Festa do Espírito Santo set for May 26-28 in Point Loma

he 113th Festival of the Holy Spirit honoring Portuguese religious and cultural traditions will be held the weekend of May 26-28 in Point Loma, culminating with the annual Festa parade on Sunday, May 28.

COVID restrictions forced the annual Portuguese festival to be downsized into a drive-thru, pickup-your-dinner event in 2020. Then, in 2021 for the first time in its century-plus history, the

Point Loma Portuguese community's signature annual event was not sponsored by a family, but by UPSES Inc.

That ended in 2022 when Brian and Deborah Dutra became Festa presidents.

In 2023, the torch of family sponsorship has been passed to Ted and Marisea "Cici" Drummond.

"My wife and I put our names in for consideration as sponsors and we were lucky enough for them (Festa board) to accept our volunteer pledge," said Ted Drummond

adding it has meant a lot to them both. "My wife has wanted to do this for some time," he said adding, "It was not something I thought I would ever do. It's quite the undertaking of time and effort to put on the event throughout the year.

The Festa has been a family affair for both Drummonds and their precursors.

Ted's grandparents, Manuel and Virginia Ribeiro hosted the Festa in 1976, with his mother, Melanie

Jury sees text messages minutes before victim is killed

jury has viewed text messages written by a Point Loma woman minutes before she was mortally injured in a drunk driving crash in which her friend drove off a bridge near Sea World Drive in 2021.

Those text messages were written by Sidnie Waller, 21, who described how scared she was by the driving of her friend, Jennifer Rae Xavier, now 23, on March 4, 2021.

Both women were drinking alcohol at a Pacific Beach bar that night and Xavier was driving her parents' BMW.

Deputy District Attorney Philippa Cunningham put the text messages on a chart as she questioned California Highway Patrol officer Brad Clinkscales about them.

"Please pray for me. I'm so scared," wrote Waller. "Omg...This is not okay... Jenny drank so much and took a bar."

Clinkscales said the reference to "a bar" was slang for a tranquilizer and those comments were made "approximately two minutes before the crash."

Waller sent the messages to her brother and to a friend minutes before the vehicle plunged off a freeway ramp at high speed and landed upside down and partially submerged in Tecolote Creek.

Xavier is charged with second-degree murder, gross vehicular manslaughter while intoxicated, DUI, and hit and run as she fled the scene. She has pleaded not guilty.

"Drive her car! Tell her! You're stressin' me out!" her brother texted Waller back. "She can kill you!"

"She's not listening! She's swerving all over. Almost ran into five cars," replied Waller.

The texting from Waller abruptly stopped when the car plunged over the railing, but the brother and the friend kept texting to the victim, said Clinkscales.

A jury of nine men and seven women that included four alternates listened intently in San Diego Superior Court on May 11 as the trial opened before Judge Peter Deddeh.

Xavier's attorney, G. Cole Casey, told jurors those text messages could not have been sent in such a short time period on Interstate 5 before the vehicle got onto the freeway ramp and crashed.

Casey told jurors there was no evidence that Xavier used a tranquilizer that night and disputed that she left the scene of an accident.

Cunningham said Xavier somehow got out of the car with her purse and jacket - leaving Waller behind - and climbed up the ravine while wet and got a ride from a motorist on the freeway ramp.

Xavier's attorney said she had injuries from the crash and may have suffered some brain trauma.

Casey said "she was soaking wet and wandering" in the area, leaving her purse and jacket in the

Cunningham said a friend of Xavier's had warned her 16 months before the crash that she should stop drinking. She urged jurors to hold Xavier "accountable."

Paramedic Adam Brooks testified he waded into the water of Tecolate Creek with another paramedic to try and get the car door open to get Waller out.

"I helped pull her to the shore. She was pulseless," said Brooks." "I did chest compressions all the way to the hospital."

Cunningham told jurors the main cause of death was drowning.

The motorist who picked Xavier up on the freeway ramp called police and an officer took Xavier to her home near SDSU before there was even a report of the overturned car.

Xavier was not arrested until several days had passed and no blood/alcohol tests were taken.

Family members of both the victim and Xavier were present in the courtroom. Deddeh told jurors they would likely begin deliberations in the case on May 24.

Xavier remains in jail without

ajor improvements at Cabrillo National Monument in Point Loma include construction just started on a new trail linking it with its tidepools, and work scheduled soon on the monument's visitor center.

A fundraising drive sponsored by the Cabrillo National Monument Foundation supporting the institution has also been launched to pay for the new trail. The trail will provide the first, safe pedestrian access from the upper part of the monument on the blufftop to its tidepools below.

"The trail began construction on May 8. It is not currently open to the public while it's being constructed because anyone going on it could hurt the plants and animals," said Emily M. Moore, Cabrillo National Monument Foundation executive director. "They will work on the trail for several weeks before they pause and return in the fall. We do not have a date yet to complete the trail."

