Second atmospheric river still soaking the coastal communities

second atmospheric river in two weeks inundated al-**L**ready-saturated San Diego County in early February, causing more flooding in low-lying and coastal areas with more winter weather in the forecast. There was even a tornado warning on Feb. 6 for La Mesa, Chula Vista, and other South Bay areas.

But the National Weather dealing with its parent low-pres-5-7 storm was qualitatively different than the historic Jan. 22 storm, the fifth wettest day in San Diego since 1850, that saw rainfall rates in some areas approaching a halfinch per hour.

"The atmospheric river had pushed south of our area by late last night (Feb. 5) and we're now

Service said this most recent Feb. sure system," said San Diego me- inches of rain had fallen on Point teorologist Elizabeth Adams. "This (February) storm was a little different in that it was really on a smaller scale, though very high-impact in coastal areas. This storm had more of a widespread impact from the atmospheric river, was of longer duration with more moderate rainfall."

By mid-morning on Feb. 6, 1.64 Loma. Adams pointed out more rain was expected Feb. 7-9, with dry conditions prevailing for much of Feb. 12-17. She added more inclement weather is likely again on Feb. 18-20.



Founded in 1978 as the Ocean Beach Merchant's Association, the group's focus from the start was to support local businesses. In June 1998, the business organization gained national and state recognition by becoming part of the "Main Street" program. Consequently, it adopted the name Ocean Beach MainStreet Association.

Businesses within the business improvement district's boundaries automatically become OBMA members. Comprised of area merchants and professionals, OBMA strives to create a thriving business district catering to both residents and visitors. As a private nonprofit business organization, it operates

with a 14-member elected board.

OBMA's mission is to promote and support local business and economic vitality within the Ocean Beach community fostering a thriving and connected community. Its volunteer board of directors, elected from its membership, oversees all activities. Committees, task forces, and directors contribute to initiatives, with regular meetings held at the OBMA office on 1868 Bacon St.

The OBMA team manages yearly and weekly events, collaborates with local businesses, and engages with tourists and locals daily. OBMA administers the Ocean Beach Business Improvement District, encompassing Newport Avenue and contiguous commercial locations. 

MADCAPS moms inspired by message of 'Random Kindness' from co-author

"Random Kindness and Senseless Acts of Beauty" is a well-known phrase-turned-movement, now embarking on its 30th year of inspiring kind words and actions around the world. It's simply doing something positive for someone else, without them asking and without doing it for something in return.

Conceived by two friends over coffee in response to rising conflicts including the impending Persian Gulf War, Rodney King beating, and Los Angeles riots, it was quite literally a rewording of an increasingly common phrase on the news, "random violence and senseless acts of cruelty."

First communicated in a 1991 Glamour magazine article that led to iconic bumper stickers, "Random Kindness" went viral, so to speak, and is now embedded in the national and global lexicon as a cultural movement.

On Jan. 10, members of the local volunteer organization, Mothers and Daughters Club Assisting Philanthropies (MADCAPS), heard an inspiring talk about the power of kindness from one of the co-authors of the movement who also helped pen a full-length prose poem to communicate it.

The book, "Random Kindness and Senseless Acts of Beauty" was written by M. Paloma Pavel, MDiv, Ph.D., and Anne Herbert (1950-2015), and was illustrated by Mayumi Oda. A foreword in the 30th-anniversary edition is by Pavel's mentor, Nobel Prize laureate Desmond Tutu.

Archbishop Tutu shared his wisdom, strength, and hope in the context of the South African philosophy of Ubuntu, "... belief that our humanity is inextricably bound up in one another, and any tear in the fabric of connection must be repaired for us all to be made whole. This interconnectedness is the very root of who we are. Thus, compassion and service to others enhances the humanity of all, including oneself."

Book Award and was named Peacemaker Book of the Year in 2014.

