Robb Field Recreation Alliance advocates for park upgrades

The City is updating planning for Robb Athletic Field and the park's largest users – Peninsula Tennis Club, Peninsula Youth Softball Association, and Albion Soccer Club – have joined to encourage pursuing a broad vision addressing the park's short- and long-term needs.

As the City begins the months-long process to update the General Development Plan for Robb

Athletic Field in Ocean Beach, its three main user groups have formed the Robb Field Recreation Alliance. The alliance's main priorities for the park and the updated General Development Plan include:

– Improved, energy-efficient, and community-friendly lighting;

– Safer playing surfaces;


– Adequate and hospitable restrooms;

– Accessible and paved parking.

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Dean allegedly fired by PLNU for supporting LGBTQ+ rights

On March 15, Point Loma Nazarene University dean Dr. Mark Maddix was fired by Kerry Fulcher, the provost and chief academic officer, allegedly because he supported former adjunct professor and minister Melissa Tucker, who'd been told she wouldn't be rehired as a professor because of her public support for the LGBTQIA+ community.

Those actions have led the university's LGBTQIA+ community to cry foul. They have questioned the motives of the university in not rehiring Tucker, firing Maddix, and allegedly "undermining the rights" of LGBTQIA+ students and their allies on the campus of PLNU, a private Christian college in Point Loma.

In a widely published op-ed piece, Tucker wrote: "Though the Church of the Nazarene made strides in its 2017 revision of its manual document regarding

those in the LGBTQIA+ community, I was increasingly discontented with the tension between the church's overall position regarding human sexuality and my own convictions. My firm belief is that God's love is truly for 'all' people. I am thoroughly affirming of the LGBTQIA+ community."

Maddix, PLNU's dean of the School of Theology and Christian Ministry, reportedly had no previous disciplinary actions before he was let go. He has subsequently hired attorney Josh Gruenberg to represent him.

"I have been retained by professor Maddix," said Gruenberg. "We have evaluated the situation and determined that his termination was illegal under California law."

"While we cannot provide specific details on personnel issues, especially with the threat of potential litigation, the decision to suspend Dr. Maddix's employment was independent of anything related to LGBTQIA+," responded

PLNU's administration in a statement.

Following is a Q&A with Lauren Cazares, founder of Loma LGBTQIA+ Alumni & Allies Coalition, offering their perspective on the PLNU situation.

Beacon: Tell us about your organization, why it was formed, and what its function is.

Cazares: The Loma LGBTQIA+ Alumni & Allies Coalition was formed as a safe space to support LGBTQIA+ alumni and for alumni to support current students, faculty, and staff. It is not formally affiliated with PLNU and there is not a formally affiliated LGBTQ+ alumni

auxiliary, which is disappointing but as a coalition, we have more flexibility to criticize as needed. We are working to form a scholarship for LGBTQIA+ current and future students at PLNU.

Beacon: Seems like conflict between faculty and the university over doctrine, beliefs, etc. has been building for some time, is that true?

Cazares: There has always been a variety of thoughts from students, faculty, and staff regarding the doctrine and community covenant, not just regarding LGBTQIA+ issues, either.

PLNU seeks to be a community where lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex persons are treated with dignity, grace, and holy love in the Spirit of Christ. We recognize the complexity of current issues related to sexual orientation and gender identity. The university desires to faithfully care for all students while engaging these conversations with respect, care, humility, courage, and discernment.

A student (or potential student) who needs assistance with matters related to gender identity (such as gender dysphoria, sexually ambiguous birth, legally altered birth documentation) is invited to discuss these concerns with the Associate Dean of Student Success and Wellness, who will provide support, care, and assistance in accessing university resources.

A Point Loman has started a fundraising drive benefiting critical cancer support programs at the Peckham Center for Cancer and Blood Disorders at Rady Children's Hospital-San Diego.

"I have been a member of the La Playa Unit of the Rady's Children's Hospital Auxiliary for one year," said Mandy Havlik noting, "We help raise money to continue funding cancer support programs that are specifically designed to help very young patients and their families. We are always looking for new members. I guarantee you will have fun, make new friends, and be inspired by the impact we make on families and their loved ones who are impacted by cancer."