Monument improvement plans will also include work planned on its visitor center. Of that work, Chris Symons, acting chief of interpretation for CNM said: "The goal is to bring the view building closer to its historical character, highlighting the historic appearance. Common techniques for

this procedure we plan to emulate include removing the exterior paint to expose and stain the wood, re-tiling the roof, and replacing the floor to better match the original structure."

Added Symons, "The project is expected to begin in autumn, during which time the visitor center will be temporarily closed. It will likely take about two months to complete. Visitor center desk operations will be conducted in an adjacent building, during which time the park films may be unavailable, but otherwise without interruption to guest services."

Meanwhile, a fundraising drive is being conducted by the Cabrillo National Monument Foundation, a nonprofit corporation that has supported the national park for 65-plus years. "Each year, our annual fundraising event, Cabrillo Under the Stars, is typically in May and raises a substantial amount to fund our operations and mission," said foundation trustee Robert Tripp Jackson noting park improvements have caused that fundraiser to be postponed to next year. "The foundation needs your help to not only fund completion of the trail to the tidepools, but also to fund free ongoing youth, volunteer, and park discovery programs. All of this helps foster a connection to the park that can only be achieved with the help of donors."

Added Tripp Jackson: "If you

CNM FACTS

- Cabrillo National Monument was established on Oct. 14, 1913, to memorialize the accomplishments of Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo.
- This National Monument is the only unit of the National Park System in San Diego County.
- In 1932, the site of the monument was designated as California Historical Landmark #56.
- A statue of Cabrillo was commissioned by the Portuguese government and donated to the U.S.
- This heroic sandstone statue was made by sculptor Alvaro de Bree. It is 14 feet tall and weighs 14,000 pounds.
- The original statue suffered weathering so it was replaced by a replica made of limestone in 1988.
- In winter, it is a popular spot for watching grey whales migrating on their way to Mexico from the Arctic.
- It also has a 2.5-mile roundtrip trail that winds through the native habitat of the Southern California coast. It descends 300 feet into the coast.
- The monument also includes the Old Point Loma Lighthouse, built between 1851 and 1855.

Girls softball, boys lacrosse lead PLHS spring teams in playoff action

s CIF playoffs are underway in prep spring sports, Lthe girls softball team and boys' lacrosse teams are leading the way in a busy season for PLHS athletes.

GIRLS SOFTBALL

The Pointers completed an undefeated season (6-0) in City League play to earn a No. 4 seed and a first-round bye in Div. III action before facing the winner between No. 5 Bayfront Charter and No. 12 Escondido Charter earlier this week.

Sophomore starting catcher Nanako Schroth leads the team with a .400 batting average while freshman sister Ryoko Schroth led the pitchers with a 1.71 earned run average over 77.2 innings.

"We had a rough year last year," veteran head coach Billy Hunyady said as his close-knit team celebrated Senior Day after last week's 10-2 win over Morse. "But Ryoko is a dominant pitcher who enables us to match up with the top

"We expanded our roster this year and we have a lot of depth. I can put anybody in at any time and feel they can compete," Hunyady added. "It's really added to our versatility."

As part of Senior Day, freshman junior varsity player Molly O'Donnell was allowed to join her senior sister Megan O'Donnell for a once-only time to play together in high school.

BOYS LACROSSE

This team also put up an undefeated league season (5-0, 16-1 overall) with a 14-game win streak. They scored 67 goals while only giving up nine in Eastern League play. This dominant performance by head coach Billy Buchhauser's team resulted in a No. 3 seed and Div. II first-round

To date, the Pointer boys have eliminated No. 6 Pacific Ridge 15-5 and played No. 7 Rancho Bernardo earlier this week in their quest for a CIF title. The finals will be played on May 20 at 2:30 p.m. at Del Norte High School.

BASEBALL

Finishing 11-15-1 overall and 4-8 in a tough Western League, head coach Jeff Solis' Pointers were awarded a No. 5 seed in Div. III. They played a single-elimination game earlier this week against No. 12 Canyon Crest.

Frankie Giacalone led the team with a .378 batting average and tied with Jordan Otjen with three home runs. Otjen's 20 RBI's were tops. Drake Cobb led in three categories with a .505 onbase percentage and 16 stolen bases and tied with Otjen with 25 hits over the 27-game schedule.

On the mound, Jasper McGrath's 0.95 earned run average was the best while Johnny Nuanez (41) and Will Sanford (39) struck out the most batters.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL

Awarded a No. 6 seed in Div. I, head coach Davis Ransom's girls earned a first-round bye before taking on No. 3 Eastlake High. After defeating them 3-2, Eastlake won an elimination match 5-0 earlier this month.