Even before her presentation, Pavel said: "I've been looking forward to spending time with the MADCAPS moms, especially at the start of the New Year when many of us make positive resolutions to focus on ourselves and others. Every random act of kindness makes the world a kinder, better place and that seems completely aligned with the purpose of MADCAPS to involve mothers and daughters in caring for their communities."

With thanks to The Thursday Club for its hospitality, most of the 219 current MADCAPS moms from Point Loma, Ocean Beach. Mission Hills, and Hillcrest, attended the meeting. Pavel shared some stories about the history of the movement and her unexpected life journey as a result of it. As part of her talk, she said, "We are here with the capacity to interconnect, to create something larger than one of us could do alone."

She then read an excerpt from the book:

"Our leaders got confused. So we're all leaders now.

They told us there was nothing we could do.

They were wrong.

When we tell ourselves there is nothing we can do, we are wrong.

We never know how much and we never know how far it

but always, we have power.

We have power.

We're all making the soup we're all eating. We're all weaving the cloth

we're all wearing." Pavel also talked about what she referred to as the neuroscience of kindness, in which studies show the emotional, physical, and neurological benefits of kindness for those who put it into practice. To help personalize the talk, she encouraged moms to share about a random act of kindness that made a difference

in their life, whether as the giver,

receiver, or even as a witness.

Member Nanci Clifford, on the Discovery planning team, told the mom seated next to her about a recent experience she had at the crowded Boston airport where tempers were running high due to hundreds of flight delays and cancellations. She said, "I witnessed how the kindness and gracious compassion of one person quickly diffused a heated situation and inspired more positive behavior all

Ocean Beach community rallies to support Lighthouse Ice Cream

cean Beach is a melting pot of personalities representing a unique mix of residents that have one thing in common – their support of the mom-and-pop shops, that make the community a special place to call home.

After a fire damaged Lighthouse Ice Cream, the community quickly rallied to the aid of the local landmark.

"We lost every single thing in our shop," said owner Carol Ladiges. "The smoke from the fire did the most damage. Everything had to be dried out because of the water damage from the fire hoses.

"Insurance will cover most of the structural damage, employees' wages, and some of the personal property. There will be out-ofpocket expenses as things pop up."

Never one to ask for help, but always the first to offer it, Ladiges had mixed emotions about what came next.

"My manager's son started a GoFundMe page (gofundme. com/f/37hhhnhk7c) in December. At first, I felt conflicted about asking people for help, but there were so many people in the community who kept asking if they could help and if we had a GoFundMe page. They just wanted to contribute something. Ocean Beach is that kind of community. They just wanted to give back," Ladiges said.

"I was here when the fire started," said Jesus Beregrino, manager of O.B. Smoothie & Sub Express. "The Lighthouse is a big part of our history and we want to support their efforts to rebuild it again."

"The Lighthouse is one of those unique shops that leaves people with charming memories of Ocean Beach and that's one reason why we are happy to support them," said Greg Hildebrand, owner of Cow Records.

Elvira serves up delicious Italian meals in Ocean Beach

here is no question in my mind that Cesarina is one of the best five restaurants in the Ocean Beach/Point Loma area. I have never had a bad meal there; the service has been excellent; and the only difficulty I have had is in getting a reservation when I wanted one.

Several months ago, the Cesarina group announced they were opening a second restaurant, Elvira, that would feature a different menu than Cesarina. I was waiting for that second restaurant to open, and I am pleased to say that it has – in the former BoBeau's in Ocean Beach.

I had been trying to get reservations for several weeks, but every time I had a time and date good for me, it was not good for them. Until Friday. It was early -5:30 p.m. – but they could accommodate five of us and I couldn't turn it down.

My daughter Lynn and her husband Eric were driving down from Orange County to celebrate our grandson's second birthday, and my daughter Michele was going to join us for dinner. Unfortunately, my other daughter Stephanie was busy and would miss this experience. And after looking at the menu, I knew that Steve would be in seventh heaven because his favorite food is pizza and that is the primary serving at Elvira.