Celebration of Champions, the La Playa Auxiliary Unit of Rady's signature event, celebrates and honors children who received services through the Peckham Center at Rady's. Each year, Rady Children's offers over 1,400 families a support system funded largely by Celebration of Champions. Parent liaisons, who have experience with their own child's diagnosis, support parents through a shared experience. Child Life specialists explain procedures to patients, making sure they understand what to expect in a calm

and comforting way. These programs and others are only made possible through Celebration of Champions.

Another Point Loman, Nicole Santos, her family, and her son Carter, are just a few of the many who Rady has helped battle childhood cancer and come out successfully on the other end.

"We are so grateful for the amazing doctors, nurses, and staff who are truly the heartbeat of Rady's," said Santos, noting her son, Carter, was diagnosed with BCell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia in December 2018 at age 5. "As you can imagine this turned our

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world upside down. Immediately we were flooded with fear and the question of will he survive, and what does the journey ahead look like?"

After being diagnosed with blood cancer, Carter was admitted to Rady's and started treatment. The Peckham Center for Cancer and Blood Disorders became the Santos family's home for the next month beginning their journey into the world of childhood cancer.

"Carter was in treatment for 1,210 days and in the hospital for 100 days," said his mother who added, "He had 17 blood transfusions, over 1,000 doses of chemotherapy and he was put under anesthesia 36 times. During that 3 1/2-year period, his strength and spirit were nothing short of heroic and inspiring."

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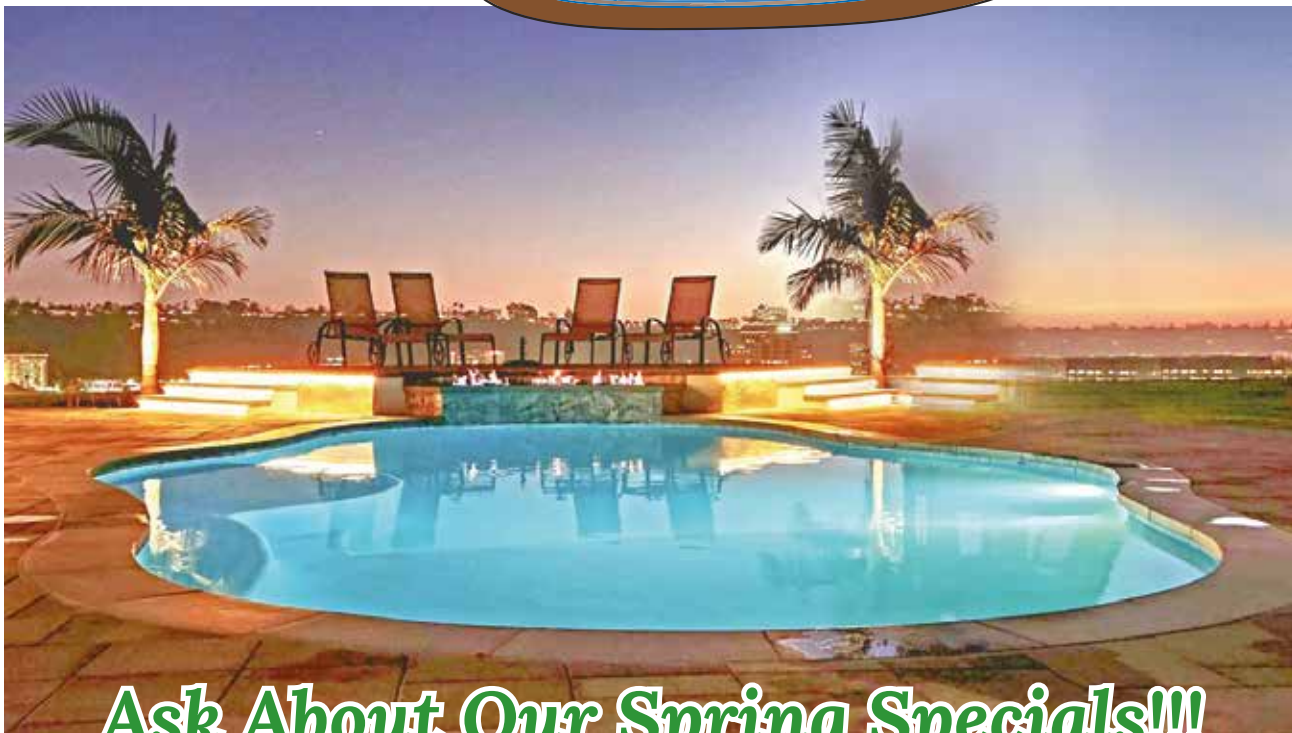

