Pointer boys win CIF and Southern California Regional titles

he Pointer boys soccer team remained focused and went on to win CIF's Southern California Div. III Regional championship exactly one week after winning the San Diego Section Div. I title. It is the first regional title won by a PLHS team since the 2017 girls volleyball team won a state championship.

Seeded No. 4 in regionals, the Pointers earned a home game on Feb. 28 against No. 5 Newport Harbor. After the visitors took a 1-0 lead, senior Leury Castaneda blasted the tying goal for a 1-1 tie that went to penalty kicks. Junior Ethan Denney, senior Samuel Valli, and juniors Anderson Kelly and Cooper Rohnow all scored while junior goalkeeper Owen Purvis stopped three Newport shots

for the 4-1 penalty kick win. Again, the Pointers faced a

No. 1 seed on March 2 in the semifinals. This time it was Quartz Hill (Antelope Valley), which came into the game having won or tied 13 straight games. But Castaneda found the net again in the first half and senior Liam Donovan iced the game on a goal off a corner kick by senior Marko Alonso.

In the March 4 final against No. 3 El Dorado (Placentia), the Pointers found themselves down 1-0 and 2-1 but Alonso scored the game-winner eight minutes before the final whistle giving the Pointers a state CIF plaque. Earlier goals by Kelly and Castaneda kept the Pointers in contention.

CIF CHAMPIONSHIP

Finding success in any endeavor sometimes takes time to achieve, and time to perfect the final product. Such was the case this year for the Point Loma High School boys soccer

On what could have been a miserable night of torrential rain and chilling blasts of wind from current storms, the team that started off slowly completed its turnaround, defeating Sweetwater High 3-0 to claim the Div. I CIF championship.

After losing three of their first four games and enduring a six-game losing streak from mid-January to early February, head coach Elliott Savitz told his players after the title game the letters "CIF" weren't even on his mind.

But after a 2-1 home loss to Coronado on Feb. 7 the Pointers were never to lose another game.

Point Loma High raises the curtain on new Thespian Society

tudent theater has been resurrected at Point Loma High School. Aspiring student thespians banded together recently to form the Point Loma High School Thespian Society. The new group was spearheaded by student president Emma Nickel, who has had a passion for theater since seeing her first show, "Annie," at age 3.

The first production of the school's fledgling Thespian Society, "Inherit The Wind," a 1955 play about the 1925 Scopes "Monkey" Trial, which resulted in John T. Scopes' conviction for teaching Charles Darwin's theory of evolution, was held Feb. 24 and March 3 in the high school's campus theater.

"For generations of San Diegans, the culmination of senior year at Point Loma High School was the annual 'Zeiger's Show' in which 60-plus students would take the stage," said Robert Nickel, a Point Loma Playhouse board member who directed "Inherit."

"Yet, for more than three years, the performing arts center at PLHS that bears Larry Zeiger's name has stood dark. Three-fourths of the current student body has never seen a show at the school, leaving decades of tradition at risk of being lost forever."

Zeiger retired from the faculty

of Point Loma High School in 2007 after 33 years of teaching cinema arts, musical theater, and language arts. Zeiger cowrote and produced 33 musicals, one for each of the years that he taught. His "Gotta Sing Gotta Dance" company may be the longest-running musical theatrical group in San Diego County schools, having had over 3,000 student participants, with more than 60,000 people attending the performances.

Kevin Mahoney, a PLHS instructor, overcame a stroke last year to help kick-start the student society and spearhead their first theater production. "I am the sponsor, I started this ball rolling," Mahoney said, adding their

new theater group has been well received. "Most of the teachers are so excited about the thespian group starting up," he said noting 'Inherit The Wind' originally had 32 cast members. "But we did it with 12," he said.

Mahoney noted "Inherit The Wind" was chosen because of its social relevance and historical importance. "Scopes does lose in the end, but he (actually) won; it was a victory for the culture-at-large," noted Mahoney. "[Evolution] was out and talked about and most of the country supported him."

Of the importance of theater, Mahoney said: "As human beings, we all have a commonality of suffering and desires, things that go right – and wrong – in our lives. When we watch it on stage unfolding, it allows us to examine our own lives from afar, and have deeper, more profound, thoughts about our own existence."

Concerning PLHS Thespian Society, Mahoney noted: "Now that they're spreading their wings and taking flight – it's really fun to watch."

Thespian Society president Emma Nickel talked about reviving a student theater tradition that had almost lapsed. "During COVID the program stopped," she said. "But we made a strong comeback this year. I wanted to bring it back and do some shows."

