

New homeless bridge shelter going up in Midway District

new low-barrier, 24/7 bridge shelter housing up to 150 homeless, now under construction on County Psychiatric Hospital land in the Midway District, is expected to open soon.

The Lucky Duck Foundation, a nonprofit whose mission is to alleviate the suffering of homelessness throughout San Diego County, is donating the use of their bridge shelter at 3851 Rosecrans St. The and is expected to be operational

Lighthouse Ice Cream celebrates 25 years of serving Ocean Beach

n June 25, Lighthouse Ice Cream will celebrate its 25th anniversary of serving Ocean Beach residents and visitors with some of the best ice cream creations ever scooped into a waffle cone.

"What we do every year on our birthday is offer kid's cones for a dollar," Carol Ladiges said. "We hope everyone will stop by to say hello and help us celebrate another year of making friends in OB.

Dick and Carol Ladiges and their ice cream empire are part of the unique history of Ocean Beach and with each year a new chapter is written.

"It was 25 years ago, June 1997, that my husband Dick and I opened up Lighthouse Ice Cream in Ocean Beach on Newport Avenue," Carol Ladiges said. "This was actually our second shop, in 1982, Dick had a Big Olaf store on Santa Monica Boulevard."

Ladiges has been dubbed, 'The Queen Of Ice Cream' by her legions of faithful customers, in fact, a visit to Lighthouse has become a family tradition.

From day one, Carol and Dick began taking photographs of their customers, a few decades later they had enough Kodak moments to cover generations of

"The kids that worked for us in 1982 grew up and in 1997 they brought their kids to our new store on Newport Avenue," Ladiges said. "So now, we have photos of them from 1982 with their family in 1997. At times we have had five generations with grandparents, even great-grandparents, all having ice cream together in our shop."

Dick died in 2011, and Carol continued his tradition of giving customers their forever moment of fame, one snap at a time. Ladiges took on the painstaking labor of love one panel at a time, covering each year with hundreds of celluloid memories for all to see.

"People would come in and see their baby pictures," Ladiges said. "Then they would bring their kids in, and take pictures of them, with their baby pictures in the background. Lighthouse Ice Cream is really a family affair."

Due to COVID, Lighthouse customers are served through a Dutch window at the front door preventing customers from viewing the panels of photos. However, Ladiges is photographing each panel and will soon be posting them at lighthouseicecreamob. com for all to see.

The Ladiges were a dynamic duo in the ice cream game. They sought out only the best ice cream in addition to creating from scratch waffle cones.

"One of the concepts we took from Big Olaf was to make a sundae in a waffle cone," Ladiges said. "We took it a step up by purchasing a unique hot iron that allowed us to press two waffles together with ice cream in the center making a hot waffle ice cream sandwich. We have a new ice cream pancake sandwich, too."

New Library/Innovation Center building dedicated on Point Loma High campus

new three-story Library/ Innovation Center build-Ling was among the new site modernization phases dedicated recently on the Point Loma High School campus.

The library, with several large conference rooms and student study areas, and 20 new classrooms on the two top floors, was the focus of the June 6 event held in the spacious new quad area of the 97-year-old campus. Also celebrated was the renovation of the 200 and 300 buildings on campus and upgrades to Pete Ross Stadium, which include practice fields for athletics, band, and NJROTC students plus new stands and facilities for visiting fans.

Dr. Sharon Whitehurst-Payne, San Diego Unified School District Board of Education president, praised the beauty of the new building and noted this year's senior class will be able to once again have its graduation on campus in the updated stadium.

The school's ASB president, Ella Sykes, told how "Students feel proud to be at Point Loma High School and see their transformed campus. We will be excited to graduate next week on our football field, the first class to do so since 2019."

Kim Jessop Moore, director of the PLHS Alumni Association, reminded the crowd that the school's first students in 1925 were inspired by the best teachers and motivated to excel. They built friendships that lasted a lifetime. While the beautiful Spanish architecture of the original campus is no longer visible, students of today will learn from the best teachers in the district and be inspired by the legacy

Planning Group, reacted to this latest development in the fight to stem homelessness.