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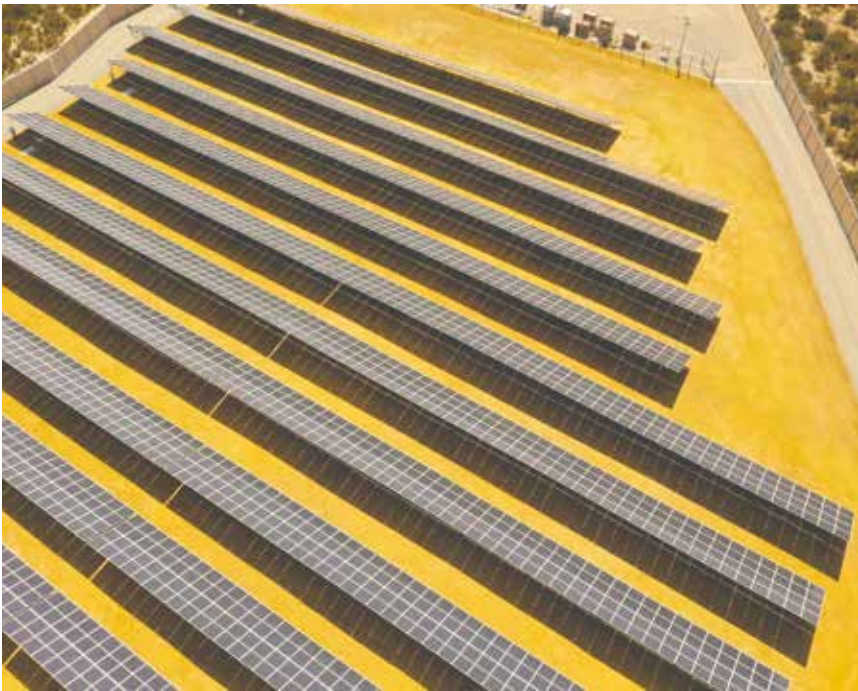

“Robb Field has an incomparable location and footprint that makes it capable of hosting a wide array of recreational and athletic events and training,” said the Robb Field Recreation Alliance in a joint statement. “Due to the outdated layout of Robb Field, and in spite of the hard-working, understaffed City employees who maintain the park, the deterioration of buildings, infrastructure, and athletic fields have made much of the park unsafe for many recreational

activities and for the thousands of individuals who use park fields and facilities daily.

“With the assistance of architect Garrett van Leeuwen, who has expertise in education and sports projects, a conceptual drawing has been developed that illustrates how athletes, including pickleball enthusiasts, can find more recreational opportunities at Robb Field, while decreasing space conflicts and activating parts of the park that need improvement or are considered unsafe,” continued the Alliance’s joint statement. “The Alliance’s proposed park enhancements to be considered in the planning process

are intended to expand recreational opportunities and restore community pride to one of the finest parks in San Diego.”

Peninsula Tennis Club, Peninsula Youth Softball Association, and Albion Soccer Club all disclosed their “wish lists” for Robb Field and its future.

“Each (City) park has a general development plan that outlines what activities can go on, and periodically they make new activity updates to that plan,” said Todd Sprague, Peninsula Tennis Club president. Sprague pointed out Robb Field’s General Development Plan is more complicated than

some because “of the different sporting activities that go on making planning more challenging.”

Sprague said the playing field at Robb is different for tennis than for Robb’s two other main user groups. He noted the soccer and softball groups operate under a general permit wherein the City “takes care of the fields they play on and the lights they use.” However, he added the tennis club operates instead under a special use permit, which requires them to “take care of our own facilities including our restrooms and our little clubhouse.”

Characterizing Robb Field as a

“gem within the City,” Sprague concluded: “This is not about any one sport. It is really about making the park great for everybody. And the only way we can do that is to collaborate.”

