — and it was just mind boggling to me that nobody knew that you're not supposed to cook with EVOO, you're not even supposed to heat up EVOO. And EVOO as much as I love it, is just a flavor enhancer. It's got so much flavor, its big and bold. I've recently been describing it as a big buttery Chardonnay."

Malarkey says the best cooking oils are grape seed, sunflower, avocado and second press olive oil, so he created a blend of those for his cooking oil. His mixing oil is used for sauces and marinades, and the EVOO is for flavoring your food. Malarkey also added that proceeds of the sales goes to Golden Rule Charity based in Southern California, which provides grants for people in the hospitality industry. Malarkey was able to secure a deal with

# TDOR vigil

Human Rights Watch, marking it as the most deadly year on record with still a month to go.

The Trans Day of Remembrance event was hosted by the LGBT Center with partners including San Diego Pride. The majority of the speakers were members of San Diego's trans community although a special effort was made to highlight the voices of government leaders amid a rash of anti-trans legislation passed in other states.

San Diego's first gay mayor Todd Gloria said "We will continue to fight for a more equitable and safer San Diego for all of us. I want to say that as mayor of the city, I want you to know that I see you. I acknowledge you. I'm not only aware of you, I'm here to celebrate you. All of you are important parts of the city. We would not be America's finest city without our transgender gender non-binary members."



Tootie Thomas, wearing sequenced pants next to Councilmember Whitburn, brought the letter forward to the city's human relations committee.

Councilmember Stephen Whitburn highlighted his work 20 years ago in passing the human dignity ordinance to protect trans people and more recently declaring Nov. 20 as Trans Day of Remembrance in District 3.

"It's one thing to fight discrimination. It's another to fight prejudice," Whitburn said. "We have so

much work to do."

At least nine of the bills that passed nationally targeted trans youth to either bar them from extracurricular sports or gender-affirming healthcare. Amid the crowd of at least 100, dozens of trans youth were present. Among the 47 people whose names were read alongside a projection of their photo, two trans boys were under the age of 18 when they were murdered.

As in past years, a special effort was made to honor Black trans

women who are killed at disproportionate rates. According to Human Rights Watch, transgender women are four times more likely to be murdered than cisgender women.

The event commemorated people across the nation while also highlighting issues closer to home, including trans man Poe

Black who was stabbed to death and left in the Coachella Canal in Slab City. Evidence related to his murder is still waiting to be processed at a San Diego lab, according to LGBTQ Nation. Activists say his life on the margins as a homeless trans person living in an alternative community has led to his murder case being a low priority for the Imperial County Sheriff.

Meanwhile, San Diego Sheriff Bill Gore and the county is being sued by transgender woman Kristina Frost who was jailed with several men, one of whom allegedly beat her, despite her updated ID listing her as female.

Publicly, Gore supports transgender rights and he was the final vote at the Leon L. Williams San Diego County Human Relations Committee that helped co-sign a letter with the city's commission that condemned transphobia and

encouraged public officials to speak out for trans people.

The joint letter was presented at the event. Getting the letter passed was a challenge as the volunteer county board of 24 seated members needed 18 votes to pass it ahead of the vigil. Initially two people abstained, including a representative sitting in for Gore while he was out of town. After the representative abstained, Gore was contacted directly and he said over text that he would vote in favor of it. Amid the kerfuffle to get it passed, commissioner Dennis Hodges was asked why he abstained. In answer, the local pastor said that "transgenders" are an "abomination" in the eves of God.

Over the Zoom meeting, there was an audible gasp in response

to his remarks on a commission meant to promote human rights and dignity. One of the transgender commissioners was visibly crying and Nicole Murray-Ramirez called Hodges out for the grief he had caused to two of the commissioners who sit on the board with him.

At the vigil, commissioner Julia Legaspi said it was the first time in 40 years as an LGBTO+ activist that someone had called

her an abomination to her face and she still gets emotional recalling it.

"I have had shares of discrimination," she said. "I didn't expect it from a fellow commissioner on the human rights commission."