DINING

The physical restaurant has changed over the years. Our table was outside but it was well covered; heat was available; and the way it was furnished you felt like you were indoors. It was relatively quiet, even though there was soft music playing and you didn't feel outdoorsy.

The menu is large, both in size and in what it has to offer. We decided to start with an appetizer – Fritti Del Giorno – and our fantastic waiter – Eric – recommended the stuffed squash blossoms. We ordered two Fiori di Zucca plus one additional so that we all had the chance to taste this delicious offering (\$18 for two). It was tasty; warm, and just enough to tickle our appetites. The "stuffing" was creamy and satisfying.

Then came the time to order our meal, and this was not an easy task, primarily because there were many different pizzas – some with a sauce and some without – and the menu was in Italian. (Well, not the entire menu. You have to read the description to know what is being offered.)

Steve ordered the Capricciosa, which was tomato sauce Mozzarella, Prosciutto Cotto, mushroom, artichokes, black olives, egg, and fresh basil. The cost was \$22 and was a 12-inch pizza. I was surprised to see the fried egg on the surface, but it was there, and it was a delicious addition to the pizza. I tried the artichokes and they were wonderfully prepared. A real winner!

Michele ordered the Bucatini All Amatriciana, which was homemade Bucatini, sugo, Guanciale, Pecorino, and cracked black pepper. It was \$25. She also ordered a serving of the Pizza Bianca Al Rosmarino (\$6), which was a substitute for garlic bread shaped like a pizza. Both were delicious.

Eric and Lynn both ordered the 4 Formaggi pizza, as it had been recommended by the editor of The Beacon to me when we discussed my reviewing the restaurant. It consisted of Mozzarella, smoked Provola, Gorgonzola, Parmigiano, and "crema di Pecorino," and was \$22. It was also a 12-inch pizza and they both raved about it. Neither finished their pizzas and both took home portions for dinner for the next two nights.

When it came to my ordering, I have to admit that I am not much of a pizza eater. They did have a special for the night that I was interested in, but decided to try their Fettuccine Alla Puttanesca which was made with homemade egg Fettuccine, sugo, garlic, Peperoncino, green and black olives, capers, anchovies and fresh parsley. It was priced at \$23.

When I placed the order with Eric, I asked if the anchovies could be omitted, and there was no problem with the request. The Fettuccine was served in a large bowl, and I had the opportunity to have Parmesan cheese sprinkled on top (I declined). The meal was very good; and so much of it that I took almost half of it home for dinner the following evening. The two kinds of olives

gave it an interesting flavor, and everyone who tasted it enjoyed it. I would have liked to have had garlic bread or Pizza Bianca served with the Primi. It would have helped to have something to help put the pasta on the fork.

Eric, Steve, and I shared a half liter of their Pinot Grigio house wine, which was tasty.

As if the food that we ordered was not enough, we were served two desserts also — a Tuttifrutti Panna Cotta, which was a vanilla bean Panna Cotta (read custard) with a pineapple puree and a

Ciambelline Mbriachelle, which were cookies to put in a chocolate-wine dip and whipped cream. The desserts were delicious and topped off our meals.

The five of us were pleased with our meals and the choices we made. We were very impressed with the servers, from the busboys to the waitstaff, to even the manager. All came by several times: the water glasses were never empty; everyone was extremely helpful. Eric the waiter spent a great deal of time with us explaining the menu; and the items involved, and helped make our time at Elvira's a delightful one. The food was wonderful and the fact that it took me so long to get a reservation tells me that others are also seeking a high-class restaurant that offers something special to their diners. Soon you will find me at Elvira's enjoying their wonderful menu and dining experiences.

HISTORY OF VALENTINE'S DAY

The origins of Valentine's Day on Feb. 14, when lovers express their affection with greetings and gifts, is somewhat obscure though it's believed it may date from the Roman festival of Lupercalia held in mid-February. The festival, which celebrated the coming of spring, included fertility rites and the pairing of women with men by lottery. Valentine's Day however did not come to be celebrated as a day of romance until about the 14th century.