"I think the installation of this shelter here in the Midway District is a direct response to growing community concerns over the last few years about the state of homelessness in the neighborhood, particularly the large encampment on Sports Arena Boulevard," said Anyiwo. "I view this effort as a positive step in our collaborative regional approach to addressing the homelessness crisis in San Diego. Ultimately the solution to homelessness requires that more homes being built, and we're doing everything we can as a community to achieve the vision of our community plan and build more homes in this neighborhood."

Added Anyiwo: "I would like to thank Fletcher, Gloria. Supervisor Terra Lawson Remer. and my Councilmember Dr. Jen Campbell for their partnership with the Midway-Pacific Highway Community in this effort. This low-barrier shelter will provide much-needed capacity to help our neighbors across the Sports Arena and wider Midway area transition off the streets and receive the support they need."

To prepare the new shelter site, the County performed advanced infrastructure work including removing and replacing lighting, new exterior site lighting, asphalt repairs, trenching for a new sewer connection, potable water connections, and power connections for the structure, mobile trailers for laundry, and shower and administrative offices.

'WE STILL DON'T FEEL SAFE' Point Loma High students rally in support of gun safety

he recent gun violence and mass shootings – including in Uvalde, Texas where an 18-year-old is accused of shooting and killing 19 elementary school students – have triggered public outrage, student marches, and renewed calls for broad legislative action.

"We need to make sure everyone knows it is their responsibility to be involved. No matter who you are, no matter what you believe in: You need to be involved in this fight because it is literally children fighting for their lives," said Zoë Geller-Alford, a Point Loma High School junior involved in the June 9 student activist march from the Hall of Justice to Waterfront Park.

"It's enough about thoughts and prayers. It's enough saying, 'We need to do something.' There's a pattern of politicians funded by the National Rifle Association saying they're going to do something – and then legislation gets stalled. We need to register to vote and get everyone registered to vote. We need to make sure that young people have a say in the changes that happen in this country," Geller-Alford said.

"It was definitely a reaction to the Uvalde shooting," said Theo Martien, co-organizer of the June 9 student march talking about how it came about. "I just reached out to Zoe about getting something organized to get our voice heard. And here we are."

The pair led a lineup of youthful speakers addressing gun violence before marching and chanting to Waterfront Park at the County Administration Center where more young activists were offered an opportunity to share their thoughts and grief.

Another anti-gun violence activist, PLHS alum Will Barton, spoke out from his artist's studio where he uses his mouth to paint emotional artwork offering glimpses into his reality and recovery 10 years after he was shot multiple times and left for dead in 2012.

Given almost no chance for survival, the now 30-year-old Barton has since used the shooting as a force for good in creating art and spreading the message that survival, recovery, and hope are possible after life-changing physical injuries and emotional trauma.

"I want to explicitly speak on how devastating gun violence is," said Barton. "There won't be a day, not even a minute, that I will live without the extreme injuries I sustained by those three hollow-tip bullets shredding through my head and body 10 years ago. In a split second, the future I had envisioned was taken from me forever. It's now time for a serious and permanent change to combat the horrid events we have seen as of late. I am hopeful for the future, But it's had an enormously devastating impact on me and my entire family."

Added Barton: "High-caliber automatic weapons are unnecessary in our society. I want to see more victim advocacy groups, more mental health resources, and measures for gun safety. I have rebuilt my life through art and the love of my family and friends. I implore those who are struggling: please find something or someone positive to cling to, search for help and build from there. There is always hope."

Weighing in on the recent spate of national gun violence, U.S. Rep. Scott Peters (CA-52) voted to pass the Protecting Our Kids Act and the Federal Extreme Risk Protection Order Act. The Protecting Our Kids Act builds on the House of Representatives' twice-passed legislation advancing universal background checks for all gun purchases, an action that is supported by nearly nine out of 10 Americans. That legislation has been blocked by Republicans in the Senate.

"It's painful to recognize that the loss of countless innocent lives over decades led us here today," said Peters. "Passing these bills to prevent more gun violence reflects the will of the American people. Now, we will continue fighting to get

additional life-saving legislation over the finish line. I will not rest until the job is done."