Following the incident, Hodges sent a letter to chair Ellen Nash doubling down on his previous comments, saying "when men and women embrace obviously other-gendered expressions of

identity it is a disgrace."

Led by Center CEO Cara Dessert, the LGBT+ members of the commission sent a letter to all of the county supervisors calling for his immediate resignation.

The letter concludes While we believe in Commissioner Hodges' right to vote how he chooses, his right to free speech, and to freedom of religion, his persistent discriminatory and hateful comments are simply antithetical to the mission of this Commission and disqualifying of his appointed position."

Due to the Thanksgiving holiday and an annual conference, the supervisors have not held a meeting since the

his small hometown in southern France.

"We're starting out with at least 30 different kinds of absinthe from Europe and the U.S., including one from a local distillery in Barrio Logan called ReBru Spirits," he pointed out. "Every distiller has their own recipe. In addition to wormwood, some have common herbs such as mint and coriander, and others have more obscure herbs such as hyssop and angelica."

Harrag also owns the mezcal-centric Tahona Bar in Old Town. There, the liquor and One of two outdoor dining spaces its myriad varieties serve as a bridge to Mexican culture. At

Wormwood, he hopes to educate consumers equally on absinthe's French-European connections while creating a sense of community through tastings and a book club focusing on authors who have shown passion for absinthe in their works.

"With absinthe, the history is so strong," said Harrag. "More than 100 years ago there was the misconception that absinthe made you crazy. It wasn't based on any data. It was actually the wine industry in France that lobbied to get it banned because absinthe had become so popular, especially among artists and philosophers in Paris during the early 1900s."

Harrag also cited that Parisian bar owners back then held "green hour" in the late afternoons, when high numbers of consumers gathered to imbibe on the drink.

But stigmas about absinthe and its wormwood extract eventually took root, resulting in global bans on the liquor. In Europe and the U.S. such bans were lifted in 2002 and 2007, respectively.



Harrag admits the liquor is indeed higher in alcohol compared to most spirits, ranging between 90 and 130 proof. He playfully cites the words of 19th-century Irish poet and playwright Oscar Wilde, who described the effects of absinthe as such: "After the first glass of absinthe you see things as you wished they were. After the second one, you see things as they are not. After the third, you finally see things as they really are."

Moderation is the approach at Wormwood, where customers are served their absinthe along with a table-size water fountain.

"The water drips slowly into your glasses from multiple spouts of the fountain. It's up to the customer how much they want to dilute their absinthe," said Harrag while noting the "ceremonial presentation" dates back at least a century throughout France. The wormwood element, he added, is what gives the spirit its distinct anise flavor.

Several changes were made to the interior, although Jayne's intimate bar and signature black-

and-white floor tiles remain in place.

Harrag created two backyard patios; one of them is a "secret garden" designated for private parties. He also hung new wall art and opened up the kitchen so customers can witness the creation of meals by two executive chefs: Danny Romero, formerly of Addison, Bracero and Stone Brewing Co.; and Janina Jaray, who ran a bakery in Tijuana and had also worked at Addison.

Their menu is French-based with dishes unique to Wormwood. Some of them include ovsters accented with absinthe foam, artichokes set in Caesar butter, wild mushroom tartlets, and Wagyu beef tartare. On the dessert menu is "baba au rhum," a classic French cake soaked in rum.

Wormwood is located at 4677 30th St. It operates from 5 to 10 p.m., Wednesday, Thursday and Sunday; and 5 to 11 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays. It is closed Mondays and Tuesdays. Harrag plans on introducing brunch service early next year.

Two bystanders tackled Sarreshteh, who appeared to have problems with the gun. San Diego Police officers arrested him within 30 seconds after the bystanders tackled him.

Once in a patrol car, Sarreshteh apologized to officers, saying "I really thought I

was protecting the city, I'm sorry," according to the prosecution document.

Court documents say Sarreshteh was arrested in 2017 for threatening his girlfriend and police seized another unregistered polymer "ghost gun" from him, which was not returned to him.

Sarreshteh has pleaded not guilty to all counts and remains in the George Bailey Detention Facility without bail.