Although there were several Christian martyrs named Valentine, the day may have taken its name from a priest who was martyred about 270 CE by the emperor Claudius II Gothicus. According to legend, the priest signed a letter "from your Valentine" to his jailer's daughter, whom he had befriended and, by some accounts, healed from blindness.

Other accounts hold that it was St. Valentine of Terni, a bishop, for whom the holiday was named. Another common legend states that St. Valentine defied the emperor's orders and secretly married couples to spare their husbands from war. It is for this reason that his feast day is associated with love.

Formal messages, or valentines, appeared in the 1500s, and by the late 1700s, commercially printed cards were being used. The first commercial valentines in the United States were printed in the mid-1800s. Valentines commonly depict Cupid, the Roman god of love, along with hearts, the seat of emotion. Traditional gifts include candy and flowers, particularly red roses, a symbol of beauty and love. The day is popular in the United States as well as in Britain, Canada, Australia, and many other countries.





ADMINISTERING YOUR TRUST UPON YOUR DEATH

You may wonder what is involved when your successor trustee administers your revocable living trust following your death. Here are the primary actions (not necessarily sequential) your successor trustee will need to take:

- 1. Arrange for the on-going care of your pets; secure your home; and make the final arrangements for the disposition of your body.
- $2.\,Order\,several\,Death\,Certificates\,through\,the$ mortuary to be used in connection with closing financial accounts and transferring title to real
- 3. Mail out "Notice to Beneficiary/Heir" letters as required by California law.
- 4. Obtain preliminary value of your estate to determine whether a federal estate tax return may need to be filed with the IRS (within nine (9) months from the date of your death)
- 5. Notify the California Department of Health Care Services as required by California law if you received or may have received any benefits from Medi-Cal.
- 6. Open a new checking account in the trust name (or convert an existing account). This account will be used to pay all of your debts and on-going trust expenses. In this connection, obtain from the IRS a new income tax reporting number (EIN) for the trust which the bank will require, since your trust became irrevocable upon your death.
- 7. Transfer title to all financial/brokerage accounts from your name into the successor trustee's name, or close (sell the assets in) all or some of such accounts and transfer the proceeds into the new account in the trust referred to in Para. 6 above.

- 8. Locate all outstanding bills and pay same from the account referred to in Para 6. above.
- 9. Make claim for any death benefit(s) payable on your death.
- have an appraisal of such property made by an estate personal property appraiser, and sell such property and deposit the sale proceeds into the trust bank account, or divide such property among the entitled beneficiaries based on value or as otherwise required by the terms
- 11. Obtain date of death values of all other property in your estate. Your banks and brokerage firms can provide the trustee with a statement(s) covering the time of your death and/or a letter providing the date of death value(s) of such account(s). The trustee will probably need to hire a qualified real estate appraiser to value your real property(ies) (needed for income tax basis purposes)
- 12. The trustee should keep a good record of all trust income and expenses and trust distributions, since an accounting should typically be provided to each beneficiary at the end of the trust administration
- $13. \, The \, trustee \, should \, pay \, to \, himself \, \, or \, herself \,$ the compensation he or she is entitled to under the terms of the trust; and if none is provided for, "reasonable compensation" as authorized by California law.
- 14. After all estate expenses and debts have been paid, make the distributions to your beneficiaries called for by the trust.
- 15. Have an accountant prepare and file the needed income tax returns for you and for the

This second atmospheric river posted some "pretty respectable" rainfall amounts with the heaviest totals, about 3 to 5 inches, falling in North County, said Adams.

Though these early February storms were decidedly less intense than the historic Jan. 22 rain event, they nonetheless could "still lead to flooding concerns," said Adams adding, "Because we're in the middle of it (storms) it's hard to say right now whether these later storms will be worse or better."