“We work in conjunction with Parks and Rec staff daily to ensure the fields are playable and safe for our families,” said Jill Wyatt, president of Peninsula Youth Softball Association, which organizes softball practices, games, and tournaments for more than 700 youth athletes and their families annually.

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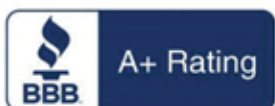

Pointers hoping transfer trio will energize league title run

Point Loma High's baseball team is looking forward to the addition of three transfer players who are now eligible to play after sitting out a required 30-day period.

Head coach Jeff Solis, whose Pointers have posted a .500 record in early season and tournament games (7-7-1), expects the threesome to give his team the needed boost it will take to become Western League champions.

The transfers are pitcher Chopper Correia from Mater Dei in Chula Vista, outfielder/pitcher Will Sanford (The Rock Academy), and third baseman/pitcher Frankie Giacalone (St. Augustine).

Solis notes injuries to his 24-player squad have hurt the team's record.

"We left some wins on the table," he said. "It's not exactly where we want to be but we were very banged up for a lot of games. We're healthy now and I like our chances from here on out. We're a really good team and we're going to win some good games."

The Western League also includes Cathedral Catholic, St. Augustine, and Madison along with new member Patrick Henry. Teams play each other in a three-game series for one week, making pitching depth critical for each

school. The Pointer-Patrick Henry series was played earlier this week.

For the Pointers, the top pitcher is Johnny Nuanez who currently sports a 1.94 earned run average, striking out 27 batters while walking only six over 21.2 innings. He has attracted interest from colleges but made no commitment.

"Johnny showed up this year bigger, stronger, and faster," Solis said. "He's really worked hard. After him we have Sanford (Oregon commit) and then either Henry Crim or Liam Cannavino plus other position players who can pitch. We have lots of pitching and should be fine."

Senior Jordan Otjen, batting

third, is the foundation of the Pointer offense. An all-league and All-CIF selection last year, he currently leads the team with 13 runs batted in and has clubbed two home runs. Other hot bats in the lineup belong to Sanford, Kian Barker, Drake Cobb, and Giacalone.

Senior leadership is a critical component of successful prep teams and Solis feels that role has not yet been filled.

"We have a lot of really nice seniors," he noted, "and it would be nice if there was a guy who would take over and be a leader of this team."

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

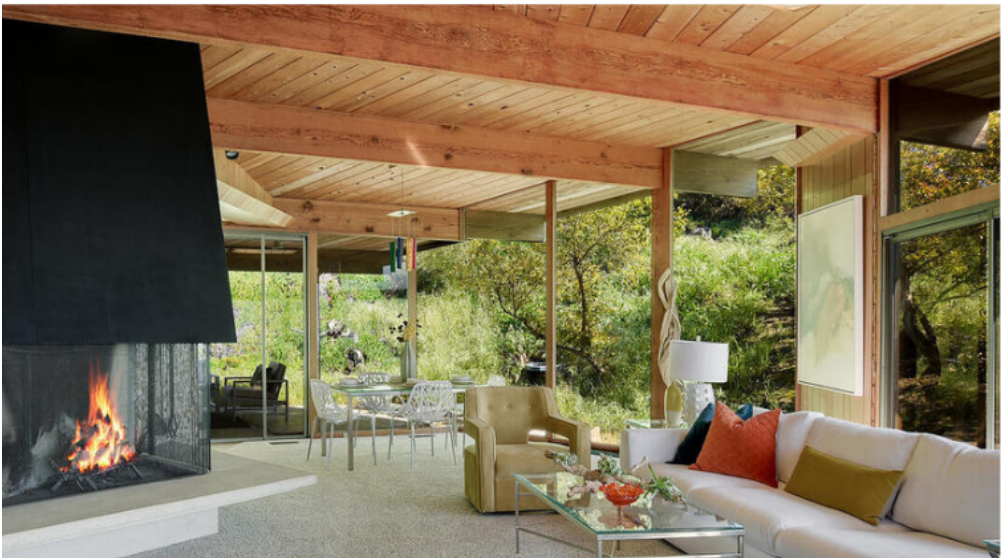

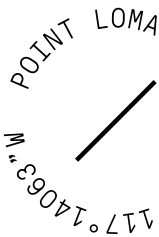