GIRLS LACROSSE

Head coach Morgan Jackson's team earned a No. 10 seed in Div. II but lost their first game to No. 7 Valley Center by a 16-7 score.

BOYS GOLF

Dylan Giang shot an excellent 76 in individual CIF playoffs.

BOYS TENNIS

Daniel Lombrozo win his firstround individual match 6-4 and 7-5 but lost in the second round.

SWIMMING

Head coach Ken Toma's crew had many athletes place in the CIF title meet. The highest among them was girls' 200-yard freestyle: Martina Divis, third place with a time of 1:56.38. Divis also finished third in the 500-yard freestyle in 5:07.67.

In the boys' 100-yard breaststroke, freshman Leon Chen, fifth place in 58.78.

The girls' 400-yard freestyle relay team finished ninth in 3:47.49. It included Divis, McKenna Carroll, Anne Borger, and Sienna Borchert.

Point Loma Nazarene tennis finishes season with most wins in its history

Tennis, according to Point Loma Nazarene University **-** sophomore Alexander Leischner, is passed down from generation to generation in his family, as if it were an old scrapbook or piece of jewelry.

"My mom, my grandpa, my great-great grandpa, all played tennis," Leischner said.

There is some debate about what came first, his steps or his serve.

What he does remember is the feeling of jealousy that came over him when his older sister began taking lessons.

"I started playing when I was two-and-a-half years old because of my sister," he said. "I was super jealous, so I was always playing with my mom in the street. My first lesson was at three-and-a-half.'

Leischner, a native of Aichach, Germany, spent much of this past season as an anchor for PLNU as the team's No. 1 and was named PacWest player of the year in April.

"Playing the No. 1 position; every match out, he is having a big challenge," PLNU head coach, Curt Wheeler, in his eighth season with the Sea Lions, said. "Even if we are playing teams that we are stronger than in other positions, they are almost always strong at that No. 1 position. His consistency with his tennis shots and with his mental focus really shone through this year."

PLNU finished the season at 18-4 – the most wins in program history. The Sea Lions' third-place finish at the PacWest Championships is also a program best. During one stretch of the season, the team won 12 straight contests.

"We beat every DI team we played," Leischner said. "I'm pretty sure it's the best season Loma tennis has ever had."

"I'm hoping the guys are focusing on how incredible of a year it was," Wheeler added, less than a week removed from season's end.

Leischner played in the No. 1 position in all but two contests. In doubles play, he worked in tandem with seniors Tyler Davis and Fabian Penzkofer.

"He did not make many errors when he was playing singles," Wheeler said. "He makes his opponents earn everything. There were plenty of matches where you could tell opponents did not believe they could do certain things against him."

Ask The Trust & Estate Attorney My parent(s) passed away, how do I access

their bank account(s)?

It really depends on their situation. There are a few questions that need to be answered:

1. Is your name also on your parent's bank account and is it payable on death?

2. Is the account in the name of your parent's trust? The person named in their Trust as Successor Trustee will be able to access the bank account.

If the account is not in the name of the Trust, and if the gross value of the decedent's real and personal property in California does not exceed \$184,500, you may use a Small Estate Affidavit to get the account transferred into the name of the Trust.

3. And finally, if your parents do not have a Trust, is the account greater than \$184,500 or does the gross value of the decedent's real and personal property in California exceed \$184,500? If so, the bank will tell you that must obtain "Letters" from the Court in order to access the account. This means that you will likely have to go through Probate.

What action can you take today? Work with your parents and contact their attorney to prepare estate planning documents, including a Living Trust.

Sardina (Ribeiro), as queen. Cici's great-grandparents, Manuel and Maria Nazare Rosa hosted the Festa in 1935, 1942, and 1944 with her grandmother, Mary Rosa, as queen. Cici's parents, Paul and Maria Stanley, also hosted the Festa in 1996 with her sister Mariel Filippone as queen.

As the sponsoring family, the Drummonds were in charge of hosting eight fundraising events up to and including Festa do Espirito Santo itself held the week of May 21-28. "We work hand-inhand with other volunteers: It's a

group effort," said Drummond who added, "This is the big event of the year. It's definitely a way for people to come together and support our community, not only in Point Loma but in San Diego. It's about our ethnicity and our heritage."

Ted pointed out it was important for the Drummond family to "keep the tradition going" adding "We're very appreciative of everyone supporting us. The Festa has been around for 113 years, and we would like nothing more than to see it go on for the next 113 years.

"We want people to know who we are and what we stand for. We're Portuguese and our traditions and heritage are something that's very near and dear to our hearts."

U.P.A.S.E.S HISTORY:

In 1920, M.O. Medina saw the need for a common place for the Portuguese community to gather to celebrate the Festa do Espírito Santo, "Festival of the Holy Spirit." He developed a committee to begin gathering the funds needed to build a chapel and community hall. He also led his committee throughout California to procure donations although roads were very difficult to travel.