Asked about her interest in theater, Nickel responded, "It's a really good bonding experience and good for making friendships because you are all in the same place at the same time working toward one goal: making a piece of art and doing something for other people. You get to spend time with interesting people and tell stories."

Though uncertain if she wants to pursue theater as a career, Nickel intends to definitely pursue doing local theater because "it's really good for building self-esteem and confidence.



Drone light show to replace fireworks

The drone light show is set to take place just north of the Ocean Beach Pier, where thousands of attendees are expected to watch the magnificent display of lights in the night sky. OB MAN GETS 15 YEARS

An Ocean Beach drug dealer who caused the overdose death of Tyber Lustig of Pacific Beach has been sentenced to 15 1/2 years in federal prison. Lustig, 30, was found dead lying on the living room floor in his Pacific Beach home by his father, Jay Lustig, on Dec. 12, 2021, his father said in a video for the Tyber Lustig Foundation he and others created in response to his son's death.

Tyber Lustig had taken a counterfeit Oxycodone sold to him by Alexander Michael Randise, 29, that also contained fentanyl. Jay Lustig said in the video his son did not know it contained fentanyl. His father said in the video his son was found still holding a dog leash and was about to take his dog for a walk after just purchasing a sandwich when he was stricken.

U.S. District Court Judge Janis Sammartino ordered Randise to pay \$34,324.71 in restitution to Jay Lustig for funeral and burial costs, according to court records. Assistant U.S. Attorney Adam Gordon recommended the 15 1/2 year term that Sammartino imposed while Randise's lawyer asked for 12 years. Randise pleaded guilty to possession of fentanyl with intent to distribute.

"Fentanyl has taken so many lives. Our community lost another bright and extremely

talented young man to this epidemic," said U.S. Attorney Randy Grossman.

CARDIAC NURSE GETS JAIL TERM IN 2 VEHICULAR DEATHS

A cardiac nurse who killed a vacationing Canadian couple in Point Loma surrendered on March 6 to start his 180-jail term for vehicular manslaughter. Alcohol was not a factor in the crash, but excessive speed on North Harbor Drive was.

Kevin William Thomer, 36. listened on March 3 to the sentencing concerning the Jan. 19, 2022 deaths of Jerome Zimmer, 71, and Madelyn Zimmer, 69, of Alberta, Canada. Thomer was booked into the central jail on March 6 after his surrender and the sheriff's department said his projected release is set for May 25. Deputy District Attorney Paige Woodward asked San Diego Superior Court Judge Daniel Goldstein to impose one year in jail, but without work furlough or house arrest.

Woodward said Thomer drove his vehicle at 75 mph in a 45 mph zone in the 5000 block of North Harbor Drive where the couple was killed. They were not in a crosswalk as they crossed the street at 5:55 p.m.

"He was driving too fast," said Woodward. "Their lives are worth something. He's still minimizing his conduct."

Four children of the couple spoke at the sentencing, with one daughter telling the judge "every day is a struggle." "I'm so angry. Their deaths are the first thing I think when I wake up and the last thing I think when I go to sleep," said Carmen Zimmer. "One year in custody is not enough."

Goldstein told Thomer he should have not been speeding in an area he was familiar with and that he knew contained hotels. Goldstein said Thomer drove in an angry manner. "Your conduct is the main cause of this homicide," said Goldstein.

SNAPCHAT DEFENDANTS GUILTY

After 12 hours of deliberations over three days, a jury convicted two men on Feb. 27 of first-degree murder in the shooting death of a Point Loma man who contacted them via a Snapchat app.

The mother of Eduardo Salguero, 18, was in the audience to hear the guilty verdicts against Angel Garcia, 20, and Armando Silvestre Alvarado, 21, both of San Diego. The seven-man, five-woman jury found the special circumstance true that both men committed a murder during a robbery, which means they will both be sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole.

Community planning groups now required to meet in person

alifornia's COVID-19 State of Emergency lapsed on Feb. 28 and community planning groups will now be required by the Brown Act ensuring open public meetings to begin meeting in-person only.

Under the new guidelines, such groups may only conduct hybrid or remote meetings under special circumstances. There is also a state bill pending in the legislature, Senate Bill 411, that would allow advisory groups to host hybrid (in-person and remote) meetings. However, this bill has yet to be adopted.