Asked if more atmospheric rivers could strike San Diego this winter, the forecaster replied, "The second half of February we could be getting more storm patterns, so winter isn't over yet."

Concerning the likelihood of future atmospheric rivers, Adams said: "With increasing temperatures across the Earth that means the atmosphere can hold more moisture increasing the potential for atmospheric rivers and more extreme weather than we saw a few decades ago."

Noting these most recent atmospheric rivers had come in "quick succession," Adams urged people to "make sure and pay attention" to the weather and respect emergency alerts for "weather and flood warnings" distributed via enabled iPhones.

FIRST-HAND OB STORM TOUR

Trever Richardson, a fourth-generation Ocean Beach resident, weighed in on the latest round of winter storms pointing out he has personally seen his share of flooding over the years, including the Lamborghini submerged in the parking garage on Abbott in 2015.

"And last week I saw the renters crying as they were stranded in that very same building with an underground parking structure turned watery moat," Richardson said.

He added: "As this (latest) winter storm approached, I lingered around Abbott and Santa Monica waiting for the deluge of water. Fortunately, the rainfall never reached the torrential threshold to cause flooding like we saw (in January). I then proceeded to follow the source of the flow down Bacon, east on Del Monte, and then back north up Cable. Cable was more of the same. Huge flowing puddles stretch nearly across the street, every intersection full of flowing water from Narragansett to Lotus.

"I concluded the tour of my neighborhood by enjoying the beautiful bone-dry traffic circle on West Point Loma and Bacon. Voltaire, being further out on the flat alluvial plane and further from the slope of the hill that is Point Loma, does not feel a great deal of the same pooling effects as the funnel of the rest of OB."

In other storm-related matters:

— "It's been an incredibly difficult two weeks for thousands of

22, and the City has been working

Pointer boys post winning record as basketball playoffs loom

ointer basketball head coach Josh Aros, in his eighth season at the helm, changed his team's style of play and it has paid dividends with CIF playoffs beginning next week.

His team, despite a pair of serious injuries, has posted a 16-8 record and sits at 4-2 in Central League play with its last pair of league games at home this week against cellar dweller Crawford (0-7) and first place Canyon Hills (5-1) on



"We're not very big this year," Aros noted (his tallest players are 6 feet 3 inches). "So we use our speed, try to push the ball, and get shots in transition. If that doesn't work we go into a couple of sets but our goal is to defend well, get a good rebound, and push to try and get some layups in transition."

That strategy has produced a scoring average of 61 points per game with junior Grant Stewart's 17.0 points per game leading the team. Nick Freeman (14.0) and Nick Woodworth (9.6) follow.

Defensively, Freeman is pulling down 8.9 rebounds per game followed by Stewart (4.6) and Na'Sean Hardy (4.3). Assists leader is Trevor Dorris (4.6 per game) with Stewart (3.3) and Freeman (3.3) close behind. Stewart has the most steals (2.5 per game) just more than Dorris (2.2) and Hardy (2.0).

A critical loss for the Pointers came during a home game against Coronado when 6 feet 2 inches tall sophomore Hardy went down with what was

originally believed to be a severe sprain but was later diagnosed at a hospital as a broken leg.

"Na'Sean started every game and played really big minutes and has done a lot of good things for us," Aros said. "He rebounds and defends well and scores at a good rate so it's been tough but we have a couple of kids stepping up, filling his shoes, and starting to get good minutes and find their way to contribute."

Another promising player was lost to injury before the season began but Aros is pleased with the progress of his team.

"I think the kids are playing well," he said. "We came in with a lot of new faces and they've gelled and worked hard this season. They play hard and play for each other."

FREE THROWS

Aros, a PLHS teacher, is a new father and is sometimes seen supervising at after-school events on campus doing "Daddy Duty" with his infant son strapped to his chest and a radio in his pocket.

There was concern whether the two home games scheduled this week could be played as planned on the Pointer court when several leaks from recent rains developed in the roof above the surface.