To complete construction work on the chapel, boat owners would leave a crew member at home paying him 25 cents a ton for his efforts.

In 1922 the Portuguese community of San Diego proudly inaugurated the United Portuguese Azorean Society of the Holy Spirit, Capela or the U.P.A.S.E.S. Chapel and Hall. The chapel is one of only two original California Portuguese chapels. As more Portuguese immigrated to San Diego, the need for a larger hall was recognized, as there were immigrants from the Azores, Madeira,

and mainland Portugal. The community pooled together resources and acquired financing. The original hall from 1922 was then moved and a new hall was constructed. In 1948 the current U.P.S.E.S. Inc. Hall was opened. Medina served as the first president and remained so for 51 years.





City Tacos to open playground concept in Ocean Beach

erry Torres' next City Tacos coming to Ocean Beach this summer will be a children's playground and community hub as well as an eatery.

"I'm all about giving back to the community and taking care of my neighbors with kindness, service, quality, and value," said Torres, of his soon-to-be seventh City Tacos, which is replacing Tiki Port coffee and smoothies at 4896 Voltaire St. "This has been a long time in the making."

Torres inherited a coffee cart along with a half-finished building structure, a lot of asphalt, and a makeshift drive-thru. What's taking its place is gourmet tacos, a family-friendly playground, a courtyard with picnic tables, shaded lounge seating, fire pits, and a gated dog park, along with new coffee and flower shops. There will also be giant-sized games like checkers, chess, Connect 4, and Jenga, as well as corn hole sets, bocci ball, and foosball tables. Acoustic guitar players and other musicians will perform regularly.

Said Torres, who hails from Mexico City and moved to San Diego in 1992 of his business model: "We set out to change the perception of Mexican food. Every Mexican restaurant basically had the same menu items everywhere you went. We wanted to do something a little bit different. We want to make their meal an experience. That's what we're trying to do at this location."

The City Tacos' menu features traditional tacos (pollo asado, carnitas, carne asada), caseros "homestyle" tacos (pulled pork with Mayan achiote sauce, beef shank, mahi mahi), and several

other meat, seafood, and vegetarian options. Currently, 13 of the 15 tacos on City Tacos' menu are under \$5.

"We have fresh mahi mahi and New York steak for our carne asada tacos," said Torres. "Our carnitas are done with an old-school Mexican technique, an eight- to 10-hour process. The whole idea is quality value and service with a smile."

City Tacos was founded in North Park in 2014. Torres characterized this seventh installment of his 10,000-square-foot concept, to be named OB Playground, as "the culmination of what we've been trying to do the last nine years."

Of the newly planned dog park at OB Playground, Torres said, "It's something I've wanted to do for a long time to take care of my customers. People can watch their pets play while eating some tacos and enjoying some craft beers."

OB Playground will have 10 taps for beer from local craft breweries and will stay open until 10 p.m. Mexican beers, as well as wine and seltzers, will also be available. Later in the year, Torres will rotate food trucks into the space. Craft fairs and other small festivals are planned as well. Additionally, Sevahna Anderson, an OB native, and founder of OB's Voltaire Art & Makers Walk is coordinating with a dozen local artists to paint murals on the perimeter fencing of the OB Playground concept.

City Tacos last September surpassed three million tacos sold in San Diego County. City Tacos' other San Diego locations are East Village (ballpark), Encinitas, La Mesa, Pacific Beach, and Sorrento Valley.

"It has been a dream of mine for quite some time to create an all-ages community hub like this for one of the vibrant areas of our city - a place where people can play, enjoy, and relax," Torres concluded. "I love OB and can't wait to hang out and eat tacos with everyone."

or 76 years, the Ocean Beach Kiwanis Club's annual Kite Festival has been a community tradition treating participants to free kite building and flying.

This year's free festival is Saturday, May 20 from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. at Robb Field. The family-friendly event offers kite games for kids in all age groups and includes food trucks, craft fair

vendors, and community information booths. Kids' kites are judged in numerous categories and prizes are awarded.

The festival is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Ocean Beach serving beach communities since 1928. Kiwanis is a global volunteer organization dedicated to improving the world one child and one community at a time.

"The main activity is the same as it has always been – children

are taught how to make and fly a kite," said OB Kiwanian Melanie Nickel who, along with her husband Jim, are longtime kite festival organizers. "Nowadays there are also spectacular demonstrations of kite ballet and other stunts by professional kite fliers. There is music, food, and a small off-street street fair. We believe it is the oldest kite festival for children in the United States. It has become a multi-generational tradition, with former

participants bringing their children and grandchildren."

Dr. Jim Nickel, now chairman of the event, attended the first OB Kite Festival in 1948. "I was in kindergarten at Warren-Walker Elementary," he said adding the event left a "vivid impression. 