"The Brown Act does not contain a grace period, so these changes take effect immediately," said Nicole Darling, director of the City's Communications Department. "City boards, committees, and commissions must comply with the open meetings requirements of California's Ralph M. Brown Act. The Brown Act's provisions concerning so-called 'hybrid' meetings will be in effect, resulting in changes from current practices. Among them: members of boards, committees, and commissions will not be able to attend meetings virtually except in specific circumstances, and virtual

attendees will not count toward the number of members needed to attain a quorum."

"The emergency provisions of the Brown Act related to virtual meetings (i.e. by teleconference) will no longer be in place and all CPG meetings will need to be either conducted in-person or comply with Brown Act requirements for virtual meetings," said City deputy planning director Tait Galloway in a letter to City staff dated Feb. 16. "Starting March 1, all CPG meetings, including standing subcommittee meetings, are to be conducted under the Brown Act as they were prior to Governor

Newsom's COVID-19 declared state of local emergency. CPGs will need to secure an accessible physical meeting location or comply with the requirements for the Brown Act for virtual meetings."

Brown Act requirements of CPGs include:

- Posting agendas at all teleconference locations containing information about the meeting, including the street address of all teleconference locations.
- Allowing the public access to all teleconference locations. A teleconference location is a physical location where a CPG member is attending the meeting virtually

such as a home or office.

- Allow the public to make public comments from each teleconference location.
- All votes are to be taken by roll

CPG members attending virtually will need to disclose their teleconference location on the agenda and allow public access to their location, including giving personal addresses. CPGs are responsible for providing all necessary technology to conduct a teleconference meeting at all teleconference locations.





A Feb. 9 tie against University City left the team with a league record of 1-6-1 (5-10-2 overall) before fortunes reversed and the team finished 10-10-2.

Div. I playoffs began and the No. 5 seed Pointers made quick work of No. 12 Escondido with a 6-1 win. Next, they knocked out No. 4 Coronado 4-3 in penalty kicks following a scoreless game. Then it was No. 1 Torrey Pines that stood in the Pointers' path. The top-seeded and host Falcons fell 1-0 on a late goal by junior Ethan Denney to send his team to the title game

against the No. 2 Red Devils (11-8-3 overall, 4-1-1, first place in Metro Mesa League).

Both Mother Nature and the soccer Gods must have noticed the Pointers' re-birth because not a drop of rain fell nor was the wind a factor at CIF's selected host pitch at Torrey Pines High's Ed Burke Stadium.

In the first half, a Red Devil shot tore across the goal mouth where junior Pointer defender Anderson Kelly kicked it away from another Red Devil waiting to tap it in.

And then the Pointers struck. During a scramble moments lat-

er in front of the Sweetwater goal, sophomore Fin Rohnow was able

to boot the ball into the net on an assist from Kelly, the only goal of the first half.

Just moments into the second half, senior Marko Alonso kicked a corner ball out to junior Eduardo Brito, stationed near the sideline about 80 feet away from the Red Devil goal. Unmarked, Brito struck a long ball into the air that appeared headed away from the far side of the net. But the spinning ball curved midair into the upper corner of the net in what could only be termed a "bend it like Beckham" shot for a 2-0 Pointer

"I wasn't sure whether to pass the ball or shoot it," Brito recalled, "But I saw the goalie playing a bit

offline so I thought 'Maybe I have a try' and I got it to go."

For the next 38 minutes the Red Devils struggled mightily to score but the Pointer defense held up time after time, allowing junior Pointer goalkeeper Owen Purvis to complete his shutout of every opponent throughout the playoffs. (The goal by Escondido was scored against Purvis' backup).

Further frustrating the Red Devils was the final Pointer score, again coming during a 63rd minute traffic jam in front of the Sweetwater goal before Denney, on another assist by Alonso, drilled the ball into the net for the final score.

The team's turnaround rewarded Savitz with his third CIF championship, the others coming in 2016 and 2018. He praised his players after the match, noting how the return of several injured players aided the team's success.

Denney knew his teammates were talented.

"We knew all along that we had a solid team," he said. "We just had to put it together at the right time to win this championship."

Brito added, "Definitely just understanding how the boys play. Working off each other, building the chemistry and we got some key players that stepped up. We are the champions!"

passed, AB 1909, which amends the California Vehicle Code & provides increased safety measures for cyclists. Vehicle Code § 21760 was amended to incorporate the "Three Feet for Safety Act" which requires motor vehicles that are passing cyclists to do so at a distance of at least 3 feet from the cyclist. A motor vehicle passing a bicycle shall, if another lane of traffic proceeding in the same direction is available, make a lane change into another available lane before passing the bicycle. 