Added Peters, "The House also passed the Federal Extreme Risk Protection Order Act permitting law enforcement officers, family, and household members of a person who poses a threat to themselves or others to request that a federal court issue an extreme risk protection order to prohibit an individual from purchasing or possessing a firearm.

"The bill protects the right to lawfully possess a gun by requiring high standards of proof, an opportunity to be heard in court, the right to counsel, and penalties for those who file frivolous petitions. The legislation also encourages more states to adopt these red flag laws and requires law enforcement to be trained in the use of extreme risk protection orders."

Two Point Loma residents, Jerry Lohla and Robert Tripp Jackson, reacted to the recent gun violence and mass shootings.

"Our national crisis with mass murders is too many insecure males collecting too many guns," said Lohla. "Every nation has to deal with mental health issues, but the only reason why the U.S.A. is an outlier in mass murder is the prevalence of guns. We should not

be turning our schools into armed fortresses. Our teachers want to teach, not defend against assaults by men with guns."

Added Lohla: "The AR-15 is an 'assault rifle.' It is for assaulting an enemy. Assault, by definition, is for offense, not for any gun owner who claims he needs an AR-15 (or several) to defend his home. He is simply insecure about his masculinity. His AR-15 shows he has 'performance' issues."

"I participated in a weapon's safety course when I was 12 years old,"

The Protecting Our Kids Act

- The Raise the Age Act to raise the purchasing age for most semi-automatic weapons to 21 years old. Currently, someone could buy a semi-automatic rifle at just 18 years old yet you must be 21 to buy a handgun.
- The Prevent Gun Trafficking Act to crack down on gun trafficking and straw purchases to keep illegal guns off streets.
- The Untraceable Firearms Act outlaws ghost guns and ensures that all firearms are traceable.
- The Closing the Bump Stock Loophole Act to close the bump stock loophole, banning these deadly tools from civilian use.
- The Keep Americans Safe Act to outlaw new high-capacity magazines, which have been the accessory of choice in the bloodiest mass shootings.
- Strengthening safe storage requirements to protect children from accidental shootings.
- Requiring an annual report of demographic data of those determined ineligible to purchase guns.



OB's old-fashioned candy store, Beach Sweets, celebrates 15 years

ow sweet it still is for candy store owner Laura Smith in Ocean Beach. Having just celebrated her 15th anniversary for Beach Sweets at 5022 Newport Ave., the beachfront candy entrepreneur noted there is an interesting story to tell regarding how she started her shop.

"I was turning 50 and I was working in graphic design and publishing downtown and I was working in a cubicle," Smith said. She added jokingly, "But it was like, 'I am just going to this cubicle and I'm going to die, and that is going to be my life."

That is when Smith, whose family splits time between Flagstaff and Point Loma, had an epiphany involving past memories from where she came from. "All the East Coast beach towns had old-fashioned candy stores," she said. "And I always dreamed of opening a candy store in OB because it is a funky beach town. One day I was walking by that store (formerly a T-shirt shop) with my niece and saw that it was for lease. I had already done my business plan, and the owner had a stack of applicants. But he loved our idea. I guess it was just meant to be."

Beach Sweets is characterized on its website beachsweetsob.com as "an old-fashioned candy store where you can find most of your favorites from your childhood, no matter how old you are." The candy store makes hand-dipped chocolates, strawberries, handmade fudge, salt water taffy, as well as offering 80 bins full of favorites, and many more hard-to-find confections such as Pop Rocks, Bit-O-Honey, and Abba Zabba.

"We have candies from the '50s like candy cigarettes," noted Smith adding, "We also have a lot of dog treats that are really popular, along with some sugar-free

candy."

Of her brick and mortar, Smith said, "It's just a really good location a couple of blocks from the beach."

As to the reasons for her success, Smith replied: "We worked really hard. The harder you work – the luckier you get. Definitely, hard work made it happen."

And it doesn't hurt that candy,

even in these highly inflationary times, is relatively inexpensive to buy and is a product people desire year-round, not just in summer.

"Almost everybody likes candy," noted Smith, adding she's celebrating her 15th business anniversary on Friday, June 17 with "giveaways, raffles, chocolate-dipped strawberries, and other specials."
